## 2016 Big 12 Soccer Championship Final

### No. 1 West Virginia vs. TCU

### The Kick Off

- For the third time in four years, the No. 1-ranked and top-seeded WVU women's soccer team will play for a sweep of the Big 12 Conference trophies, as the Mountaineers meet No. 7-seed TCU in the Big 12 Soccer Championship final on Sunday, Nov. 6, at 3:30 p.m. ET, at Swope Soccer Village, in Kansas City, Missouri.
- The 2013 and 2014 Big 12 Soccer Championship victors, WVU has won five conference championship titles since 2007 (including three Big East Championship titles).
- WVU rides an 11-match win streak into Sunday's match and needs three more victories to match the program's longest win-streak, set in 2010. The Mountaineers are one win short of matching the program single-season record, set in 2015.
- Since dropping a 1-0 2OT decision to No. 9 Georgetown on Sept. 18, the WVU defense has posted a shutout in 21 of 22 halves played, with the only goal allowed a penalty kick at Richmond on Sept. 23. WVU has posted 14 shutouts in 2016, the second-most nationally, and allowed just six opponent goals, the fewest allowed nationally (thru games as of 11/3).
- WVU's 2-0 shut-out win over Oklahoma on Nov. 4 was its 10th straight clean sheet, a program and conference's record. It is the longest streak nationally since UCLA strung together 10 consecutive shutouts in 2014.
- WVU has recorded a program-record 934:53 of shut-out play since allowing a goal at Richmond on Sept. 23.
- WVU earned its fifth straight Big 12 Soccer Championship No. 1 seed following an 8-0 showing in conference play. WVU denied all eight Big 12 opponents a goal this year and is the first program in conference history to post a shutout season in league play. The Mountaineers are the only team nationally to have held conference opponents scoreless this season.
- WVU has won the Big 12 Conference regular-season title each year since joining the league in 2012. The Mountaineers are the only team in conference history to win five consecutive outright championships.
- WVU owns a 35-1-3 regular-season record since joining the Big 12 in 2012, good enough for a .936 win percentage, the best win percentage over a five-year span for any team in Big 12 Conference history.
- Since 2014, WVU is 21-0-2 in Big 12 Conference regular-season games. It is the longest unbeaten streak in Big 12 history.
- WVU boasts the 2016 Big 12 Coach of the Year (Nikki Izzo-Brown), Big 12 co-Offensive Player of the Year (Michaela Abam) and Big 12 Defensive Player of the Year (Kadeisha Buchanan).
- WVU sits at No. 1 in all three major polls this week for the fourth straight week.

### West Virginia vs. TCU

- WVU is 5-1-1 all-time against the Horned Frogs and 1-1 against TCU at the Big 12 Soccer Championship.

### The Last Meeting

- WVU scored three second-half goals en route to a 3-0 win at TCU on Oct. 21, at Garvey-Rosenthal Soccer Stadium. The victory was program win No. 300 and clinched the team's fifth straight Big 12 regular-season title.
- Michaela Abam broke scoreless play in the 52nd minute, and Carla Portillo and Grace Cutler added insurance goals in the 66th and 76th minutes, respectively. WVU held TCU to just three shots, with only one landing on-frame.

### The Last Meeting at the Big 12 Championship

- Goals off the bench from Leah Emaus and Michaela Abam helped push the top-seeded and No. 8-ranked Mountaineers to a 2-1 win over No. 8-seed TCU on Nov. 5, 2014, in the championship quarterfinal. Ashley Lawrence assisted on both.
- WVU finished with a 31-9 edge in shots, with the only goal allowed was a PK in the 72nd minute. Hannah Steadman made three saves, and the Mountaineers forced TCU into 10 stops.

### A Look at the Horned Frogs

- TCU rides a four-match win streak into Sunday's final, including a come-from-behind, 3-2 overtime win against No. 3-seed Baylor on Nov. 4. Down 2-0 at half, TCU scored twice in a two-minute span, and senior defender Meghan Murphy delivered the game-winner in the 98th minute.
- Junior forward Allison Ganter paces with 19 points (8 G, 3 A). Freshman Katie Lund has played in all 19 matches and shows a 1.09 GAA, allowing 15 goals and making 50 saves. She is 8-4-2 between the posts and shows three shutouts.

## The Big 12 Championship

The top eight teams based on conference results qualified for the 2016 Big 12 Soccer Championship. This marks the fourth straight season that the event is held in Kansas City. The winner of the Big 12 Championship receives the conference's automatic bid to the NCAA Tournament. WVU is seeded No. 1 for the fifth straight year.

WVU sat atop the three major polls for the first time in program history on Oct. 11. On Oct. 18, the Mountaineers ranked No. 1 in all three major polls, as well as the NCAA RPI, for the first time in program history.

We Are the Champions! (x5): With its 3-0 win at TCU on Oct. 21, the Mountaineers earned the 2016 Big 12 Conference regular-season title, their fifth straight crown. WVU has won the title each season since joining the Big 12 in 2012, and the team is the first program in Big 12 history to win five straight outright championships. Also the 2016 Big 12 preseason favorite, WVU's accomplishment marks the 10 time in Big 12 history the preseason favorite in the coaches poll also won the title. WVU owns a 35-1-3 all-time record in Big 12 play is unbeaten at Dick Dlesk Soccer Stadium.

Dating back to its days in the Big East Conference, WVU has won six straight conference regular-season crowns and 10 since its first title in 2002. WVU has won 10 regular season and championship conference titles in seven seasons and 15 since 2002.

Best of the Big 12: For the fourth straight season, WVU earned more than half of the Big 12 Conference yearly honors, as coach Nikki Izzo-Brown was named the Big 12 Coach of the Year, senior Kadeisha Buchanan was named the Big 12 Defensive Player of the Year and junior Michaela Abam was named the co-Big 12 Offensive Player of the Year.

Buchanan caps her brilliant Mountaineer career with her fourth straight defensive award. She is the second athlete in Big 12 history in any sport to earn an unshared major award four straight seasons (Zuzana Zemenova, Baylor women's tennis, 2005-08). A WVU defensive player has earned the award each year since WVU joined the Big 12 Conference in 2012.

Abam shared the Big 12 Offensive Player of the Year award with Oklahoma State's Courtney Dike. She is the second Mountaineer in four seasons to earn the honor, as Frances Silva also received the award in 2013. Izzo-Brown's honor is her fifth straight, and she is the only coach in conference history to earn three or more consecutive awards.

Additionally, six Mountaineers earned a combined seven All-Big 12 awards. Buchanan, Abam, senior Ashley Lawrence and juniors Carla Portillo and Amandine Pierre-Louis were named to the All-Big 12 First Team, while Rylee Foster was named to the All-Big 12 Second and Freshman Teams. Buchanan and Lawrence were unanimous selections, and it marked the fourth straight award for both.

WVU at the Big 12 Championship: The Mountaineers are 8-2-1 at the Big 12 Soccer Championship and claimed the crown in 2013 and 2014. WVU's run through the 2013 championship marked the only time in conference history a team posted all shutouts en route to the title.

Never seeded lower than No. 1, the Mountaineers have faced an opponent seeded better than No. 5 just once in five seasons.

WVU Makes History in 2016: The Mountaineers did something in 2016 no Big 12 Conference team had done before, as they became the first squad in Big 12 history to pitch a season shutout in league play. The last conference team to score on the Mountaineers was Texas Tech in a 1-0 defeat on Nov. 6, at the 2015 Big 12 Soccer Championship, in Kansas City, Missouri.

The WVU defense also has held each Big 12 team but Texas to two shots or less on-goal this season en route to the clean-sheet victories.

Additionally, with its 8-0 mark in conference play, WVU became the second program and third team in Big 12 history to finish league play unbeaten and untied. Nebraska previously achieved the feat in 1996 and 1999.

Since 2014, WVU is 21-0-2 in Big 12 Conference regular-season games. It is the longest unbeaten streak in Big 12 history. It also marks the first time in conference history the Big 12 regular-season champion has posted an unbeaten record in league play in three straight years.

Home Points: Big 12 or Big East, one fact has remained constant for the Mountaineers since 2009 - they do not lose home conference matches. WVU shows a 34-match unbeaten streak in conference games at Dick Dlesk Soccer Stadium and has not dropped a league contest since losing 3-2 in overtime to No. 8 Notre Dame on Oct. 2, 2009. The streak ranks No. 3 nationally. WVU is 19-0-1 in all-time home Big 12 matches.

**The Last Time Out:** A goal by Grace Cutler in the 41st minute helped support a stout defensive effort, and an insurance score in the 90th minute punched the No. 1-ranked and top-seeded Mountaineers' ticket to the 2016 Big 12 Soccer Championship final with a 2-0 victory over No. 4-seed Oklahoma on Nov. 4, at Swope Soccer Village, in Kansas City, Missouri. The Mountaineers held OU to just one first-half shot and finished with a 23-5 edge. WVU forced Kassidie Stade into three saves, while Michelle Newhouse made one save for her second clean sheet of the championship. The Mountaineers finished with a 7-5 edge in corner kicks.

**Challenging Slate:** Year after year, coach Nikki Izzo-Brown challenges the Mountaineers with one of the nation's hardest schedules, and 2016 has been no different. WVU faced one ranked opponent in six of the first seven weeks of the season, including one ranked team in each of the first five weeks, marking the first time since at least the 2005 season the Mountaineers kicked against a ranked opponent in five straight weeks.

WVU finished 5-1-1 against teams who qualified for the 2015 NCAA Tournament, including a 1-1 (2OT) draw at reigning National Champion Penn State on Aug. 19 and a 3-1 win at runner-up Duke on Sept. 9. WVU is 4-1-1 against ranked teams this season, 2-1-1 against top-10 opponents and 4-0-1 against teams from the Big Ten Conference and Atlantic Coast Conference.

WVU's 2016 slate is the seventh-toughest schedule in the NCAA through games as of Nov. 3, with the Mountaineers' past opposition showing a 0.625 win percentage. Additionally, the team's slate is the eighth-toughest schedule based on the future opposition showing a 0.625 win percentage.

**Buchanan's Brilliance:** Tabbed the Best Young Player at the 2015 FIFA Women's World Cup, center back Kadeisha Buchanan is wrapping up a successful collegiate career as one of college soccer's top talents. She anchors a WVU defense which has allowed a program-low six goals all season and posted 14 shutouts, one short of the program single-season record. Included in the shut-out mark are 10 clean sheets against Big 12 opponents, including eight in regular-season contests; this year, WVU became the first team in conference history to post a shut-out season in league play.

Buchanan has started 83 of 84 career matches. She shows six points (2 G, 2 A) on the season, including one game-winner, and owns 22 (7 G, 8 A) career points.

A three-time NSCAA All-American, Buchanan was the lone sophomore named to the first team in 2014 and was WVU's first repeat first-team honoree since 2002-03.

The four-time reigning Big 12 Defensive Player of the Year, she is the second athlete in Big 12 history in any sport to win four straight unshared major yearly awards.

A staple on the Canadian Women's National Team, she was one of 10 finalists for the 2015 Ballon d'Or Award as the FIFA Women's World Player of the Year. Buchanan also was the 2015 BMO Canadian Player of the Year.

**Lawrence Leaves No Doubt:** Senior Ashley Lawrence is one of the best attack players in the collegiate game - and she has the numbers and accolades to back up the statement. A 2015 NSCAA First Team All-American, she has started 80 of 84 career matches and ranks second on the team with 55 (14 G, 27 A) career points. Her 27 career helpers are the third-best total in program history.

A starter for the Canadian Women's National Team, Lawrence scored a goal in the 2015 FIFA Women's World Cup and assisted on the Canadian's first goal in their Bronze-medal win over Brazil at the 2016 Rio Summer Olympics.

**Mountaineers Win Bronze!** For the second straight summer, seniors Kadeisha Buchanan and Ashley Lawrence gained experience with Canada's National Team on the world's biggest stage, as the duo helped the nation claim Bronze at the 2016 Rio Summer Olympics. Lawrence earned an assist on Canada's first goal in the team's 2-1 win over Brazil in the Bronze medal game.

The first WVU women's soccer players named to an Olympic roster, Buchanan and Lawrence also were the first WVU women's soccer players named to a World Cup roster and started all five of Canada's matches at the 2015 FIFA Women's World Cup. Buchanan was named the Best Young Player, landed on the FIFA Women's World Cup Canada 2015 All-Star Squad and was featured on a Canadian commemorative stamp. Lawrence scored Canada's lone goal in a 1-1 draw against Netherland in Group A play; the score helped advance Canada to the knockout stage for only the second time in six tries.

**Hermann Hopefuls Again:** For the second straight season, defender Kadeisha Buchanan and midfielder Ashley Lawrence, both seniors, were named to the MAC Hermann Trophy Watch List. College soccer's version of the Heisman Trophy, the award represents the highest level of individual achievement in the sport.

This year's recognition is the third straight for Buchanan and the second straight for Lawrence. It is the fourth time since 2007 WVU has had two student-athletes land on the first list of the season. Nine different Mountaineers have been named to the initial Watch List 14 times since 2003. WVU also has had six semifinalists, including Buchanan and Lawrence. Buchanan was the program's first finalist in 2015 and is the only finalist to return to the list this year.

**Buchanan, Lawrence Have CLASS:** Kadeisha Buchanan and Ashley Lawrence are two of 10 finalists for the 2016 Senior CLASS Award. An acronym for Celebrating Loyalty and Achievement for Staying in School, the Senior CLASS Award focuses on the total student-athlete and encourages students to use their platform in athletics to make a positive impact as leaders in their communities.

WVU is the only school with two finalists. Four Mountaineers have been named finalists in the last three seasons. Kate Schwindel (2014) and Amanda Hill (2015) were named to the Senior CLASS Award All-America Second Team.

Nationwide fan voting will help select the winner, and fans are encouraged to vote on the Senior CLASS Award website ([www.seniorclassaward.com](http://www.seniorclassaward.com)) through November 21. Fan votes will be combined with media and Division I head coaches' votes to determine the winner. The Senior CLASS Award winners will be announced during the 2016 NCAA Men's and Women's College Cup@ championships in December.

**O Canada!** Seven Mountaineers on the 2016 roster hail from Canada: Kadeisha Buchanan (Ontario), Rylee Foster (Ontario), Ashley Lawrence (Ontario), Easter Mayi Kith (Quebec), Amandine Pierre-Louis (Quebec), Carla Portillo (Ontario) and Bianca St. Georges (Quebec).

**For Starters:** Seven Mountaineers have earned their first career starts this season - midfielders Patricia Fernandez, Vanessa Flores and Alli Magaletta, defenders Macy Stalnaker and Dalanda Ouendeno, and goalkeepers Rylee Foster and Michelle Newhouse. In total, WVU has 17 players with at least one career start to their name.

**Different 11, Same Result:** Coach Nikki Izzo-Brown has utilized 10 different starting lineups throughout the 2016 season. No matter who earns the starting nod, though, the Mountaineers have been the picture of consistency, showing an 18-1-1 record and posting 14 shutouts.

**Leading the Way:** Three Mountaineer seniors were named team captains for the 2016 season: Carly Black, Kadeisha Buchanan and Ashley Lawrence. Buchanan also was a captain in 2015. Captains are voted on by team members.

**Fast Starts:** The Mountaineers are off to one of their best starts in the program's 21-year history, as the team hit the 10-win mark in just 12 games with a 2-0 win over Oklahoma on Oct. 2. WVU then hit the 16-win mark with a 3-0 win over Oklahoma State on Oct. 28, its 18th match of the season; no Mountaineer team before has entered postseason play with 16 wins.

WVU currently shows an 18-1-1 record. The program single-season win record is 19, set in 2015.

Only the 2015 squad put together a better start, earning season win No. 10 in its 11th match played and sitting at 11-1 through 12 matches. Due to a canceled regular-season match at Baylor, that squad entered postseason play at 15-1-1.

The 2016 season marks the fourth time in program history the Mountaineers have hit the 10-win mark as of game 12. The 2002 team also showed a 10-1-1 record through 12 games played, while the 2003 squad sat at 10-2 through 12 games played.

**Just Keep Winning:** The Mountaineers extended their current win streak to 11 with a 2-0 victory over Oklahoma in the semifinals of the 2016 Big 12 Soccer Championship, on Nov. 4, in Kansas City, Missouri. WVU has not lost or tied a match since a 1-0 double-overtime defeat to No. 9 Georgetown on Sept. 18, in Morgantown. The team has not lost a match in regulation since a 2-0 defeat at eventual National Champion Penn State in the quarterfinals of the 2015 NCAA Tournament on Nov. 28, in University Park, Pennsylvania.

The longest winning streak in program history is 14, first hit in 2010. The longest unbeaten streak in program history is 20, set over the course of the 2014-15 seasons.

**Izzo-Brown Hits Benchmark:** Coach Nikki Izzo-Brown played a big role in making sure the Mountaineers' 2016 season-opening weekend was memorable, as the team's 2-0 victory over Buffalo on Aug. 21, at the Penn State Invitational, was career win No. 300 for the 21-year WVU women's soccer head coach.

Izzo-Brown's 22-year coaching record now stands at 317-107-45 (.724). Before founding the WVU women's soccer program in 1995, she spent one season at West Virginia Wesleyan in 1994. Izzo-Brown has posted a winning record in all 21 seasons with the Mountaineers.

Izzo-Brown has led WVU to 10 wins or more each year but 1999. WVU earned a program-record 19 victories in 2015.

**Sweet 300:** In just 21 seasons, the WVU women's soccer team has earned 303 program wins, an average of 14 victories per season. The Mountaineers earned program win No. 300 with a 3-0 victory at TCU on Oct. 21, 2016. All program wins have come under coach Nikki Izzo-Brown.

**Catch Us When You Can:** Four Mountaineer regular-season contests were broadcast for national audiences, and the team finished 3-0-1 in those matches. WVU opened with a 1-1 2OT draw at No. 2 PSU on Aug. 19 (Big Ten Network). The team followed with three straight victories: a 2-0 win over No. 23 OU on Oct. 2 (ESPNU), a 1-0 victory over Texas Tech on Oct. 14 (ESPNU) and a 1-0 win at Texas on Oct. 23 (FSN).

The 2016 Big 12 Soccer Championship final will be broadcast on FS1 and is the team's fifth TV match of the season. The scheduled television games are the most for WVU since the squad was featured in seven televised matches in 2009.

**Defense Back for More:** Back to anchor the Mountaineer defense for one final season is three-time NSCAA All-American and four-time reigning Big 12 Defensive Player of the Year, senior center back Kadeisha Buchanan. Under her leadership, the WVU backline has allowed just 56 opponent goals since 2013, including a program-low 11 in 2015, the same season the unit also posted a school-record 15 shutouts. WVU again is on pace to post a new program low in opponent goals, as the defense has allowed just six scores in 20 matches.

Sophomore Bianca St. Georges, the 2015 Big 12 Newcomer of the Year, also returned in 2016, as did senior Carly Black and sophomore Easter Mayi Kith. Black started 52 straight career matches prior to suffering a season-ending injury in 2015. Mayi Kith replaced her in the lineup and started the remaining 15 matches. Junior Amandine Pierre-Louis adds speed to the line this season.

Through 20 matches in 2016, the WVU defense has posted 14 shutouts, the second-best total nationally, and allowed just six opponent goals for a 0.29 GAA. Since allowing a penalty kick in a 4-1 win at Richmond on Sept. 23, WVU has posted 934:53 shut-out minutes, a program record. WVU has denied opponents a goal in 35 halves this season.

A Big 12 Conference opponent has not scored on the Mountaineers throughout the 2016 regular season and postseason, and WVU is the first team in conference history to post a shutout season in league play. No opponent has scored more than one goal on WVU in 2016. The six goals allowed are the fewest allowed in the NCAA (through games played as of Nov. 4).

Additionally, the unit has held opponents to just 45 corner-kick opportunities for a 2.25 per-game average. The WVU defense denied Purdue and Kansas a corner kick chance.

**Not Up in Here!:** As has been the theme in recent years, the Mountaineers have resembled a brick wall this season, allowing a combined 131 shots for a .046 shot percentage. Only 53 of the shots have landed on-frame. Fourteen of WVU's 18 wins have come in shutouts, including a 1-0 victory over No. 8 Clemson and a 2-0 win over No. 23 Oklahoma.

WVU is one clean sheet away from matching the program single-season record of 15, set in 2015.

**Stacking Shutouts:** Following a 1-0 double-overtime loss to No. 9 Georgetown on Sept. 18, WVU has put together an 11-match win streak, with the last 10 straight victories coming in shut-out fashion. The Mountaineers set the program and Big 12 Conference's longest shut-out streak at 10 with a 2-0 victory over Oklahoma in the semifinals of the 2016 Big 12 Soccer Championship on Nov. 4, in Kansas City. WVU previously strung together nine straight clean sheets in 2015.

All 10 shutouts in the current streak have come against Big 12 Conference opponents - eight in regular-season play and two in the postseason. WVU is the first team in conference history to post a shutout season in league play. The team held all but Texas to two or fewer shots on-goal.

WVU's shutout streak is the longest nationally since UCLA posted 10 straight clean sheets in 2014. A shutout Sunday would give the Mountaineers 11 straight, the longest streak since Boston University tallied 15 consecutive shutouts in 2010. It also would be the most for a "Power Five Conference" team since North Carolina posted 13 straight in 1989.

The NCAA shutout streak record is 16, set by Santa Clara in 1998 (Sept. 24 - Nov. 28).

**No Shots for You:** WVU has held opponents to just 131 shots through 20 games in 2016, with only 53 attempts landing on-frame. The Mountaineers denied Purdue and Baylor a shot on-goal.

WVU denied Longwood a shot in a 4-0 win on Sept. 13, 2015, marking the second time in as many seasons and the fifth time in program history that WVU denied an opponent a shot.

**Foster Finds Early Success:** Freshman goalkeeper Rylee Foster played lights out in her WVU career debut, making nine saves at No. 2 Penn State on Aug. 19 to help the Mountaineers earn a 1-1 2OT draw against the defending National Champions.

Foster is 12-1-1 on the season and shows a Big 12-best 0.29 GAA, the second-best mark nationally, and a .875 save percentage, the best mark in the Big 12 and the 11th-best in the NCAA (thru games as of Nov. 3). She has made 29 saves and is credited with six of the team's shutouts.

**Newhouse Impressive, Too:** Junior Michelle Newhouse has split time with freshman Rylee Foster in net this season and also has found success, starting six matches, the first starts of her career, and posting a 6-0 record. Included in her wins are a 3-1 victory at No. 5 Duke on Sept. 9 and a 1-0 victory at Texas on Oct. 23, where she made a career-high six saves. She earned her first career shutout with a 3-0 win vs. Princeton on Sept. 16.

Newhouse has played in 10 total matches and shows a 0.30 GAA, making 17 saves and allowing two goals.

**Goals Return:** The Mountaineers returned 59 percent of the record-setting 61 goals scored in 2015, and the team's top-returning point earner opened 2016 scoring goals, as junior forward Michaela Abam netted the team's lone score in a 1-1 (2OT) draw at No. 2 Penn State on Aug. 19. Sophomore forward Sh'Nia Gordon returned to the starting lineup after finishing 2015 tied for fourth on the team with 13 points (5 G, 3 A). Junior midfielder Carla Portillo also returned. She started 21 matches and finished with 10 points (3 G, 4 A). Both were All-Big 12 honorees in 2015.

**Abam is Awesome:** After finishing tied with graduate Kailey Utley with a team-best 12 goals in 2015, junior forward Michaela Abam is the undisputed Mountaineer offensive leader this year, as she paces the squad for a third straight season with eight goals, the third-best Big 12 total and the 11th-most scored by an individual in the NCAA this year. She ranks No. 10 in program history with 28 career goals.

Abam ranks No. 1 on the team and No. 3 in the Big 12 with 22 points (8 G, 6 A); the six helpers are a career single-season high and rank second on the team.

Abam had a tremendous start to the Big 12 season, contributing five points in WVU's 2-0 wins over Baylor on Sept. 30 and No. 23 Oklahoma on Oct. 2. She tallied the game-winner against the Bears just 3:11 into the match. Against OU, she assisted on Hannah Abraham's game-winner in the 78th minute and added an insurance goal in the 86th minute. Her point production was tops in the conference for the weekend, and for her efforts she earned Big 12 Offensive Player of the Week accolades.

For her efforts all season, Abam was named the co-Big 12 Offensive Player of the Year, sharing the award with Oklahoma State's Courtney Dike. She is the second Mountaineer in four seasons to earn the honor.

**Attack Comes from All Directions:** Junior midfielder Carla Portillo is enjoying a career season. She ranks second on the team with 16 points (5 G, 6 A). Her points, goals and assists totals are all career single-season bests.

New to the starting rotation this season is junior forward Heather Kaleiohi. Though she missed two early matches, she ranks fourth on the team with 12 points, including a career-high five goals and two game-winners.

Back again up top is sophomore Sh'Nia Gordon. She has come on strong as of late, scoring one goal in each of the last three matches, and ranks third on the team with 14 points (6 G, 2 A), including two of the team's last three game-winning goals. Gordon has started all 43 career matches and shows 27 (11 G, 5 A) career points.

Playing off the bench, sophomore forwards Hannah Abraham and Grace Cutler have added energy sparks to the Mountaineers' offensive attack. The duo ranks sixth on the team with nine points each; both Abraham and Cutler have scored four goals and chipped in one assist.

All four of Abraham's scores have been game-winners, the third-best mark in the Big 12 Conference. Cutler tallied her first game-winner in a WVU uniform with a goal in the 41st minute in the Mountaineers' 2-0 victory over Oklahoma on Nov. 4, in the Big 12 Soccer Championship semifinal.

**Lawrence Dishes Out Assists:** Senior midfielder Ashley Lawrence helps drive the Mountaineer offense. An NSCAA All-America First Team honoree one year ago, she has dished out a team-best eight helpers this season and ranks No. 3 on the WVU all-time career assists lists with 27. She needs six more to match the program career record of 33, set by associate head coach Lisa Stoia.

The 27 assists rank No. 8 on the NCAA active career leaders list. Additionally, Lawrence's 0.33 assists/game career average ranks No. 21 on the NCAA active career leaders list.

**Double the Fun:** Two Mountaineers have netted at least two goals in one game this season: sophomore forward Sh'Nia Gordon (2 vs. Saint Francis, Aug. 28) and junior forward Michaela Abam (2 at No. 5 Duke, Sept. 9).

Since 2010, WVU has had 24 instances where one Mountaineer has netted at least two goals in one game, including seven two-goal performances in 2014, the program's best single-season total in that time frame. The WVU single-game goal record is four, hit by Abam in the Mountaineers' record-setting 8-0 win vs. Villanova on Sept. 6, 2015.

**Morgantown Magic:** The Mountaineers have developed a true home field advantage, going 116-18-13 at Dick Dlesk Soccer Stadium since its opening in August 2004.

WVU recently put its name in the NCAA Record Book, as the Mountaineers went unbeaten in 30 straight home matches, not losing a contest at DDSS from Aug. 30, 2014 - Sept. 16, 2016. The streak ranks No. 11 all-time in NCAA women's soccer history. The streak was snapped with a 1-0 (2OT) loss to No. 9 Georgetown on Sept. 18, 2016.

The Mountaineers have played in front of more than 16,000 fans through 10 home games this season and have set six top-10 attendance marks. A season-high 2,068 fans were on hand to cheer the Mountaineers to a 1-0 win over Texas Tech on Oct. 14. The crowd was the second-largest women's crowd in stadium history and the program's top regular-season attendance mark. Through games played as of Oct. 30, WVU ranks No. 7 nationally in accumulate attendance (16,595) and No. 8 in average attendance (1,660). Both numbers are tops in the Big 12 Conference.

The Mountaineer attendance record is 3,000+, set on Nov. 30, 2007, in the team's 1-0 loss to USC in the quarterfinals of the NCAA Tournament. Over the last seven seasons, more than 70,000 fans have packed the stands to make Dick Dlesk Soccer Stadium one of the toughest environments in the Big 12.

**Seniors' Last Stand:** The 2016 Mountaineer senior class has earned six conference titles during its time at WVU, the second-best total in the program's 21-year history. They show a four-year record of 69-10-9, 28-1-2 in the Big 12.

This year's senior class – Carly Black, Kadeisha Buchanan, Ashley Lawrence and Ashley Woolpert – has won four straight Big 12 regular-season crowns and the 2013 and 2014 Big 12 Soccer Championship titles. The program record for conference titles won by one class is seven, set by the 2014 senior class.

**New Faces:** Six student-athletes donned the Gold and Blue for the first time in 2016: transfers Grace Cutler (forward, Santa Clara) and Alli Magaletta (midfielder, Missouri), as well as freshmen Amanda Burns (midfielder), Rylee Foster (goalkeeper), Jade Gentile (midfielder/forward) and Brooke Myers (goalkeeper).

**Nice to Meet You:** WVU's 2016 regular-season schedule featured just one first-time opponent in Clemson. The Mountaineers defeated the No. 8 Tigers, 1-0, on Aug. 26, in their home season opener at Dick Dlesk Soccer Stadium.

In the program's 21-year history, WVU has faced 107 different teams.

**Power of Pink:** Raising awareness for breast cancer research is a cause close to coach Nikki Izzo-Brown, and each year, she and the Mountaineers raise funds for Morgantown's Betty Puskar Breast Care Center. WVU donated a check for \$5,025 at halftime of the WVU-OU match on October 2.

WVU passed the \$100,000 threshold in 2013. In 12 years, the Mountaineers have raised more than \$120,000 for breast cancer research.

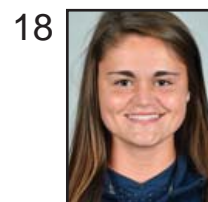

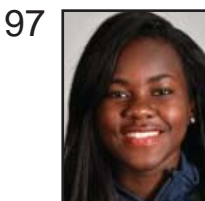
