Kyle Davis • Sophomore • Second Base / Left Field • Cincinnati, Ohio

Sophomore Kyle Davis hit his career-best sixth home run of the season in Wednesday's 9-8 win over Marshall. He has hit three homers in the last two weeks, with one against Kansas State and one at Oklahoma.

Davis is tied for second on the team with 22 RBIs and third with 34 hits.

In the series finale at Baylor last year, Davis had three RBIs and two hits to lead WVU to an 8-2 win.

BY THE NUMBERS

1997 WVU swept the season series against Marshall, with a 5-4 win on April 5 and a 9-8 win on Wednesday. It's the first series sweep in the rivalry for either team since 1997.

The Mountaineers are 2-0 at home all-time against Baylor. In 2014, WVU **2-0** notched an 8-7 win in the opener before a 4-1 victory in the finale in Charleston, West Virginia.

8.0 Last year at Baylor, right-hander Chad Donato led WVU to an 8-2 win thanks to 8.0 innings of stellar work on the mound. Donato allowed two runs on five hits while striking out two and not issuing a walk.

WVU Hosts Big 12 Foe Baylor

The West Virginia University baseball team welcomes Baylor to Monongalia County Ballpark for the first time for a weekend series from April 29-May 1.

The series begins on Friday, April 29, at 6:30 p.m. ET, while first pitch on Saturday is set for 4 p.m. The series finale, on Sunday, May 1, will begin at 1 p.m.

Friday, there will be postgame fireworks, presented by United Bank, and the national-champion WVU rifle team will be honored throughout the game.

Saturday is Family Day, where fans can purchase four tickets and get a \$10 concession voucher for just \$25. Before the game, the WVU men's basketball team will host Hoops 'n Home Runs. The tailgate will take place in the parking lot outside the center field fence and begin at 2 p.m. Food and beverages will be available, and fans will receive a voucher for \$2 off their ticket to the game.

Sunday is Kids' Day and Faculty/Staff Appreciation Day. WVU faculty and staff can get a ticket for just \$3 with their ID. Following the game, kids will have the opportunity to run the bases and get autographs from their favorite players.

The Mountaineers (21-18) are 6-8 in Big 12 play and fifth in the league standings, while the Bears (19-22) are seventh in the league with a 5-10 league record. Since joining the conference in 2013, WVU is 4-5 against Baylor, but 2-0 at home after a pair of wins in 2014 in Charleston.

WVU will open the weekend with junior right-hander Chad Donato (1-3, 3.39 ERA) on the mound. Senior left-hander Ross Vance (4-3, 5.57 ERA) will start on Saturday, while freshman righty Michael Grove (1-2, 2.88 ERA) makes his weekend starting debut on Sunday.

Donato will go up against junior right-hander Drew Tolson (4-2, 4.90 ERA), while Vance is set to face junior lefty Daniel Castano (2-4, 4.48 ERA). Grove will toe the rubber against fellow freshman righty Andrew McInvale (2-2, 4.85).

Last Time Out: Marshall Sweep

West Virginia is coming off a 9-8 victory over Marshall on Wednesday afternoon at Monongalia County Ballpark to sweep the season series against the Thundering Herd.

- The Mountaineers used a five-run seventh inning to secure the first series sweep in the in-state rivalry by either team since 1997. The one-run contest was the fourth consecutive in the series and the fifth in the last five games between WVU and MU.
- WVU scored nine runs on 13 hits, while Marshall, who nearly came back with a five-run eighth inning, tallied eight runs on 11 hits.
- Junior Jackson Cramer paced the Mountaineer offense with three hits and four RBIs, including the eventual game-winner in the seventh. Freshman Ivan Vera had two hits and two RBIs, while sophomore Kyle Davis added a three-run home run, his sixth long ball of the season.
- Eight of the Mountaineers' nine starters had at least one hit and six either drove in a run, scored a run or both.
- Sophomore right-hander BJ Myers (5-3) earned the win after pitching 4.0 innings in relief. He allowed three runs on five hits with three strikeouts and three walks.
- West Virginia took a 3-0 lead early, but Marshall answered to tie the game at 3-3. The Mountaineers regained the advantage at 4-3 before a five-run seventh inning to give WVU a 9-3 lead. But the Thundering Herd answered the following inning with five runs of their own to cut the deficit to one at 9-8.
- That's when senior righty Blake Smith came in to get the final five outs of the game. In 1.2 innings, Smith struck out three and earned his fifth save of the year.

WVU came back to tie the game in the sixth inning, but fell to Baylor in the opener, 5-4.

- Both teams committed three errors, and all two Baylor runs were unearned and all but one WVU run was unearned
- West Virginia fell behind 4-0 after two innings, but a three-run sixth tied the game at 4-4 before Baylor scored one in the bottom half to regain the lead
- Current Mountaineer KC Huth was one of three players with two hits

Scouting Baylor

Baylor enters the weekend with a 19-22 record and a 5-10 mark in Big 12 play. The Bears are 14-14 at home and 5-8 on the road.

- Baylor coming off an 8-7 win over Incarnate Word on Wednesday. The Bears scored in six consecutive innings before Incarnate Word scored five in the eighth to tie the game at 7-7. Steven McLean hit a two-out, walk-off single in the bottom of the ninth to win it.
- Last weekend, BU suffered a series loss at Kansas State. Baylor won the opener, 7-5 in 10 innings, before K-State prevailed 11-7 on Saturday and 10-4 on Sunday.
- Baylor comes to Morgantown having lost six of its last eight, which began with a sweep by Oklahoma State at home.

The Bears are led by Steve Rodriguez, in his first season as head coach. He owns a 19-22 record in Waco, Texas and a 305-320 mark in his 13-year career as head coach. He comes from Pepperdine, where he is the second-winningest coach in program history.

History vs. the Bears

West Virginia is 4-5 all-time against Baylor, including a perfect 2-0 mark at home.

- WVU and BU first met in 2013, the Mountaineers' first season in the Big 12. West Virginia won the opener, 9-8, before Baylor won the final two games, 8-0 and 11-1, in Waco, Texas.
- In 2014, WVU won both games in Charleston, West Virginia. The Mountaineers opened with an 8-7, 12-inning win on a walk-off double by Jackson Cramer. After Saturday's game was cancelled, back-to-back home runs by Ryan McBroom and Jacob Rice helped propel WVU to a 4-1 victory in the series finale.
- Last year, BU claimed two of three at home. After a 5-4 loss in the opener and a 10-4 defeat on Saturday, WVU won the finale, 8-2. Chad Donato earned the win with 8.0 innings of work, allowing two runs on five hits with two strikeouts and no walks. Kyle Davis and Ray Guerrini each drove in three runs, and Davis was one of three Mountaineers with two hits. Guerrini hit his second homer of the season.

Grove Honored by Big 12, WVU

Following a stellar outing at Oklahoma, freshman Michael Grove was named the Big 12 Newcomer of the Week and the WVU Student-Athlete of the Week on April 25.

- In the 12-7 victory at Oklahoma, Grove entered in the first inning and pitched a career-long 8.1 innings in relief. He allowed just four hits with a career-best 13 strikeouts and two walks.
- The Wheeling, West Virginia, native earned his first career victory as he allowed the WVU offense to climb back into the game after trailing 7-2.
- After OU scored seven runs on seven hits in the first inning, Grove came in with two outs and shut down the OU offense, holding the Sooners to a .154 batting average and just one Oklahoma batter reached second base safely the rest of the game.
- Grove is the fifth Mountaineer to earn a Big 12 weekly award this season. It marks the first time more than four WVU players were recognized in a season and the second-most Big 12 honors for the Mountaineers since they joined the Big 12 for the 2013 season, behind the six accolades earned in 2014. It is Grove's first weekly award of his career.
- Grove is the fourth baseball player to be named the WVU Student-Athlete of the Week in 2016.

Gray Named Newcomer of the Week

After leading the team with a .750 slugging percentage and six hits in four games, freshman Kyle Gray was named the Big 12 Freshman of the Week on April 11.

- Along with his team-best slugging percentage and six hits, Gray was second on the team with a .500 average and a .625 on-base percentage. He added two extra-base hits and four walks.
- Gray reached base safely in six consecutive at-bats in two games.
- Playing just two of the three games against Furman, he recorded five hits and two RBIs with two walks and seven total bases for a team-best .625 average and a .875 slugging percentage.
- Gray is the fourth WVU player to earn a Big 12 weekly honor in 2016, joining Players of the Week Jackson Cramer and KC Huth and Pitcher of the Week BJ Myers.

Upset Wins over No. 16 Oklahoma St.

WVU earned a series win vs. No. 16 Oklahoma State, with a dramatic 5-4 walk-off victory in the 10th inning in the opener before a 4-3 win on April 2. OSU avoided the sweep and claimed the series finale, 8-1.

- In the series opener on April 1, junior Jackson Cramer belted a walk-off home run in the 10th inning to give WVU a 5-4 upset victory over No. 16 Oklahoma State. Cramer hit the first pitch of the bottom of the 10th inning over the center field fence. The home run came after a roller coaster

ninth inning. The Mountaineers were one out away from a 3-1 win, but the Cowboys took their only lead of the day on a three-run homer. WVU bounced right back though to tie it at 4-4 in the ninth. With two outs, freshman pinch hitter Marques Inman singled to right field to score freshman Jimmy Galusky from second.

- On April 2, senior lefty Ross Vance and back-to-back home runs led WVU to a 4-3 victory over the Cowboys. The Mountaineers won the series over the Cowboys as Vance threw 7.1 innings of four-hit, three-run ball to earn his team-high-tying fourth win. Vance was backed up by back-to-back home runs in the seventh inning by senior center fielder KC Huth and freshman right fielder Darius Hill. Hill had two RBIs on the day. Cramer added three hits and an RBI.

Cramer the Big 12 Player of the Week

WVU junior first baseman Jackson Cramer was named the Big 12 Baseball Co-Player of the Week on April 4. Cramer hit two home runs, including the walk-off winner in the 10th inning, to fuel WVU's upset of No. 16 Oklahoma State on April 1.

- In WVU's 5-4 series-opening victory against OSU on April 1, Cramer homered in the sixth before hitting the game-winning shot in the 10th on a first-pitch offering. The walk-off came after OSU took its first lead of the game with three runs in the ninth inning. His home runs were his team-leading fourth and fifth of the season.
- In the weekend series against the Cowboys, the Coppell, Texas, native hit .556 with a 1.33 slugging percentage and a .692 on-base percentage with five hits, three RBI, 12 total bases and three walks.
- Cramer has reached base in a Big 12-best 45 consecutive games after three hits on April 2 and a pair of walks on April 3.

Mazey is WVU's Newest Mr. 100

Coach Randy Mazey won his 100th game at WVU in the Mountaineers' 11-6 victory at Kansas on Saturday. Mazey is the fifth coach in program history to eclipse the 100-win mark and the second to accomplish the feat in his first four seasons.

- Mazey joins Ira Errett Rodgers (1921-42, 46), Steve Harrick (1948-67), Dale Ramsburgh (1968-94) and Greg Van Zant (1995-2012) with at least 100 wins at WVU.
- Along with Mazey, only Van Zant won his 100th game in his fourth season. Harrick won his 100 game in his eighth, and Rodgers and Ramsburgh reached the milestone in their ninth seasons at WVU.
- In his career, Mazey owns a 295-257-2 record, six wins shy of reaching 300 in his career. Mazey is 109-97 at WVU.

Hardy Garners WVU Honor

After a career-best outing in WVU's 11-6 victory at Kansas on March 26, senior Jeff Hardy was named the WVU Student-Athlete of the Week on March 28.

- Hardy came in and got the final 11 outs of the game to earn his first career save. He entered the game in the sixth inning and allowed no runs on just two hits with a career-best six strikeouts and no walks the

remainder of the game.

- Hardy shut down a Kansas offense that had scored six runs on 11 hits in the first 5.1 innings. As Kansas' offensive attack had cut WVU's lead to one at 7-6, Hardy prevented the Jayhawks from getting any closer as the WVU offense extended its lead in the final three innings.

Comeback for a Walkoff

With the help of five comebacks and a walk-off hit in the 12th inning, West Virginia won its home-opening series vs. Old Dominion. WVU prevailed 4-3 in the March 11 opener before a doubleheader on Saturday, beginning with a 10-inning, 5-4, loss and concluding with a 12-inning, 6-5, victory. WVU trailed but came back in the sixth inning on Friday, in the first and ninth innings in March 12th's opener and in the ninth and 12th innings in the finale.

- WVU's 4-3 win on March 11 came thanks to junior catcher Ray Guerrini, who executed a squeeze bunt that scored two in the eighth inning. The Mountaineers trailed 2-0 early, but with the help of five errors in the final three innings, WVU came back to beat ODU with three unearned runs. West Virginia tied the score at 2-2 in the sixth inning before Guerrini drove in the two runs, including the game-winner, in the bottom of the eighth. Sophomore right-hander Conner Dotson earned his third win of the season with 1.2 scoreless innings in relief, allowing just two hits.
- In the first game of the March 12 doubleheader, WVU came back for the second consecutive day. West Virginia trailed 4-1 in the ninth inning but stormed back with three runs in the bottom half to tie the game. Old Dominion then answered with the winning run in the 10th inning.
- Just 30 minutes later though in game two, the Mountaineers bounced back for a 6-5, 12-inning win. Freshman shortstop Jimmy Galusky's two-RBI, game-winning single in the 12th inning was the second time WVU came back in the game, after scoring one in the ninth to send the contest into extra innings. ODU held a 4-3 lead in the ninth before sophomore designated hitter Kyle Davis drove in Galusky, the game-tying run, in the ninth. Galusky's game-winner in the bottom of the 12th came after ODU took a 5-4 lead in the top of the 12th.

- The game is believed to be the first in program history against an MLB club.
- The seven-inning exhibition contest at Salt River Fields at Talking Stick, Arizona's Spring Training home ballpark, featured a mix of Major League and Minor League talent for the Diamondbacks. The majority of WVU's roster also saw playing time in the game.
- While official stats were not recorded, WVU totaled four runs on six hits, while the Diamondbacks had seven runs on 13 hits with two errors.
- Junior catcher Ray Guerrini reached base three times, with a hit and two walks, while freshman second baseman Cole Austin and sophomore left fielder Caleb Potter reached base twice, each with a hit and a walk. Senior center fielder KC Huth and freshmen pinch hitters Kyle Gray and Marques Inman also recorded hits.
- RBIs were credited to Potter, driving in Austin in the first, Austin, plating Huth in the fourth and Inman, who doubled home Guerrini in the fifth. WVU also scored in the third inning, when sophomore third baseman Kyle Davis came home on a bases-loaded wild pitch.

Off to a Hot Start

With a 5-1 record to open the season and winning five consecutive games, West Virginia got off to one of the best starts in program history.

- It is the best start to the season since 2006, when WVU also started the year 5-1.
- WVU's five straight wins all came in road games. The last time the Mountaineers won five or more consecutive true road games was 2004, when they won six in a row in a stretch separated by a homestand. In 2014, WVU won six in a row away from home, with three coming in neutral site contests.
- The Mountaineers got off to their best start to the season under fourth-year head coach Randy Mazey. In 2013, Mazey's first season, and 2015, it took WVU 11 games to record its fifth win and it took nine games in 2014.

Huth Named Player of the Week

Senior center fielder KC Huth was named the Big 12 Player of the Week on Feb. 29, the second consecutive week to open the year that WVU has earned a conference accolade.

- Huth led the WVU offense in its sweep at UNLV, hitting .636 (7-11) with a 1.182 slugging percentage. He hit his first two home runs of the season and had four RBIs, a walk and 13 total bases while stealing two bases on two attempts. In the field, Huth added six putouts without an error.
- Friday, Huth went 1-3 and scored the eventual winning run in the ninth inning after a leadoff walk.
- Saturday, he led WVU with three hits and two runs and added two RBIs. He hit his first home run of the season, a leadoff shot in the eighth inning that hit off the scoreboard beyond the left field fence and jumpstarted a five run inning.
- Sunday, Huth went 3-4 with a two run home run, and a team-high-tying two RBIs with two runs scored. His home run opened the scoring for WVU in the second inning.

Myers Named Pitcher of the Week

Sophomore righty BJ Myers was named the Big 12 Conference Pitcher of the Week on Feb. 22

- Myers pitched eight shutout innings in WVU's 3-0 win at Charleston Southern on Feb. 21. The win helped the Mountaineers to a season-opening series win.
- A Flower Mound, Texas, native, Myers allowed no runs on five hits in eight innings. He struck out five and walked just one. CSU hit into three double plays as Myers faced 26 batters, just two over the minimum in his eight innings. With runners on base, Charleston Southern was 0-6.
- Myers faced more than three batters in just two innings – the first and fifth.

Pitching for the Ages

WVU's pitching put on an impressive display in its three game series to open the year at Charleston Southern.

- WVU recorded back-to-back shutouts, with a 5-0 win on Saturday and a 3-0 victory on Sunday. The last time WVU shut out an opponent in consecutive games was 2007, a double-header shutouts of Copin State, 10-0 and 12-0 on April 3.
- The Mountaineers allowed just two earned runs all series and four runs total, all on Friday. WVU held CSU scoreless for the final 19 innings of the series.
- West Virginia held CSU to a .195 batting average.
- The WVU pitching staff had an ERA of 0.69, No. 1 in the Big 12 and sixth nationally.
- WVU is one of just seven teams in the country with two shutouts to open the year.



Mountaineers in the Pros

Fourteen former West Virginia baseball players are on active rosters to begin the 2016 season. Jedd Gyorko is representing WVU in the majors with the St. Louis Cardinals, while nine players are in the minor leagues. Another two are in extended spring training, one is in the Independent League and another, Dustin Nippert, is playing in the Korean Baseball Organization.

Davis Named Preseason All-America

Coming off a standout freshman season, sophomore infielder Kyle Davis was named to the National Collegiate Baseball Writers Association Preseason All-America Third Team.

- A three-time Freshman All-American last season, Davis earned the preseason honor as the team's third designated hitter.
- As a freshman, Davis led WVU with a .353 batting average and 17 doubles. He had four home runs, 31 RBIs and one triple. Davis ranked third in the Big 12 Conference in batting and in doubles, fifth in hits and total bases and eighth in slugging percentage.
- Davis earned three All-America honors last season: Baseball America's 2015 Freshman All-America Team, NCBWA Freshman All-American First Team and Louisville Slugger Freshman All-America First Team as selected by Collegiate Baseball newspaper.
- A Cincinnati native, Davis also was named to the All-Big 12 Second Team and the All-Big 12 Rookie Team.

The Return of the Arms

- The Mountaineers return 11 of 16 pitchers from last year's roster. Twenty-six of 27 wins and 435.1 of 482.2 innings pitched return from last season.
- The five pitchers lost from last year's roster combined for two starts and 47.1 of 482.2 innings pitched in 2015.
- Headlining the returning pitchers is senior Ross Vance and junior Chad Donato, who made 15 and 14 starts, respectively, in 2015 and won seven games each. Additionally, closer BJ Myers returns for his senior season after posting a 4-1 mark with five saves a year ago.
- WVU adds seven freshmen arms to the 2016 pitching staff.

Plenty of Bats and Gloves are Back

- In the field and at the plate, six of nine starters return from 2015, while eight of WVU's 15 position players return in 2016.
- Sophomore infielder Kyle Davis (.353) and junior first baseman Jackson Cramer (.291) posted the team's highest batting averages a year ago and each started at least 50 games. Davis led the team in hits (79), doubles (17) and tied for the team lead in RBIs (31), while Cramer had a team-best .520 slugging percentage, was first on the team in walks (27) and second in hits (52), doubles (15) and home runs (8).
- Senior outfielder KC Huth and junior outfielder Shaun Wood each return at least 50 starts from a year ago.

WVU Sixth in Big 12 Preseason Poll

- WVU was voted to finish sixth in the 2016 Big 12 baseball coaches' preseason poll. It is the second consecutive season the Mountaineers were voted sixth after WVU was predicted to finish in seventh place in 2014 and last in 2013, the team's inaugural Big 12 season. West Virginia garnered 26 points, the most in its four years in the league.
- Just four points separate the three top teams. TCU tops the poll with 57 points, while Oklahoma State is second with 55 and Texas sits third with 53. All three teams earned three first-place votes, marking the first time in conference preseason poll history that three or more teams have received multiple first-place votes.
- The two-point separation between No. 1 TCU and No. 2 Oklahoma State is the closest in preseason history, along with the 2011 poll, which separated Oklahoma and Texas by two points.

- After moving into Monongalia County Ballpark midway through the 2015 season, the Mountaineers look forward to their first full season in their new ballpark in 2016. With new team facilities, the opportunity to practice full-time at the ballpark for the first time and increased fan support, the ballpark is a true home field advantage.
- The new ballpark features a clubhouse, team lounge, athletic training room and team theater that opened this fall.
- Monongalia County Ballpark was named the BaseballParks.com Ballpark of the Year for 2015. The annual award recognizes a new or remodeled stadium with the best combination of site selection, exterior appearance, architectural design and fan amenities. Many also have given Monongalia County Ballpark the unofficial title as “The Best View in College Baseball.”

Rose, Sell-Out Highlight Leadoff Dinner

- Fans showed they were ready for the season in record numbers as a sold-out crowd of more than 800 fans helped kick off the 2016 season at the fourth annual WVU Baseball Leadoff Dinner on Jan. 30.
- Featuring guest speaker Pete Rose, attendance more than doubled last year’s crowd, as attendance and interest in the annual event has continued to rise.
- In addition to speaking with the crowd at the evening’s dinner, Rose spoke with the WVU baseball team about his career, what made him so successful on the field and his advice for the team this season. Rose is the all-time Major League Baseball leader in hits with 4,256, won three World Series in his 24-year playing career and was a 17-time All-Star.

Schedule Provides Plenty of Highlights

- The Mountaineers’ 56-game schedule is highlighted by 30 home games at Monongalia County Ballpark and an 11-day roadtrip with three games at UNLV, an exhibition against the Arizona Diamondbacks and a four-game series at Hawaii.
- Thirty home games are on the 2016 schedule, the most since WVU played 32 home contests in 2008.
- WVU will play a total of 13 games against teams that made the 2015 NCAA Tournament, including 10 of those games at home. WVU also will play nine games against four teams that were conference champions a year ago.
- The 30-game home schedule includes games against reigning Big 12 Tournament champion, Texas, as well as Oklahoma State, Baylor, Kansas State, Marshall, Pitt, Maryland and Virginia Tech. All but six home games, and every Big 12 game, will be played in April and May.
- Opening day for the second season at

Monongalia County Ballpark is set of Friday, March 11 vs. Old Dominion and the Big 12 opener against Oklahoma State will be on Friday, April 1. The home slate also includes a nine-game homestand from April 6-19 and a 12-game homestand from April 26-May 15.

- The 26-game road schedule features series at 2015 College World Series participant TCU, and games at UNLV and Hawaii, along with games vs. Marshall in Charleston and at Pitt and Penn State. WVU also will play an exhibition contest against the Arizona Diamondbacks.
