THE GAME

The five-time reigning MEAC regular-season champion Lady Pirates have advanced in the 2015 Postseason WNIT, taking on West Virginia at 7 p.m. in the second round. This will be Hampton's first-ever appearance in the WNIT.

THE OPPONENT

This will be the first-ever meeting between Hampton and West Virginia.

LADY PIRATES: ROAD WARRIORS

The Lady Pirates were 10-3 in true road games last season, and they closed the 2013-14 campaign with eight straight wins in true road contests. Hampton is 62-26 in road games under head coach David Six after a 45-42 win over Drexel this past Thursday, and heading into the 2014-15 campaign, the Lady Pirates have won at least 10 road games in each of the last four seasons.

UNPRECEDENTED: FIVE IN A ROW

Prior to the 2013-14 season, no MEAC women's team had ever won five straight conference tournaments. But when the Lady Pirates defeated Coppin State 50-47 in last year's MEAC Tournament title game, they did just that. Head coach David Six has won the MEAC Tournament in each of his first five seasons at the helm, before falling in the quarterfinals this season to Maryland Eastern Shore to snap that streak. During those five years, Hampton went 74-6 in MEAC play (89-6 including MEAC Tournament games). That stretch includes back-to-back seasons in which the Lady Pirates went undefeated in conference play; overall, the Lady Pirates had won 54 straight games against MEAC foes, including conference tournament games, prior to a loss at Savannah State on Jan. 24.

SCOUTING THE MOUNTAINEERS

West Virginia, in its 14th season under head coach Mike Carey, opened the WNIT with an 84-61 win over Buffalo on Thursday. Bria Holmes leads the Mountaineers in scoring, averaging 19.2 points per game, while Avereé Fields is averaging 13.0 points and 6.6 rebounds a contest. Lanay Montgomery is the team's top rebounder with 7.4 boards a game.

LADY PIRATES AGAINST THE BIG XII

Hampton is 2-4 all-time against schools currently in the Big XII. The Lady Pirates are 0-1 against Iowa State, 1-1 against Kansas, 1-1 against Kansas State (including a 66-46 loss earlier this season), and 0-1 against Texas. Hampton has never faced Baylor, Oklahoma, Oklahoma State, TCU, Texas Tech, or West Virginia.

LADY PIRATES PICKED TO FINISH SECOND

Hampton has been picked to finish second in the MEAC this season in a preseason poll voted on by the league's head coaches and sports information directors. The Lady Pirates responded by going 14-2 in conference play, winning their fifth straight MEAC regular-season title.

LADY PIRATES THE MEAC'S BEST

Since Hampton joined the MEAC in 1995, no program has won as many conference tournament titles. The Lady Pirates have won eight titles overall — including five of the last six — while Howard has the second-most with four. Over that same span, Hampton has won at least a share of eight regular-season titles, which is also the most among conference teams.

LADY PIRATES: VIRGINIA'S BEST

Since David Six's arrival, the Lady Pirates have been the best program in the Commonwealth of Virginia — even better than such programs as James Madison, Old Dominion, Virginia, Richmond, and Liberty. On top of five straight MEAC Tournament titles, four straight MEAC regular-season titles, and five straight NCAA Tournament appearances, the Lady Pirates are serving notice throughout Virginia.

Over the past five seasons, Hampton has the best record among Virginia's Div. I women's basketball programs, compiling a .784 winning percentage during Six's tenure.

LADY PIRATES ODDS AND ENDS

TATE-DeFREITAS MEAC PLAYER OF THE YEAR

After being named the MEAC Rookie of the Year last season, sophomore guard Malia Tate-DeFreitas has been named the MEAC Player of the Year. She is the second Hampton player in the last three years to be given the honor (Keiara Avant, 2012-13), and Tate-DeFreitas leads the MEAC in scoring — and ranks 14th in the nation — with 21.3 points per contest. The five-time MEAC Player of the Week has scored 20 or more points in nine of her last 12 games, including a career-high 39 at Howard on Feb. 28. Tate-DeFreitas eclipsed the 1,000-point mark for her career on Jan. 26 with a 37-point effort at South Carolina State, becoming the 26th player in program history to reach that milestone.

WARD CRASHED THE GLASS

The Lady Pirates played 33 games in 2013-14, and in 13 of those games, forward Brielle Ward grabbed double-digit rebounds — including a school-record 23 against Virginia Tech on Jan. 1. She was second on the team with 8.3 rebounds per game (fourth in the MEAC), and she pulled down 11 boards in a loss at UC Santa Barbara on Nov. 26. She also grabbed 15 rebounds against North Carolina A&T, 13 rebounds at Drexel on Dec. 18, as well as 12 each against Kansas State and Delaware State. She was key in the Lady Pirates' MEAC Tournament championship game against Coppin State, grabbing 10 rebounds and scoring 10 points for her lone double-double of the season. Ward currently ranks fifth in the MEAC in offensive rebounds.

COLE DISHING IT OUT

Senior guard Kenia Cole, who was a Preseason Third Team All-MEAC selection, currently leads the MEAC in assist/turnover ratio and ranks second in assists. In her last 21 games of 2013-14, Cole averaged 13.0 points per contest — including her career-best 30-point effort against Virginia Tech on Jan. 1. Cole also had 19 points against Brown on Dec. 29, and in her last 21 games, Cole is 49-for-125 (.392) from 3-point range — and 83-for-210 (.395) from the floor.

TATE-DeFREITAS, COLE HONORED

Sophomore guard Malia Tate-DeFreitas was named Preseason First Team All-MEAC by the league's head coaches and sports information directors, while senior guard Kenia Cole was named Preseason Third Team All-MEAC. It was yet another honor for Tate-DeFreitas, the 2013-14 MEAC Rookie of the Year, Second Team All-MEAC selection, VaSID Rookie of the Year, and VaSID Second Team All-State selection.

JORDAN NAMED THIRD TEAM ALL-MEAC

Junior guard Ryan Jordan was selected Third Team All-MEAC by the league's head coaches and sports information directors, in large part because she ranks seventh in the MEAC in offensive rebounds, averaging 3.0 per game. Jordan is second on the team in rebounds with 5.9 per contest, and she had a double-double at South Carolina State on Jan. 26, scoring a career-high 22 points and grabbing 12 boards. She had a career-high 14 rebounds at DePaul on Dec. 22. She had 19 points and nine rebounds in Thursday's WNIT first-round win at Drexel.

LOADED WITH TRANSFERS

Of the seven newcomers currently on the Lady Pirates roster, four of them come from other Div. I schools. Senior guard Kyani White transferred over from East Carolina, while junior guard Kristine Rose comes

over from Xavier and redshirt-junior forward Lindsay Williams was at Mount St. Mary's before heading to Anne Arundel Community College. In addition, senior guard Jackie Marshall played at Iona.

Williams averaged 15.2 points and 9.4 rebounds per game last season for Anna Arundel, earning All-Conference honors, while Rose played in seven games for Xavier in 2012-13. Six anticipates that White will spend much of the season running point.

ALL THEY DO IS WIN

The Lady Pirates came into the 2014-15 season with the best winning percentage among all Div. I programs in the commonwealth of Virginia, sitting at .784 (127-35) during head coach David Six's first five years at the helm. Hampton has won 20 games or more in each of Six's five seasons and were on an 18-game winning streak, the fourth-longest in the nation, prior to their NCAA Tournament loss to Michigan State.

LADY PIRATES AGAINST "POWER CONFERENCES"

In David Six's five-plus seasons at the helm, the Lady Pirates have enjoyed success against the six so-called "power conferences:" the ACC, Big East, Big Ten, Big XII, Pac-12, and SEC. After a 44-42 win over Auburn on Dec. 30, the Lady Pirates are 9-17 against teams in these six conferences — including a 2-3 mark last season after defeating Virginia Tech 70-60 on Jan. 1.

Hampton was 3-3 against such teams in 2012-13, including wins over LSU, Mississippi State, and Boston College. During Six's tenure, Hampton boasts wins over LSU, Florida, Boston College, Pitt, Mississippi State, Kansas State, and Virginia Tech — and the Lady Pirates took Kentucky to overtime in the first round of the NCAA Tournament in March 2011.

SIX REACHES A MILESTONE AND TIES ANOTHER

When the Lady Pirates beat Penn 58-43 on Dec. 5, Six became the program's all-time winningest coach at the Div. I level. So far, Six's career winning percentage (.757) is the best in Div. I program history and second overall to the legendary James Sweat, who won 82.1 percent of his games with the Lady Pirates from 1981-88.

Only four head coaches have an overall winning record with the Lady Pirates: Six, Sweat, the late Tiny L. Laster (.626, 1988-95), and Patricia Cage-Bibbs (.605, 1997-2004). Six's 128 wins surpassed Cage-Bibbs for the most by a coach in program Div. I history.

THEY HAVE A HISTORY

Before coming to Hampton University, head coach David Six was the head girls basketball coach at nearby Hampton High School — where he won 331 games and two state championships. While at Hampton High, Six sometimes squared off against current Lady Pirates assistant Barbara Burgess, who from 2002-08 was the head girls basketball coach at Peninsula District rival Phoebus High School. Burgess went 73-67 at Phoebus, and she led the Lady Phantoms to three Eastern Region tournament appearances.

2014-15 HAMPTON UNIVERSITY WOMEN'S BASKETBALL

HEAD COACH DAVID SIX



David Six is entering his sixth year as head coach of the Hampton University women's basketball team, turning the Lady Pirates into a dynasty in the MEAC after spending a year as the Director of Intramurals at Hampton University.

In five seasons with the Lady Pirates, Six is 127-35 overall and 74-6 in conference play. He comes into the 2014-15 campaign tied with Patricia Cage-Bibbs for most career wins by a coach in the program's Div. I history. The Lady Pirates have won 49 straight games over

MEAC foes – including conference tournament games.

The Lady Pirates made history in 2013-14, their fifth season under Six, winning their fifth straight MEAC Tournament crown (a conference first) after tying a Div. I program record with 28 wins and recording their second straight 16-0 mark in conference play. For their efforts, the Lady Pirates were awarded a No. 12 seed in the NCAA Tournament – the best seed ever for a MEAC school in the NCAA's 64-team format – and faced Michigan State in the first round.

Six was named MEAC Coach of the Year for the second straight season – and third time overall – while freshman scoring machine Malia Tate-DeFreitas was named the MEAC Rookie of the Year and senior guard Nicole Hamilton was named First Team All-MEAC. Alyssa Bennett, a senior forward, was named MEAC Defensive Player of the Year for the second straight season.

Bennett was also a First Team All-MEAC selection; Tate-DeFreitas was named Second Team.

In Six's first five years at the helm, the MEAC Defensive Player of the Year honor has gone to a Hampton player four times. Defense has been a staple of the program since Six took over, and that was no different in 2013-14, as Hampton finished the season ranked 16th in the nation in scoring defense, holding teams to just over 57 points per game.

Teams shot just 33.4 percent from the floor against Hampton in 2013-14 – the second-best field goal percentage defense among all Div. I programs. The Lady Pirates were also eighth in the nation in 3-point field goal percentage defense, holding teams to 26.7 percent shooting from behind the arc.

The 2012-13 season was perhaps Six's best yet with the Lady Pirates, as he guided the team to a program Division I-record 28 wins and a fourth straight MEAC Tournament championship – marking just the second time in conference history that a women's program won four straight tournaments (Howard, 1987-90).

The Lady Pirates also went 16-0 in the MEAC last season, marking the first time in program history that Hampton went unbeaten in the MEAC – and just the fifth time in the history of the conference. Along the way, Hampton won 19 straight games from Jan. 2 through March 16, setting a program Div. I record for longest winning streak.

Six was named MEAC Coach of the Year for the second time, while senior forward Keiara Avant was named MEAC Player of the Year, becoming the first Lady Pirate to ever earn that honor. Bennett was named MEAC Defensive Player of the Year.

The Lady Pirates led the nation in scoring defense in 2012-13, holding opponents to just 47.8 points per game. Hampton was also third in the nation last season in both field goal percentage defense (.320) and 3-point field goal percentage defense (.243).

Six's third season at the helm proved historic on many levels for the Lady Pirates, beginning with a 26 wins. The Lady Pirates also went 15-1 in the MEAC, claiming their second straight MEAC regular-season title, before claiming their third straight MEAC Tournament crown – becoming the first MEAC team to win three straight conference tournaments since Howard (1996-98).

After winning yet another MEAC Tournament crown, the Lady Pirates were given a No. 16 seed in the NCAA Tournament, squaring off against top-seeded Stanford in the first round in Norfolk, Va.

In 2011-12, the Lady Pirates were second among all Div. I teams – behind only Connecticut – in scoring defense, giving up just 47.6 points per game. The Lady Pirates were also fourth in the nation in field goal percentage defense (.331) and fifth in turnover margin (+6.61).

Hampton also led the nation last season in 3-point field goal defense, only allowing 21.3 percent of shots from behind the arc.

Three Lady Pirates earned All-MEAC honors in 2011-12, led by senior guard Jericka Jenkins – who was a First Team All-MEAC selection after finishing the season fifth in the NCAA in assists (7.1) and assist-turnover ratio (2.4).

Jenkins was also the MEAC Tournament's Most Outstanding Player.

Senior guard Choicetta McMillian and senior forward Melanie Warner were Second Team All-MEAC selections.

His second season with the program proved even more successful than the first, as Six guided the Lady Pirates to their second straight 20-win season (the first time in program Div. I history), the MEAC regular-season title and a second straight MEAC Tournament crown. Six's team was rewarded with a No. 13 seed in the NCAA Tournament – the highest seed ever for a MEAC school in the 64-team format.

The Lady Pirates gave No. 4 seed Kentucky everything it could handle in the first round before falling 66-62 in overtime in The Pit on the campus of the University of New Mexico in Albuquerque, N.M.

Six saw Jenkins earn First Team All-MEAC honors, as well as Associated Press Honorable Mention All-America accolades, after finishing the season second in the nation with 7.0 assists per game, while also leading the team in scoring.

Senior forward Quanneisha Perry, who led the MEAC with 9.0 rebounds per game, was named MEAC Defensive Player of the Year for the second straight season – marking the first time in conference history a player won the award in back-to-back years.

As the interim head coach in 2009-10, Six led the Lady Pirates to their first MEAC Tournament title since 2004 and a first-round NCAA Tournament game against Duke in Durham, N.C. Six went 20-12 in his first season at Hampton, marking the first time the Lady Pirates won 20 games in a season since the team went 23-9 in 2002-03.

The Lady Pirates also went 12-4 in MEAC play, with Perry earning First Team All-MEAC and MEAC Defensive Player of the Year honors. Sophomore guard Bernadette Fortune was named Second Team All-MEAC, while Breanna Jones was named to the All-MEAC Rookie Team. On top of all that, sophomore forward Melanie Warner was named the MEAC Tournament's Most Outstanding Player.

Hampton University rewarded Six on March 15, 2010 with a three-year contract.

With a 45-19 overall record in his first two years with the Lady Pirates, Six has led Hampton to the third-best record among NCAA Div. I women's basketball programs in Virginia over the last two seasons. Over that span, Hampton has a better record than such school as Virginia, Old Dominion and Richmond.

Six arrived in the Tidewater area in November 1985, by way of the United States Air Force Langley Air Force, Hampton, Virginia and Hampton University.

At Langley, Six played base level basketball, where he was selected All-Uni-Com for six straight years. After leaving the military, Six set his sights on the coaching profession, where he began as a volunteer assistant for the varsity boys at Hampton High School in 1991, where he served in that capacity for two years before taking the reigns as the head girls varsity coach in 1993.

Six made an immediate impact on the Hampton High program, going 14-8 in his first season. In three seasons, Hampton High captured its first district title ever and appeared in the 1995 Virginia Group AAA state Final Four, finishing with 26-4 record the best in school history at the time.

After the 1995 season, Six left Hampton High to become the head varsity boys coach at Gloucester (Va.) High School. Six is the only boys coach in Gloucester history to qualify for the district tournament – a feat he accomplished twice.

At the conclusion of the 1998 season, Six returned to the helm at Hampton High. Again Six ignited the program, capturing the 2000 district tournament championship.

In the 2001 season, the Lady Crabbers won the district and district tournament championship, before capturing the first female state championship in the 105-year history of Hampton High, finishing the season 27-3.

At that point, Six-coached teams had won seven straight district titles, and an astounding eight straight district tournament titles, en route to a

remarkable 141-6 record against Peninsula District competition.

The 2007 season was nothing short of spectacular for Six and the Lady Crabbers, as they set a school record with 30 wins against just two losses. The Lady Crabbers defeated the No. 11 and No. 13 teams in the nation, capturing their eighth district title and eighth straight district tournament title, as well as the Eastern Regional title, culminating with the school's second state title in six years.

The team finished that season ranked ninth in the country.

Six has been selected as the Virginia High School League Coaches Association (VHSLCA) Coach of the Year twice (2001, 2007), as well as the 2007 Associated Press Coach of the Year.

He amassed an incredible 331-93 overall record in 14 seasons. His accomplishments include: two state titles, one regional title, 10 regional appearances, five state Final Four appearances, nine district titles and nine district tournament titles.

During his tenure as a high school coach, Six was instrumental in helping more than 30 players receive basketball scholarships, while transforming the Hampton High girls basketball program into one of the elite programs in the country.

More importantly, Six's dedication, influence and strong leadership skills greatly contributed in many of the young women that he has coached excelling in a variety of professions to include a lawyer, entrepreneur, Rhode scholar, two college coaches, four educators and host of other young productive citizens.

Six is a native of Brooklyn, N.Y.
