DAN BURT

HEAD COACH • 2ND SEASON

Dan Burt was named head coach of the Duquesne women's basketball program on April 27, 2013. In just one year's time, he has had unprecedented success.

In his first season on the Bluff, Burt guided the Dukes to their sixth straight 20-win season, becoming just one of 21 teams in NCAA Division I that has won 20-or-more games each year since the 2009 season. Additionally, Duquesne

played in the postseason for the sixth straight season, capping the year with a 2nd Round appearance in the WNIT.

The team made program history on December 1, 2013 when they played their first-ever game outside the United States. The Dukes and #5 Notre Dame played a neutral site game at Ryerson University in the venue formerly known as Maple Leaf Gardens in downtown Toronto. The contest sold out in a matter of hours.

Burt became the first 1st year head coach to win 10 Atlantic 10 Conference games since 2009. The 10 wins tied Duquesne's second-best total since joining the league in 1983-84. The Dukes also set a single-season team record with seven straight conference victories from Jan. 8 to Feb. 1, 2014. The winning streak culminated with Duquesne receiving three votes in the prestigious USA Today/Coaches Poll.

The end of the A-10 season saw two of Burt's student-athletes named to the Atlantic 10 All-Conference team in Wumi Agunbiade and Raegan Moore.

One of just five NCAA Division I 1st year head coaches to win 20 games, Burt was named a finalist for the 2014 Spalding Maggie Dixon Division I Rookie Coach of the Year award, which honors a WBCA Division I head coach who has led his or her team to a successful season during his or her first year at the helm.

During his seven years on the Bluff, including six as the program's top assistant coach, Burt helped the Dukes to 143 victories and six WNIT appearances. He helped recruit and coach 10 players who earned all-conference honors a total of 17 times, seven 1,000 point scorers and the 2008, 2009 (Kristi Little) and 2013 (Jocelyn Floyd) Atlantic 10 Defensive Players of the Year.

A key component in Burt's coaching philosophy is player development.

In his time at Duquesne, seven of Burt's players have gone on to play professionally overseas: Vanessa Abel - Germany, Wumi Agunbiade - Romania, Jocelyn Floyd - Germany, Alex Gensler - Hungary, Kristi Little - Hungary, Orsi Szecsi - Hungary, Diana Voynova - Bulgaria and Italy.

Recognized as one of the country's top recruiters, Burt assembled a 2011 class that was ranked 38th in the nation by ESPN HoopGurlz and 47th by Blue Star Basketball. Duquesne's class of 2013 was named the 39th-best in the nation by Blue Star Basketball.

Burt was instrumental in recruiting the 2011 Atlantic 10 Rookie of the Year Wumi Agunbiade and Orsi Szecsi, who was

a member of the 2011 Atlantic 10 All-Rookie Team. Agunbiade was ranked the 43rd best power forward by ESPN HoopGurlz and 108th best player by Blue Star Basketball. Szecsi was rated the 14th best small forward and 77th best player by ESPN HoopGurlz. Blue Star ranked Szecsi the 84th best player overall and Scout.com had her at the 17th best player in the Middle Atlantic Region. Jose-Ann Johnson was listed as the 38th best post player in North America by ESPN HoopGurlz and was the highest ranking of any player from Canada in the 2011 recruiting class.

A native of nearby Washington, Pa., Burt came to Duquesne from Bucknell where he was an assistant for three seasons (2004-07). He was also an assistant for three seasons at both West Virginia (1998-2001) and UNC Wilmington (2001-04).

In June 2013, Burt was selected as one of 30 head coaches across the nation to participate in the Center For Coaching Excellence by the Women's Basketball Coaches Association (WBCA). The event introduces coaches to various aspects of leadership and provide a deeper understanding and appreciation of the importance of ethics and integrity in college women's basketball through a rigorous curriculum presented in a seminar-style environment. The exclusive invitation-only elite leadership program was held at Columbia University in New York City.

Burt has also facilitated roundtable discussions at the WBCA National Coaches Convention. He was one of 15 assistant coaches selected from around the country to lead the discussions in 1999, 2002, 2003, 2004, 2006, 2011 and 2013. He also coordinated a roundtable meeting for the entire athletic department at UNC Wilmington during 2003-04 that focused on recruiting for all sports at the school.

In 2002, Burt worked with YES - Youth Education through Sports - Basketball Clinic as part of the Final Four Festivities in San Antonio, Texas. He reprised the role at the 2014 Final Four in Nashville, Tenn. YES is the NCAA's premier outreach to youth across the country, connecting young athletes with collegiate coaches and student-athletes to provide fundamental instruction in sports, conditioning and life skills at select collegiate championships

Burt graduated from Trinity High School in Washington, Pa. prior to earning a bachelor's degree in physical education from West Liberty State College in 1993. While a Hilltopper, Burt was a scholar-athlete award winner as a member of the men's basketball team.

Following graduation, Burt worked as an admissions counselor at Shepherd College in Shepherdstown, W.Va. for five years. He was an assistant coach with the men's team during the 1994-95 campaign and was also a college basketball referee in Pennsylvania, West Virginia and Maryland.

Burt is married to Kata Katanich-Burt, who received her MBA from Duquesne's Donahue Graduate School of Business. The couple have two sons - Soma and Milan.

ASSISTANT COACH EDDIE BENTON

Eddie Benton, a native of Manchester in Pittsburgh's North Side, returns to the Dukes bench for his second season. Benton came to the Bluff after serving as an assistant women's basketball coach for one season at Saint Francis University. At SFU, he helped the Red Flash to their first-ever berth in the Women's Basketball Invitational.

Prior to his stint in Loretto, Benton was head women's coach at La Roche College where he led the Lady Redhawks to back-to-back Allegheny Mountain Collegiate Conference championships and NCAA Division III Tournament berths. In his eight years at the helm, Benton's teams won 108 games. In 2012, Benton was named the AMCC Coach of the Year award.

Before coaching on the women's side, Benton served as a men's assistant coach at Robert Morris for three years under Mark Schmidt after spending two years as an assistant coach with the men's program at La Roche.

As a player, Benton was a standout guard at the University of Vermont. The Catamounts all-time leading scorer and 2006 UVM Hall of Fame inductee, Benton was the winner of the 1996 Frances Pomeroy Naismith Award given to the nation's top basketball player less than six feet tall and the Bob Cousy Award, which is given to the best senior in the region under 6-feet tall.

After graduating with his degree in sociology, he played professionally in the CBA with the Grand Rapids Hoops. After the CBA, Benton continued his playing career overseas in Israel, Holland and Venezuela.

Benton and his wife Beverly have two children - NyAsia and Eddie III (Tre).

ASSISTANT COACH MATT SCHMIDT

Matt Schmidt is also in his second season with the Dukes. The Johnstown, Pa. native came to the Bluff after serving as head women's basketball coach at Armstrong Atlantic State University in Savannah, Ga. for five seasons. At Armstrong Atlantic, Schmidt led the Pirates to 60 victories, 37 in the Peach Belt Conference. In his first season at the helm, Schmidt's team won a program record 12

conference games and had its highest conference finish in 15 years. During his tenure, he saw a pair of players named to the Peach Belt All-Conference team. He also coaches the first back-to-back-to-back Peach Belt Player of the Week in nine seasons. His signature win came in his final season with the Pirates, a 69-67 victory over #5 USC Aiken.

Prior to his time at Armstrong Atlantic, Schmidt served as

the top assistant coach at Northern Kentucky for four seasons. He coached eight Great Lakes Valley All-Conference players a total of 13 times. Overall, NKU was 92-32 with Schmidt on staff, averaging 23 wins per season.

Schmidt served three seasons as an assistant at the University of Findlay in Findlay, Ohio. While at Findlay, he led the Oilers to 40 wins from 2002-04. and coached players that were named Great Lakes Intercollegiate Athletic All-Conference a total of eight times.

Schmidt was a assistant coach at West Virginia for the 2001 season. He coached Kate Bulger who finished her career as WVU's 4th all-time leading scorer and was the first player from West Virginia to be drafted in the WNBA.

During the 2000 season, Schmidt was an assistant coach as UMBC where helped the Retrievers transition from the Big South Conference into the Northeast Conference.

As a student-athlete, Schmidt played collegiately at West Liberty State in Wheeling, W.Va. A member of the Dean's List, Schmidt was a four-time West Liberty State College Scholar Athlete while earning a degree in education.

Schmidt and his wife, Brittany, have two sons Jackson and Zachary.

**ASSISTANT COACH RACHEL WOJDOWSKI**

Rachel Wojdowski enters her fifth season on the Duquesne women's basketball staff - her second as assistant coach after serving a director of basketball operations during the 2011, 2012 and 2013 seasons.

She joined the women's basketball staff after a successful five-year professional playing career overseas which included stops in Bulgaria, Belgium, Luxembourg, Germany and Holland.

Wojdowski joined the Dukes' team as a walk-on for the 2001 season, but transferred to UNC Wilmington where she played under current Duquesne head coach Dan Burt. After leading the Seahawks to a 22-6 season in 2003, she reinjured her ACL.

She opted to finish her collegiate career at New York University. In her two years at NYU, Wojdowski led the Violets to a 46-9 record and was the 2004 University Athletic Association Player of the Year while leading NYU to the NCAA Division III Sweet 16 with a 23-4 record. During her senior season, she led NYU to the ECAC Metro championship with a 23-5 overall record and was named NYU Kodak All-American.

Her 16.4 points per game is still second best in program's 91-year history.

Wojdowski started her coaching career as an assistant coach at Peters Township High School. In 2010, she helped the Indians reach a berth in the WPIAL semifinals, which included a first round upset of traditional AAAA powerhouse Oakland Catholic.

In the summer of 2011, Wojdowski played her first season with the Pittsburgh Passion, a professional football team that plays in the Independent Women's Football League. She has been named First-Team All-Star all four seasons. In July, 2014 Wojdowski led the Passion to its first IWFL Championship.

Wojdowski's father, Jack, was a three-year varsity player for the Dukes from 1971-73 and led DU to a 57-17 record and an appearance in the 1971 NCAA Tournament during his time on the Bluff.

A 2000 graduate of Bethel Park High School, Wojdowski was inducted into the Bethel Park Athletic Hall of Fame in 2011 and will be inducted into NYU's Hall of Fame in May.

DIRECTOR OF OPS JADE SINGLETON



Duquesne alum Jade Singleton returned to the Bluff in July 2013 as a graduate assistant in charge of basketball administration and was promoted to director of basketball operations in July 2014.

Her duties include assisting the coaching staff with film exchange, team travel, academic coordination and daily operations duties within the Dukes' basketball office. Singleton is also responsible for student-athlete academic enhancement, fundraising and alumni and booster relations.

Singleton played with the Dukes from 2005-08. Her senior season, she was named team captain and started all 30 games. She finished the year with a team-high 202 rebounds which was 10th best in the Atlantic 10 Conference. Additionally, Singleton shot 44.3 percent from the floor which was 15th best in the conference.

After receiving her bachelor's in elementary education, Singleton went on to teach 4th, 5th and 6th grade reading, language arts and English in the Duquesne City school district. Singleton also coached 7th and 8th grade basketball at Duquesne City. She finished her master's degree in ESL teaching in August 2014.

In 2009, Singleton was hired as an assistant at Oakland Catholic High School. In her three seasons with the Eagles, Singleton helped coach the team to a 62-18 (.775) record which included 33-3 (.916) record in WPIAL AAAA Section 3.

The Dukes went undefeated in conference play at the Palumbo Center for the first time ever. Duquesne is currently riding an 12-game winning steak on their home floor.

BENTON HONORED AS A-10 ASSISTANT COACH OF THE YEAR

Kenny Kallina of Florida Girl's Basketball along with John McGraw Scouting Service have named Eddie Benton the Atlantic 10 Assistant Coach of the Year. Additionally, Kallina and McGraw named Burt its Atlantic 10 Coach of the Year. This season, Burt took a team predicted to finish seventh in the A-10 and led them to a third place finish and their first appearance in the conference semifinal game since 2006.

BELMA'S BACK

After a slow start, senior Belma Nurkic had back-to-back monster games against Ball State and Kent State. Nurkic tied her career-high with 19 points in the Ball State Federal Credit Union Thanksgiving Classic championship game and surpassed that with 21 points in the Dukes' victory over Kent State. Nurkic also recorded a career-high with

eight field goals against the Golden Flashes. In those two games, she scored 40 points which was 24 more than in the first five games combined. She hit 3-of-6 shots against Pittsburgh, including two 3-pointers. The senior earned her bachelor's degree on Dec. 19th. She has 117 career 3-pointers which ranks ninth all time. Making 93.8 percent of her foul shots, she has become the program's all-time free throw percentage leader with 86.5.

JOHNSON COMING OF AGE

Senior Jose-Ann Johnson has been one of the Dukes' most improved players this season. The 6-4 center set a career-high with 17 points at Robert Morris and set a personal-best by making eight free throws against Kent State and at West Virginia. Her minutes played has gone from 9.3 her first three seasons to 25.8 this year and her scoring average from 1.9 points per game to 9.1ppg. She is 2nd in the A-10 with 72 blocks. Johnson became the all-time single-season shot block leader in the regular season finale against St. Bonaventure. She has 108 for her career which is sixth all-time. She had a double-double of 11 points and a career-high 12 rebounds against Saint Louis this season.

LIV-IN' LARGE

Senior Olivia Bresnahan who is in her second and final season with the Dukes, is 4th in the A-10 with an assists-to-turnover ratio of 1.5 and 9th in the league with 3.6 assists per game. She's recorded a pair of 7-assist games this season (Jackson State, Syracuse). Against Richmond, she pulled down a career-high 14 rebounds, besting her previous mark by six.

COACH LIV

Bresnahan was one of just 50 applicants to be accepted into the Women's Basketball Coaches Association 'So You Want To Be A Coach' program. The program is an effort to provide female student-athletes with an experience that becomes the foundation of a successful coaching career. Each year the process of being selected has become more difficult with the number of applicants on the rise. This year's program will be held from Apr. 3-5 during the WBCA National Convention in Tampa, Fla.

HERE'S TO YOU, MISS ROBINSON

Junior point guard April Robinson was named MVP of the Ball State Federal Credit Union Thanksgiving Classic. Robinson finished the event with 33 points, a 52.2 shooting percentage (12-of-23), nine assists to three turnovers and 7-of-11 (52.2 percent) from 3-point range. She set a then-career-high with 22 points on 9-of-12 shooting against Jackson State and tied her career-high with 11 assists against Pittsburgh. She scored a career-high 28 points on 10-of-15 shooting, including 8-of-9 3-pointers at Lehigh. Robinson is currently 1st in the A-10 and 29th in the NCAA with a 2.1 assists-to-turnover ratio. She ranks 3rd in the A-10 in assists with 156 and is 2nd in the A-10 and 47th in the NCAA averaging 4.7 per game. She is 1st in the A-10 with 85 3-pointers made and 2.6 3-pointers per game. Robinson has scored in double-figures in every game but five this season.

WORKIN' HARD WORKMAN

Junior college transfer Deva'Nyar Workman was named to the Ball State Federal Credit Union Thanksgiving Classic All-Tournament Team. She averaged 14.5 points while hitting 64.3 percent (9-of-14) of her shots. Her career-highs of 24 points against #23 Syracuse is team-highs this season. She recorded her second 20-point game when she scored 21 points against Pittsburgh off the bench. She tied her career-high in rebounds when she recorded her second career double-double of 12 points and 11 rebounds at Robert Morris and Rhode Island. She recorded her third double-

double of the season with 11 points and 10 rebounds at Dayton.

THE FUTURE LOOKS BRIGHT

Duquesne has signed five players that will comprise the incoming 2015-16 freshman class.

Paige Cannon (6-1, F, Johnstown, Ohio/Johnstown-Monroe) led Johnstown-Monroe to a 26-3 record, a berth in the Division II title game and a #1 ranking in the Columbus Dispatch Coaches Poll. The 2013 and 2014 team MVP finished her junior year averaging 15.7 points per game.

Kadri-Ann Lass (6-3, G, Tallinn, Estonia) played in the 2014 FIBA U18 European Women's Championship this past summer where she averaged a double-double of 12.0 points per game and 12.9 rebounds per game. She finished the 7-game event ranked 1st in blocked shots (3.0), 2nd in rebounds (12.9), 3rd in field goal percentage (50.0) and 4th in double-doubles (5). She also hit half of her 30point attempts. She had a career-high 21 rebounds in Estonia's 63-58 win over Israel. She was named Best Forward by Eurobasket.com and to the 2014 FIBA U18 European Women's Championship First-Team.

Chassidy Omogrosso (5-6, G, Beaver Falls, Pa./Blackhawk) was the 2014 AP Pennsylvania AAA Player of the Year, led Blackhawk to a 28-2 record and WPIAL and PIAA championships as a junior. In the state championship game against Archbishop Wood, she scored a game-high 26 points. She finished her junior season averaging 21.6 points per game. Already Blackhawk's all-time leading scorer with 1,848 points, Omogrosso has been named to the Pittsburgh Post-Gazette's Fabulous Five and the Pittsburgh Tribune-Review's Terrific Ten her sophomore and junior seasons. 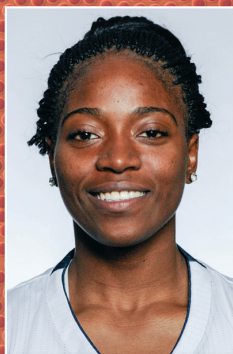
