No. 5/5 Baylor Travels to West Virginia...

The fifth-ranked Baylor Lady Bears will put their 12-game win streak on the line when they play their second straight Big 12 Conference road game when they take on West Virginia, Saturday, Jan. 10, at 2 p.m. (CT). The game, a matchup between last year's Big 12 regular season champions, will be televised by West Virginia on ROOT SPORTS with Geoff Coyle calling the action and Meg Bulger providing game analysis.

Baylor, 13-1 on the season and 2-0 in Big 12 Conference play, is ranked No. 5 in both the AP Poll and the *USA Today*/ESPN Coaches Poll. The listing marks the 84th Top 5 ranking by the Lady Bears which ranks No. 12 all-time.

This season marks the ninth time in 10 years, and the 11th time in **Kim Mulkey's** 15 years, BU has been 13-1 through 14 games (14-0 in 2011-12).

Head coach **Kim Mulkey's** Lady Bears are led by sophomore forward **Nina Davis'** league-leading 22.6 points a game. Davis ranks No. 3 in the league in rebounding with 8.7 a game. Sophomore post **Khadijah Cave** follows with 13.0 points and 6.0 rebounds an outing. Junior point guard **Niya Johnson** dishes out a league-leading 8.3 assists per game and has averaged 9.3 apg over the last nine contests.

Baylor has outscored its opponents in the paint 664-306 this season and BU's bench has outscored opponents 467-217.

Under 14th-year West Virginia head coach Mike Carey, the Mountaineers are 10-4 on the season, 0-2 in Big 12 play. WVU is led by junior guard Brianna Holmes' 22.4 ppg. Senior forward Averee Fields scores 16.0 points and hauls down a team-leading 6.6 rebounds a contest.

Up Next...

After two league road games, **Baylor** returns home to host Iowa State on Tuesday, Jan. 13, at 6:30 p.m. The game will be televised by FOX Sports Southwest.

Wallace Collects Big 12 Honor...

Freshman guard Kristy Wallace was named Big 12 Conference Co-Freshman of the Week by the league for her performances vs. Prairie View A&M and No. 18 Oklahoma State. Wallace came off the bench to average 8.5 points, 3.0 assists, 2.5 rebounds and 2.0 steals in Baylor's wins last week. She connected on .462 (6-of-13) of her field goal attempts, including 3-of-7 from 3-point range, for the two games. Against Prairie View A&M, the freshman guard tallied six points, two rebounds, five assists and a steal. She then scored 11 points, hauled down three rebounds and registered three steals versus Oklahoma State in a matchup of Top 25 teams.

Wallace shared Freshman of the Week honors with Texas Tech forward Dayo Olabode.

HEAD COACH KIM MULKEY

Success = Kim Mulkey. No matter what she's attempted in basketball, whether it be on the court or along the sideline, Mulkey has found success. In just 15 seasons as a head coach, she has attained 417 career victories and ranks No. 2 among the winningest active Division I head coaches (.827) and No. 4 all-time by percentage. Only one person, her mentor Leon Barmore, attained the 400-win milestone quicker. It took Barmore 13 seasons and three games to accumulate 400 wins, while Mulkey achieved it in 13 years and 32 games.

When the Women's Basketball Hall of Famer accepted the position as Baylor University's women's basketball head coach on April 4, 2000, few could have predicted the dramatic and prestigious transformation the program was about to undergo. In just 14 years at Baylor, the former Olympic Gold medalist has twice guided the Lady Bear basketball program to the pinnacle of women's basketball, the 2005 and 2012 NCAA national championships, 13 NCAA Tournament appearances, 14, 20-win seasons, 12, 25-win efforts, five, 30-win campaigns and an NCAA record 40 wins and undefeated record in 2011-12. In addition, over the past seven seasons, Mulkey has led the Lady Bears to three Final Four appearances (2005, '10, '12) and 11 Big 12 Conference titles.

The 2005 national title was Baylor's first for a women's team sport, and just the second in school history overall. In winning the 2005 title, Mulkey became the first person, man or woman, to win a basketball national championship as a player, assistant coach and head coach. En route to the 2005 NCAA championship, the Lady Bears won their first Big 12 Conference championship and were the league's tournament champion, too. In 2009, the Lady Bears added to the trophy case with another Big 12 Tournament crown, claimed both the 2011 regular season and tournament crowns and captured the 2012 regular season title by a record seven games over second-place finishers Oklahoma and Texas A&M and again earned the tournament crown. The Lady Bears duplicated the feat in the 2012-13 season, winning both crowns, and became the first team to win three straight conference tournament titles and five all-told. In 2013-14, Baylor claimed its fourth straight Big 12 regular season title becoming the first league school to achieve that feat and claimed its fourth straight and sixth overall tournament crown.

Mulkey has produced amazing results since taking over the program's reins on April 4, 2000, averaging 28.8 wins through 14 years. In her 15 years at the program's helm, she has posted an impressive 417-87 (.827) record which ranks her No. 2 nationally in winning percentage. In addition, the Lady Bear program ranks No. 5 among the NCAA Division I's winningest teams over that span.

Since coming into the league in 2000-01, Mulkey owns the top winning percentage and most victories among Big 12 coaches at 82.7 percent (417-87).

Mulkey's autobiography, "Won't Back Down," hit bookstores on Nov. 1, 2007.

- **Baylor** ranks No. 1 in the Big 12 and No. 3 nationally in scoring offense (87.6 ppg) and is No. 1 in the Big 12 and No. 4 nationally in field goal percentage (.492).
- **Baylor** ranks No. 2 nationally and No. 1 in the Big 12 in scoring margin (+31.1) and is No. 3 nationally and No. 1 among the Big 12 in rebound margin (+16.3).
- **10 Baylor** players have scored in double figures at least twice this season (see page 9 for complete chart).
- Of the 11 **Baylor** players who have played this season, 10 are averaging 12.6 or more minutes per game.

- **Johnson** has moved up to No. 5 on BU's career assist chart with 452 and needs just three more to catch Toya Ellis' 455 (see page 7 for complete chart).
- **Johnson** is No. 8 nationally in assist/turnover ratio at 3.09.
- **Sune Agbuke**, a 6-5 senior, has blocked 25 shots over the past eight games (3.1 average) and ranks No. 4 in the Big 12 with 2.2 per game.
- **Agbuke** has 132 career blocks to rank No. 5 on BU's career chart, she needs 10 more rejections to pass Kacy Moffitt's 141 (see page 7 for complete chart).
- **Nina Davis** was named one of ESPNW's top 25 players for 2014-15, as the 5-11 sophomore forward/post is listed at No. 6; she is also on its first-team preseason All-American list.
- **Davis** has been named to three preseason watch lists; the John R. Wooden, Naismith Trophy and Wade Trophy.
- In her 15 seasons at the program's helm, **Kim Mulkey** has posted an impressive 417-87 (.827) record which ranks her No. 2 nationally in winning percentage among active coaches behind UConn's Geno Auriemma (.864).
- In 491 of 504 games under **Kim Mulkey**, the Lady Bears have held their opponent at or below 50 percent field goal shooting with only five of those efforts coming in the last 13 years.
- In **Baylor's** last 304 games, only two opponents (Stanford, .509 & West Virginia, .500) have shot 50 percent or above. Last season, the Cardinal broke BU's 217-game streak of holding an opponent to 50 percent or less shooting from the floor.

- **Baylor** is 153-11 (.933) over the past five seasons, 34-3 in 2010-11, 40-0 in 2011-12, 34-2 in 2012-13, 32-5 in 2013-14 and 13-1 this season. In that same span, BU is 81-3 (.964) in Big 12 play (69-3) in regular season and 12-0 in Big 12 Tournament).
- 135 of **Baylor's** 153 wins since 2010-11 have been by 10 or more points, and only nine times has its winning margin been five or fewer points.
- **Baylor** is 338-15 (.957) under **Mulkey** when scoring 70 or more points, including a 204-6 (.971) record when totaling 80 or more. **BU** is 134-2 (.985) over the last five seasons (2011-12 to 2014-15) when scoring 70 or more points.
- **Baylor** has won a nation-best 142 straight home games vs. non-ranked opponents, dating back to an April 4, 2003, loss to Auburn in the WNIT finals.
- **Baylor** has 80 straight games with at least one 3-point field goal made dating back to Nov. 13, 2012, when BU was 0-for-3 from long range against Kentucky.

Charges and Deflections...

- So far this season, BU has taken 43 charges: **Niya Johnson** 17, **Sune Agbuke** 13, **Khadijah Cave** 6, **Imani Wright** 3, **Nina Davis** 2, **Dekeiya Cohen** 1, **Kristy Wallace** 1.
- In 2014-15, BU has registered 167 deflections: **Johnson** 37, **Wright** 26, **Cave** 18, **Davis** 18, **Higgins** 11, **Agbuke** 13, **Prince** 11, **Chardonae Fuqua'** 10, **Wallace** 10, **Cohen** 7, **Ieshia Small** 6.

Six Underclassmen Leading Team in Scoring...

- A quartet of sophomores, **Nina Davis** (22.6), **Khadijah Cave** (13.0), **Imani Wright** (9.9) and **Alexis Prince** (8.0) and two freshman **Kristy Wallace** (9.3) and **Dekeiya Cohen** (8.1), are the team's top scorers.
- **Davis**, a 5-11 forward, is leading the team in both scoring and rebounding with 22.6 points and 8.7 rebounds an outing.
- **Davis** scored a career-high 43 points at Ole Miss. In the last nine games, Davis has averaged 26.1 points per game (31 vs. UTPA, 43 at Ole Miss, 21 vs. Idaho, 33 vs. SFA, 26 vs. #19 Syracuse, 15 vs. #18 Michigan State, 20 vs. Prairie View A&M, 22 vs. #18 OSU, 24 at K-State).
- **Cave**, a 6-2 post, is averaging 13.0 points and 6.0 rebounds. Against Utah State, **Cave** cracked the starting lineup for the first time in her career and earned Basketball Travelers Classic MVP honors en route to leading Baylor to the tournament championship with a 3-0 mark.
- **Cave** leads the team and is No. 2 in the Big 12 Conference in field goal percentage at 65.2 (73-112) percent and has scored in double figures in 10 of 14 games this season.

Johnson Dishing it out and Taking Care of It...

- Junior point guard **Niya Johnson** ranks No. 1 both nationally and in the Big 12 in assists per game (.83).
- **Johnson** is No. 8 nationally and No. 2 in the Big 12 in assist/turnover ratio (3.09, 108/35).
- The Gainesville, Fla., native ranks No. 5 on BU's career assist chart and needs just three more dimes to pass Toya Ellis' 455 and move into the No. 4 spot. Chelsea Whitaker ranks at No. 3 with 457 assists.
- **Johnson** has averaged 9.3 apg over the last nine games.

Davis Continues to Lead in Scoring and Rebounding...

- Sophomore forward **Nina Davis** leads the Big 12 Conference and ranks No. 11 nationally in scoring at 22.6 points per game.
- The Memphis, Tenn., native scored a career-high 43 points at Ole Miss and has averaged has averaged 26.1 points per game in Baylor's last nine games.
- Although only 5-11, **Davis** leads the team and ranks No. 3 among Big 12 players in rebounding with 8.7 a game.
- **Davis** has been named Big 12 Player of the Week three times this season.

Academic Honors...

- Freshman **Kristy Wallace** was named to the fall semester Dean's List which is awarded to Baylor students with a 3.7 grade-point average, enrolled in at least 12 hours and who make no grade lower than a C.
- **Wallace**, along with senior **Sune Agbuke**, freshman **Micayla Buckner** and junior **Chardonae Fuqua'**, were named to the Big 12 Commissioner's Honor Roll for the fall semester, which recognizes those student-athletes who had a 3.00 or better grade-point average.

Top Four Recruiting Class...

- As the NCAA's early signing period has come to a close, Baylor, which got two Top 50 commits, Kalani Brown and Beatrice Mompremier, vaulted from No. 14 on ESPNW's Recruiting Class Rankings to No. 4.
- In addition to Brown (6-5, P) and Mompremier (6-4, F/P), head coach Kim Mulkey and her staff signed three others during the early signing period; Alyssa Dry (5-9, G), Alexandria Gulley (5-9, G) and Justis Szczepanski (6-4, F).

Did You Know Kim Mulkey is...

- The **ONLY** women's basketball coach, and one of only three in men's and women's basketball (joining Bob Knight and Dean Smith), who have won a national championship as both a player and coach.
- The **ONLY** basketball coach to win a national championship as a head coach, assistant coach and player.

- The **first individual ever** to play for a women's team ranked No. 1 among AP voters while also later becoming coach of a team selected to No. 1.

West Virginia Mountaineers...

- Located in Morgantown, W.V., the West Virginia University Mountaineers bring their 10-4 season record and 0-2 Big 12 mark to the floor when they host the Lady Bears on Saturday afternoon.
- The Mountaineers opened Big 12 play with two road losses, at Oklahoma (71-60) and third-ranked Texas (61-55).
- Two Mountaineers are averaging double-digit scoring on the season. They are led by junior guard Bria Holmes' 22.4 ppg. Senior forward Avereve Fields scores 16.0 points and hauls down a team-leading 6.6 rebounds a contest.
- The Mountaineers are coached by 14th-year head coach Mike Carey, a 1980 Salem graduate. Carey is 284-150 (.654) in his 14 seasons as a Division I head coach.

Series Record...

- Baylor leads the series vs. West Virginia, 5-2.
- The two teams played three times last season as Baylor defeated WVU in Morgantown, 78-62, and in the championship game of the Big 12 Tournament, 74-71, in Oklahoma City while the Mountaineers posted a 71-69 victory in Waco.
- Baylor had won four straight contests before suffering a 71-69 loss to the Mountaineers in Waco on March 2.

In the Big 12's 19th Season, Did You Know?

- **Baylor**, with its 44 straight regular season league wins from Feb. 23, 2011 to Jan. 19, 2014, broke Oklahoma's Big 12 record for consecutive regular season conference victories. The Sooners won 24 straight games from March 3, 2005 until Jan. 27, 2007.
- **Baylor's** 11 Big 12 titles is the most in league history, ahead of Oklahoma's 10.
- **Baylor** is one of three programs to post a perfect league record: Baylor - 18-0 (2012 & '13); Nebraska - 16-0 (2010); Oklahoma - 16-0 (2006), and the only one to post back-to-back unblemished league records.
- **Baylor** has won the most regular season Big 12 games and owns the league's best regular season winning percentage: **Baylor** - 205-91, .693 winning percentage
Oklahoma - 190-106, .642 winning percentage
- **Baylor** has won the most Big 12 Tournament games and owns the league's best winning percentage in the event: **Baylor** - 29-12 (.707)
Oklahoma - 23-14 (.622)
- **Baylor** is 69-3 in regular season Big 12 games over the past five seasons with a league-record 44-straight wins included in that run. That win string was halted at Kansas (76-60), Jan. 19, 2014.

- All-told, **Baylor** is 338-15 (.958) under **Kim Mulkey** when scoring 70 or more points, including a 204-6 (.971) record when totaling 80 or more. The Lady Bears have averaged 70.4 or more points in 13 of Mulkey's 14 seasons along the BU sideline, and averaged a league-leading and school-record (NCAA era) 83.6 ppg in 2013-14. It marked the second straight year BU established a new single-season scoring standard.

Lady Bears Impressive...

- Since taking over a squad that was just 7-20 the season prior to her arrival, **Kim Mulkey** has averaged 28.9 wins a season.
- In her 15 seasons at the program's helm, **Mulkey** has posted an impressive 417-87 (.827) record which ranks her No. 2 nationally in winning percentage among active coaches.
- **Mulkey's** record over her first four years was 98-35 (.737), averaging 24.5 wins per year. Over the last 10-plus years, she is 319-52 (.860) while averaging 34.0 victories per season.
- **Mulkey** owns more than half (417) of the program's 807 all-time victories. BU was 394-398 prior to her arrival, 417-87 since.

Defense...

- **Baylor's** loss to Stanford (50.9%, 11/16/12) in 2012-13 halted a streak of 217 straight wins when holding an opponent to 50 percent or less shooting from the field, dating back to March 25, 2006, an 82-63 Sweet 16 loss to eventual national champion Maryland.
- In 491 of 504 games under **Kim Mulkey**, the Lady Bears have held their opponent at or below 50 percent from the field with only five of those efforts coming in the last 13 seasons.
- In **Baylor's** last 304 games, only two opponents (Stanford in 2012-13 & West Virginia in 2013-14) have shot at or above 50 percent from the floor.
- **Baylor** is 126-3 since the start of the 2009-10 season when allowing 60 or fewer points, including a 33-0 mark in 2011-12, a 25-0 record in 2012-13, 18-0 in 2013-14 and 9-0 this season. BU In the Polls...

- The Lady Bears have 238 AP Top 25 poll appearances in the 2000s, all of which have come under head coach **Kim Mulkey**, to rank No. 7 on the wire service's active all-time list.
- All told, BU has been ranked in 254 AP polls which ranks No. 22 on the all-time list.
- BU has been ranked in a school-record 211 straight AP polls dating back to week nine of the 2003-04 listing when it broke in at No. 24.
- BU had been continuously ranked among the nation's top 10 teams since the first AP poll of the 2010-11 season when it was No. 2. All told, the Lady Bears were ranked in the AP's top 10 for 67 straight polls, however, that string was snapped on Jan. 20, 2014, after BU suffered a 16-point loss (76-60) at unranked Kansas. After a one-week hiatus, with its overtime win at then-No. 8 Oklahoma State on Jan. 26, 2014, Baylor moved back into the top 10 (Jan. 27) at No. 9 and stayed among the top 10 until dropping to No. 13 on Nov. 24, 2014. BU moved back into the top 10, at No. 9, in the Dec. 8 poll.
- Baylor has spent 39 weeks at No. 1 in the AP listing which ranks fifth all-time.
- Baylor went wire-to-wire in both the 2011-12 AP Poll and the *USA Today*/ESPN Coaches' Poll. It is just the ninth time that a women's team ran the table in the AP Poll.
- On January 3, 2011, for the first time in program history, Baylor's women's basketball team ascended to the top spot in The Associated Press poll. Baylor had been ranked No. 2 every week since the beginning of the 2010-11 season but moved to the top spot after then-top-ranked Connecticut lost at then-No. 9 Stanford, 71-59.
- The Lady Bears are Baylor's first team to ever achieve a No. 1 listing in an AP Poll. Men's basketball's highest ranking was No. 3 and football's highest ranking was No. 3 for two consecutive weeks during the 1953 season and one week in 2013.

- The San Antonio native is in her third quarter of study.
- Agbuke graduated from Baylor in three years and began attending law school on May 12, 2014.

McDonald's All-Americans...

- **Baylor's** 2014-15 roster features four McDonald's All-Americans. Junior **Niya Johnson** and redshirt sophomore **Alexis Prince** were 2012 honorees, and freshman **Ieshia Small** was named to the 2013 honor list. Junior **Alexis Jones**, was a 2012 honoree as well, she is sitting out the 2014-15 season after transferring to Baylor from Duke.

Early Signees...

- **Kalani Brown**, a 6-5 left-handed post player and the nation's top-ranked post, from Salmen High School in Slidell, La., has played for three state championships at Salmen HS, winning back-to-back state crowns the last two seasons. Last year she averaged 21.0 points, 13.0 rebounds, 5.0 blocks and 2.0 steals in addition to earning numerous awards. Brown was awarded District MVP, All-Metro Player of the Year, the Sugar Bowl MVP, the Class 4 Player of the Year and the 2014 Class 4A State Championship tournament MVP. She was also crowned Louisiana Miss Basketball, Louisiana Gatorade Player of the Year and Louisiana Hall of Fame Athlete of the Year. Brown won a gold medal with Team USA at the 2013 FIBA Americas U16 Championship in Mexico.
- **Alyssa Dry**, a 5-9 combo guard from Fort Worth, Texas, attends IMG Academy in Bradenton, Fla. She is an outstanding athlete who excels in the transition game and has the ability to find open teammates or hit the open shot. Last year at Aledo (Texas) High School, Dry was named to the Class 4-A TABC All-State team and also District 7-4A MVP while averaging 16.2 points, 4.7 rebounds, 4.7 assists and 4.2 steals per contest. She is ranked No. 68 nationally by the *Girls Basketball Report*.
- **Alexandria Gulley** is a 5-9 point guard from Dallas' Skyline High School who led her team to the regional final for the first time since 1997. Gulley averaged 13.6 points, 3.8 assists, 2.4 rebounds and 2.0 steals per game as a junior.
