## No. 1 West Virginia at TCU

#### The Kick Off

- The No. 1-ranked West Virginia University women's soccer team opens a weekend swing through Texas at TCU on Friday, Oct. 21, at Garvey-Rosenthal Stadium, at 8 p.m. ET. The Mountaineers boast a six-match win streak.
- With a win Friday night, WVU's 21-year program win total would move to 300, with all victories coming under coach Nikki Izzo-Brown.
- WVU sits at No. 1 in all three major polls this week, as well as the NCAA RPI.
- Since 2014, WVU is 18-0-2 in Big 12 Conference regular-season matches, the second-longest unbeaten streak in Big 12 history. WVU also is 7-0-2 on the road in that time span and 14-1-2 in all-time road Big 12 matches.
- Since dropping a 1-0 2OT decision to No. 9 Georgetown on Sept. 18, the WVU defense has posted a shutout in 11 of 12 halves played, with the only goal allowed a penalty kick at Richmond on Sept. 23. WVU has posted nine shutouts in 2016 and allowed just six opponent goals, the second-fewest allowed in the NCAA (thru games as of Oct. 18).
- · No Big 12 team has scored against WVU this season, and the squad is one of four teams nationally to have held conference opponents scoreless.
- WVU has posted a shutout in seven of its last nine Big 12 road matches.
- WVU has won the Big 12 Conference regular-season title each year since joining the league in 2012. The Mountaineers are the only team in conference history to win four consecutive outright championships.
- WVU owns a 32-1-3 record since joining the Big 12 in 2012, good enough for a .931 win percentage, the best win percentage over a five-year span for any team in Big 12 Conference history.
- Junior forward Michaela Abam paces the Mountaineers with seven goals. She shows 27 career goals and needs one more to break onto the program's all-time career goals list.

• WVU is 4-1-1 all-time against the Horned Frogs.

#### The Last Meeting

- Michaela Abam tallied the game-winner in the 82nd minute to push the No. 3 Mountaineers to a 2-1 win over TCU on Oct. 2, 2015, at DDSS Ashley Lawrence scored the first goal 62 seconds into the match for the then-second fastest goal in program history.
- WVU outshot TCU, 22-3 and forced Shannon Coffer into seven saves. Hannah Steadman made two saves in the win. The Mountaineers also earned a 22-3, edge in corner kicks. TCU's first-half score was the first goal allowed by WVU since Aug. 23 and snapped the team's program record nine-match shutout streak.

### The Last Meeting in Fort Worth

- Despite a 29-6 shot advantage, No. 13 WVU settled for a 0-0 2OT draw at TCU on Sept. 27, 2014.
- · WVU forced TCU into nine saves, while the Mountaineers made two. Michaela Abam paced with seven shots off the bench.

#### A Look at the Horned Frogs

- TCU is 1-4-1 since Sept. 23, with its lone victory a 1-0 2OT win over SMU on Sept. 25. The Horned Frogs have been outscored 8-3 in that span.
- Junior forward Emma Heckendorn paces with 13 points (2 G, 9 A). Junior Courtney Hofer has started 11 matches between the posts and shows a 3-1 record. She has allowed four goals and made 14 saves.

National Rankings: The Mountaineers earned the No. 1 ranking in the National Soccer Coaches Assocation of America (NSCAA) NCAA Division I Poll on Oct. 11. It was the team's first-ever No. 1 ranking in the national poll.

The Mountaineers were the first Big 12 Conference program to earn the No. 1 ranking in the NSCAA Poll.

WVU sat atop the three major polls for the first time in program history on Oct. 11. On Oct. 18, the Mountaineers ranked No. 1 in all three major polls, as well as the NCAA RPI, for the first time in program history.

The Last Time Out: Sophomore forward Hannah Abraham delivered the game-winning goal for the fourth time this season with a score in the 82nd minute to give the No. 1-ranked Mountaineers a 1-0 victory over Texas Tech on Oct. 14, at Dick Dlesk Soccer Stadium, in front of 2,068 fans. The victory pushed the team's win streak to six and unbeaten streak in home conference matches to 33. WVU finished with a 29-5 edge in shots and forced TTU into eight saves. The Red Raiders were the fifth straight Big 12 opponent to not score against WVU.

Challenging Slate: Year after year, coach Nikki Izzo-Brown challenges the Mountaineers with one of the nation's hardest schedules, and 2016 is no different. WVU faced one ranked opponent in six of the first seven weeks of the season, including one ranked team in each of the first five weeks, marking the first time since at least the 2005 season the Mountaineers kicked against a ranked opponent in five straight weeks.

In total, WVU has faced seven teams that qualified for the 2015 NCAA Tournament. The Mountaineers have already earned a 1-1 (2OT) draw at reigning National Champion Penn State on Aug. 19 and a 3-1 win at runner-up Duke on Sept. 9. WVU is 4-1-1 against ranked teams this season, 2-1-1 against top-10 opponents and 4-0-1 against teams from the Big Ten Conference and Atlantic Coast Conference.

WVU's 2016 slate is the seventh-toughest schedule in the NCAA through games as of Oct. 18, with the Mountaineers' past opposition showing a 0.657 win percentage. The team's schedule also is the sixth-toughest slate in the NCAA based on the 0.640 win percentage of the team's past and future opposition.

Picked to Win Again: The Mountaineers were unanimously picked No. 1 by the league coaches in the 2016 Big 12 Conference Soccer Preseason Poll. It marked the fourth straight season the conference coaches selected WVU to win the Big 12 crown; the team was not chosen in 2012, its first season in the league. WVU is the only current conference team to be tabbed No. 1 four straight seasons and the first squad since Texas A&M (2004-07) to earn a conference-best four straight preseason No. 1 rankings.

The Best of the Big 12: A conference-best four Mountaineers were named to the Preseason All-Big 12 Soccer Team: unanimous selections Kadeisha Buchanan, Ashley Lawrence and Michaela Abam, and Carla Portillo.

We Are the Champions! (x4): With a 2-1 overtime victory at Oklahoma State on Oct. 23, the Mountaineers clinched the 2015 Big 12 Conference regular-season title, their fourth straight. WVU has won the title each season since joining the Big 12 in 2012, and the team is the only program to win four straight outright championships; Texas A&M won four straight titles from 2004-07, but its first was not an outright win. Also the 2015 Big 12 preseason favorite, WVU's accomplishment marked the ninth time in Big 12 history the preseason favorite in the coaches poll also won the title. WVU owns a 32-1-3 all-time record in Big 12 play is unbeaten at DDSS.

Dating back to its days in the Big East Conference, WVU has won five straight conference regular-season crowns and nine since its first title in 2002. WVU has won nine regular season and championship conference titles in six seasons and 14 since 2002.

Hermann Hopefuls Again: For the second straight season, defender Kadeisha Buchanan and midfielder Ashley Lawrence, both seniors, were named to the MAC Hermann Trophy Watch List. College soccer's version of the Heisman Trophy, the award represents the highest level of individual achievement in the sport.

This year's recognition is the third straight for Buchanan and the second straight for Lawrence. It is the fourth time since 2007 WVU has had two student-athletes land on the first list of the season. Nine different Mountaineers have been named to the initial Watch List 14 times since 2003. WVU also has had six semifinalists, including Buchanan and Lawrence. Buchanan was the program's first finalist in 2015 and is the only finalist to return to the list this year.

Mountaineers Win Bronze!: For the second straight summer, seniors Kadeisha Buchanan and Ashley Lawrence gained experience with Canada's National Team on the world's biggest stage, as the duo helped the nation claim Bronze at the 2016 Rio Summer Olympics. Lawrence earned an assist on Canada's first goal in the team's 2-1 win over Brazil in the Bronze medal game.

The first WVU women's soccer players named to an Olympic roster, Buchanan and Lawrence also were the first WVU women's soccer players named to a World Cup roster and started all five of Canada's matches at the 2015 FIFA Women's World Cup. Buchanan was named the Best Young Player, landed on the FIFA Women's World Cup Canada 2015 All-Star Squad and was featured on a Canadian commemorative stamp. Lawrence scored Canada's lone goal in a 1-1 draw against Netherland in Group A play; the score helped advance Canada to the knockout stage for only the second time in six tries.

Buchanan, Lawrence Have CLASS: Kadeisha Buchanan and Ashley Lawrence are two of 30 candidates for the 2016 Senior CLASS Award. An acronym for Celebrating Loyalty and Achievement for Staying in School, the Senior CLASS Award focuses on the total student-athlete and encourages students to use their platform in athletics to make a positive impact as leaders in their communities.

WVU is one of two schools with two candidates. The duo push the program's candidate total to five in the last four seasons.

O Canada!: Seven Mountaineers on the 2016 roster hail from Canada: Kadeisha Buchanan (Ontario), Rylee Foster (Ontario), Ashley Lawrence (Ontario), Easther Mayi Kith (Quebec), Amandine Pierre-Louis (Quebec), Carla Portillo (Ontario) and Bianca St. Georges (Quebec).

For Starters: Seven Mountaineers have earned their first career starts this season - midfielders Patricia Fernandez, Vanessa Flores and Alli Magaletta, defenders Macy Stalnaker and Dalanda Ouendeno, and goalkeepers Rylee Foster and Michelle Newhouse. In total, WVU has 17 players with at least one career start to their name.

Leading the Way: Three Mountaineer seniors were named team captains for the 2016 season: Carly Black, Kadeisha Buchanan and Ashley Lawrence. Buchanan also was a captain in 2015. Captains are voted on by team members.

Fast Starts: The Mountaineers are off to one of their best starts in the program's 21-year history, as the team hit the 10-win mark in just 12 games with a 2-0 win over Oklahoma on Oct. 2. WVU now shows an 13-1-1 record. Only the 2015 squad put together a better start, earning season win No. 10 in its 11th match played and sitting at 11-1 through 12 matches.

This marks the fourth time in program history the Mountaineers have hit the 10-win mark as of game 12. The 2002 team also showed a 10-1-1 record through 12 games played, while the 2003 squad sat at 10-2 through 12 games played.

Izzo-Brown Hits Benchmark: Coach Nikki Izzo-Brown played a big role in making sure the Mountaineers' 2016 season-opening weekend was memorable, as the team's 2-0 victory over Buffalo on Aug. 21, at the Penn State Invitational, was career win No. 300 for the 21-year WVU women's soccer head coach.

Izzo-Brown's 22-year coaching record now stands at 312-107-45 (.721). Before founding the WVU women's soccer program in 1995, she spent one season at West Virginia Wesleyan in 1994. Izzo-Brown has posted a winning record in all 21 seasons with the Mountaineers.

WVU's 2-0 win against No. 23 Oklahoma on Oct. 2 was the squad's 10th victory of the season. Izzo-Brown has led WVU to 10 wins or more each year but 1999. WVU earned a program-record 19 victories in 2015.

The Next 250: In just 21 seasons, the WVU women's soccer team has earned 299 program wins, an average of 14 victories per season; the team needs one win to earn program victory No. 300. The Mountaineers scored program win No. 250 with their 1-0 victory over Baylor at the 2013 Big 12 Soccer Championship semifinal on Nov. 8, in Kansas City, Missouri. WVU earned its 275th program victory with a 1-0 overtime win against Buffalo on Sept. 18, 2015, at Dick Dlesk Soccer Stadium.

Catch Us When You Can: Four of the Mountaineers' regular-season contests will be broadcast for national audiances: at Penn State on Aug. 19 (Big Ten Network), home against Oklahoma on Oct. 2 and Texas Tech on Oct. 14 (ESPNU), and at Texas on Oct. 23 (FOX Sports Network). WVU is 2-0-1 in nationally televised games in 2016, having earned a 1-1 2OT draw at No. 2 PSU on Aug. 19, a 2-0 win over No. 23 OU on Oct. 2 and a 1-0 victory over Texas Tech on Oct. 14. The scheduled television games are the most for WVU since the squad was featured in seven televised matches in 2009.

Defense Back for More: Back to anchor the Mountaineer defense for one final season is three-time NSCAA All-American and three-time reigning Big 12 Defensive Player of the Year, senior center back Kadeisha Buchanan. Under her leadership, the WVU backline has allowed just 56 opponent goals since 2013, including a program-low 11 in 2015, the same season the unit also posted a school-record 15 shutouts.

Sophomore Bianca St. Georges, the reigning Big 12 Newcomer of the Year, also returned in 2016, as did senior Carly Black and sophomore Easther Mayi Kith. Black started 52 straight career matches prior to suffering a season-ending injury in 2015. Mayi Kith replaced her in the lineup and started the remaining 15 matches. Junior Amandine Pierre-Louis adds speed to the line this season.

Through 15 matches in 2016, the WVU defense has posted nine shutouts and allowed just six opponent goals for a 0.39 GAA. A Big 12 Conference opponent has not scored on the Mountaineers this season, and no opponent has scored more than one goal on WVU in 2016. The six goals allowed are the second-fewest allowed in the NCAA (through games played as of Oct. 18).

The Mountaineers have denied opponents a goal in 25 halves this season. Additionally, the unit has held opponents to just 32 corner kick opportunities for a 2.13 average. The WVU defense denied Purdue and Kansas a corner kick chance.

No Shots for You: WVU has held opponents to just 98 shots through 15 games in 2016, with only 42 attempts landing on-frame; no Big 12 team has registered more than two shots on-goal. The Mountaineers denied Purdue and Baylor a shot on-goal.

The Mountaineers denied Longwood a shot in a 4-0 win on Sept. 13, 2015, marking the second time in as many seasons and the fifth time in program history that WVU denied an opponent a shot.

Foster Finds Early Success: Freshman goalkeeper Rylee Foster played lights out in her WVU career debut, making nine saves at No. 2 Penn State on Aug. 19 to help the Mountaineers earn a 1-1 2OT draw against the defending National Champions.

Foster is 10-1-1 on the season and shows a Big 12-best 0.33 GAA, the second-best mark nationally, and a .871 save percentage, the best mark in the Big 12 and the 21st-best in the NCAA. She has made 27 saves and posted six shutouts.

Newhouse Impressive, Too: Junior Michelle Newhouse has split time with freshman Rylee Foster in net this season and also found early success, starting three matches, the first starts of her career, and posting a 3-0 record, including a 3-1 win at No. 5 Duke on Sept. 9. She earned her first career shutout with a 3-0 win vs. Princeton on Sept. 16. She has played in five total matches and shows a 0.59 GAA, making eight saves and allowing two goals.

Goals Galore: The Mountaineers returned 59 percent of the record-setting 61 goals scored in 2015, and the team's top-returning point earner opened 2016 scoring goals, as junior forward Michaela Abam netted the team's lone score in a 1-1 (2OT) draw at No. 2 Penn State on Aug. 19.

Sophomore forward Sh'Nia Gordon returned to the starting lineup after finishing 2015 tied for fourth on the team with 13 points (5 G, 3 A). Junior midfielder Carla Portillo also returned. She started 21 matches and finished with 10 points (3 G, 4 A). Both were All-Big 12 honorees in 2015.

New to the starting rotation this season is junior forward Heather Kaleiohi. Though she missed two early matches, she ranks second on the team with nine points, including a career-high four goals and two game-winners. Portillo also ranks second on the team with nine points (2 G, 5 A), while Gordon follows with eight (3 G, 2 A).

Playing off the bench, sophomore forward Hannah Abraham has been key to the Mountaineers' offensive attack, as she is tied for second with nine points (4 G, 1 A). All four of her scores have been game-winners, the second-best mark in the Big 12 Conference.

Abam is Awesome: Junior forward Michaela Abam has wasted little time returning to the top of the team's stat sheet. The leading goal scorer in 2015, she again paces, as she ranks No. 1 on the team with 17 points (7 G, 3 A), the third-best total in the Big 12. Abam's team-best seven goals rank second in the Big 12 and are the eighth-most scored by an individual in the NCAA this season. With 27 career goals to her name, she needs one more to break onto the WVU all-time career goals list.

Abam had a tremendous start to the Big 12 season, contributing five points in WVU's 2-0 wins over Baylor on Sept. 30 and No. 23 Oklahoma on Oct. 2. She tallied the game-winner against the Bears just 3:11 into the match. Against OU, she assisted on Hannah Abraham's game-winner in the 78th mintue and added an insurance goal in the 86th minute. Her point production was tops in the conference for the weekend, and for her efforts she earned Big 12 Offensive Player of the Week accolades.

Lawrence Dishes Out Assists: Senior midfielder Ashley Lawrence helps drive the Mountaineer offense. An NSCAAAll-America First Team honoree one year ago, she has dished out four helpers this season and ranks No. 5 on the WVU all-time career assists lists with 23. The 23 assists rank No. 13 on the NCAA active career leaders list. Additionally, Lawrence's 0.29 assists/game career average ranks No. 24 on the NCAA active career leaders list.

Double the Fun: Two Mountaineers have netted at least two goals in one game this season: sophomore forward Sh'Nia Gordon (2 vs. Saint Francis, Aug. 28) and junior forward Michaela Abam (2 at No. 5 Duke, Sept. 9).

Since 2010, WVU has had 24 instances where one Mountaineer has netted at least two goals in one game, including seven two-goal performances in 2014, the program's best single-season total in that time frame. The WVU single-game goal record is four, hit by Abam in the Mountaineers' record-setting 8-0 win vs. Villanova on Sept. 6, 2015.

Morgantown Magic: The Mountaineers have developed a true home field advantage, going 115-18-13 at Dick Dlesk Soccer Stadium since its opening in August 2004.

WVU recently put its name in the NCAA Record Book, as the Mountaineers went unbeaten in 30 straight home matches, not losing a contest at DDSS from Aug. 30, 2014 - Sept. 16, 2016. The streak ranks No. 11 all-time in NCAA women's soccer history. The streak was snapped with a 1-0 (20T) loss to No. 9 Georgetown on Sept. 18, 2016.

The Mountaineers have played in front of more than 14,000 fans through nine home games this season and have set five top-10 attendance marks. Most recently, a season-high 2,068 fans were on hand to cheer the Mountaineers to a 1-0 win over Texas Tech on Oct. 14. The crowd was the second-largest women's crowd in stadium history and the program's top regular-season attendance mark. Through games played as of Oct. 18, WVU ranks No. 7 nationally in accumulate attendance (14,547) and No. 7 in average attendance (1,616). Both numbers are tops in the Big 12 Conference.

The Mountaineer attendance record is 3,000+, set on Nov. 30, 2007, in the team's 1-0 loss to USC in the quarterfinals of the NCAA Tournament. Over the last seven seasons, more than 70,000 fans have packed the stands to make Dick Dlesk Soccer Stadium one of the toughest environments in the Big 12.

WVU passed the \$100,000 threshold in 2013. In 12 years, the Mountaineers have raised more than \$120,000 for breast cancer research.

Taking Names: With its 1-0 win against No. 8 Clemson in its 2016 home season opener at Dick Dlesk Soccer Stadium on Aug. 26, WVU has defeated at least one top-10 team in each of the last 12 season. The Mountaineers then earned a 3-1 win at No. 5 Duke on Sept. 9, giving the squad two wins over top-10 opponents in one season for the first time since 2012 and the third time since 2005.
