West Virginia head coach Mike Carey

On today's game against No. 22 Oklahoma State

I thought the three seniors played well. Bria (Holmes) without a doubt stepped up and played well, and Tynice Martin, too. We were hitting our shots tonight. It was a total team effort. I'm very proud of our team. That's a good team there. That team's 10-7 in the league and 28 overall. That's a good team, and they put it to us at their place.
