No. 19/18 West Virginia Closes Out 2015 at Virginia Tech

- West Virginia is 78-52 all-time in games played in the Commonwealth of Virginia.
- WVU has won 13 of its last 17 games against teams from the Atlantic Coast Conference.
- Eighty-nine of Bob Huggins' 185 West Virginia victories have been away from the WVU Coliseum.
- WVU has won 126 of its last 154 games against unranked teams, including 65 of its last 73 at the WVU Coliseum.
- The Mountaineers have won 64 of their last 78 games in the month of December.
- Devin Williams started the season with five consecutive double-doubles. The last WVU player to start the season with five straight double-doubles was Rod Thorn in 1960-61. Williams ranks 11th nationally in double-doubles.
- WVU won the Continental Tire Las Vegas Invitational with wins over Richmond and San Diego State. Devin Williams was named tournament MVP, and Jevon Carter and Daxter Miles Jr. were named to the all-tournament team.
- WVU leads the country in steals, 3-point field goal percentage defense, forced turnovers and offensive rebounds per game. WVU is forcing its opponents to turn it over on 29.3 percent of their possessions. WVU is averaging 29.0 points per game off turnovers and 22.3 points per game from second chance points.
- WVU has forced 30 or more turnovers in three games this season. No other team has forced an opponent to have more than 30 turnovers in a game this season other than WVU. WVU has had at least seven steals in every game.
- WVU is holding its opponents to 0.81 points per possession, the second lowest rate in the country behind Purdue (0.80).
- WVU has only trailed for 45:12 out of a possible 440 minutes this season. Five of WVU's 11 opponents have not held a single lead against the Mountaineers.
- The Mountaineers have been ranked 48 weeks in the AP poll under Bob Huggins, including 18 weeks in the AP Top 10.
- Only Fred Schaus (1954-60) had WVU ranked more weeks in the AP Top 25 (60 weeks).
- West Virginia is 89-24 in non-conference regular season games under Bob Huggins, including a 48-4 mark at home.
- West Virginia is 120-30 against non-conference teams in regular season games in the last 12 seasons.
- Bob Huggins has made 21 Division I NCAA Tourney appearances. Only four active coaches have made more appearances.
- Bob Huggins was named the Big 12 Conference Coach of the Year in 2014-15. Huggins has won conference coach of the year honors 11 times in his 33 years as a head coach and won the Jim Phelan National Coach of the Year award in 2015. He has won national coach of the year honors six times.
- Devin Williams earned All-Big 12 Honorable Mention honors, while Jevon Carter was named to the All-Defensive Team.
- With 775 career wins, Bob Huggins is in 13th place on the NCAA Division I all-time winningest coaches list. Huggins' record now stands at 775-313 in his 34th season as a head coach. He needs four wins to tie Lou Henson for 12th.
- Bob Huggins is the fourth-winningest active Division I coach behind Mike Krzyzewski, Jim Boeheim and Cliff Ellis.
- West Virginia was 21-0 last season when holding its opponents to 69 points or less and is 9-0 this season.
- WVU led the nation in steals (376), steals per game (10.2), forced turnovers (678) and offensive rebounds (16.3) last season. WVU never led in any category in the final NCAA statistics in school history until the 2014-15 season.
- WVU outrebounded its opponents on the offensive glass 575 to 312 last season.
- The Mountaineers took 512 more shots (14.6 per game) than their opponents last season (2,138 to 1,626).
- WVU had seven or more steals in all but three games, and WVU opponents had 20 or more turnovers 16 times.
- West Virginia has made at least one 3-point field goal in 534 consecutive games.
- Devin Williams shows 23 double-doubles for his career. He has 26 career double-figure rebounding performances.
- Williams was one of 20 players named to the preseason Kareem Abdul-Jabbar Watch List.
- West Virginia has allowed its opponent to shoot 50 percent or better only 49 times under Bob Huggins (287 games).
- WVU is 151-29 under Bob Huggins when holding opponents to 69 points or less. WVU has won 40 of its last 41 and 96 of its last 106 games when holding opponents under 69 points.
- West Virginia is 50-3 under Bob Huggins when shooting 50 percent or better from the field.
- West Virginia is 143-26 under Bob Huggins when leading at halftime.
- West Virginia is 149-16 under Bob Huggins when leading by 10 or more points in a game.
- West Virginia is 127-9 under Bob Huggins when posting a higher shooting percentage than its opponent.
- The Mountaineers are 132-23 under Bob Huggins when scoring 70 or more points in a game.
- West Virginia is 136-30 under Bob Huggins when outrebounding its opponent.
- WVU is 20-13 all-time on Dec. 30 and 380-159 all-time in the month of December.

Bob Huggins

- Huggins is WVU's 21st head basketball coach.
- Huggins is a Morgantown native and a 1977 graduate of West Virginia University.
- Huggins has won 775 games in 34 seasons as a head coach.
- Huggins ranks fourth in total victories among active Division I head coaches.
- Huggins ranks 20th in winning percentage (.710) among active Division I head coaches.
- Huggins' teams have participated in postseason play in 29 of his 33 seasons, including 21 NCAA Tournaments.
- His squads have won 20 or more games in all but seven of his 33 campaigns, including 30 or more twice.
- Huggins averages 23.3 victories a season.
- Huggins has made two NCAA Final Fours and four NCAA Elite Eight appearances.
- Huggins has been named national coach of the year six times.
- Huggins' teams have finished in the Top 10 final rankings eight times.
- Huggins has coached 12 All-Americans and 62 all-conference selections.
- Huggins has coached 18 NBA draft picks, including six first round selections and four lottery picks.
- Huggins has won 13 conference regular season titles.
- Huggins has won 10 conference tournament titles.
- Huggins ranks 13th among the NCAA's all-time winningest coaches.

Scouting Virginia Tech

- Virginia Tech is 8-4 overall following a 79-62 loss to Saint Joseph's on Dec. 22 in Brooklyn, N.Y.
- The Hokies are 6-2 at home this season, 1-0 on the road and 1-2 on neutral courts.
- Buzz Williams, a 1994 graduate of Oklahoma City, is 19-26 in his second season at Tech. He is 172-112 overall.

Series Record Against Virginia Tech

- West Virginia and Virginia Tech will meet for the 79th time in series play that dates back to 1921.
- The Mountaineers have won eight of the last 12 meetings, but the Hokies have won four of the last seven meetings.
- This is the fourth meeting in as many years between the two schools. Last year, WVU won 82-51 in Morgantown. At Virginia Tech in 2013, the Mountaineers led by 17 points in the first half, but fell to the Hokies, 87-82.
- The two teams had met every season from 1968-69 to 2003-04 until Tech joined the Atlantic Coast Conference. WVU and Tech were members of the Big East from 2000-03.
- WVU is 12-17 against Tech in Blacksburg. WVU's last win at Tech was on Feb. 14, 2001 (72-69). WVU is 9-17 at Cassell Col.
- Bob Huggins is 5-3 against Virginia Tech (3-2 at Cincinnati and 2-1 at WVU).
- Huggins had a career-high 28 points against Virginia Tech, a 74-73 WVU victory on Dec. 1, 1976, at the WVU Coliseum.

WVU Basketball Tradition

- This is the 107th season and 113th year overall for West Virginia basketball, which began in 1903.
- The Mountaineers own a 1,686-1,051 all-time record in intercollegiate basketball competition, ranking the Mountaineers 23rd among all Division I schools.
- WVU has earned 26 NCAA berths and 16 NIT trips since 1941, and has finished in the Top 25 18 times, including an amazing nine straight years from 1955-63.
- In the past 11 years, WVU has reached the NCAA Sweet 16 in 2015, NIT First Round in 2014, NCAA Second Round in 2012, NCAA Third Round in 2011, the NCAA Final Four in 2010, made the NCAA Tournament in 2009, reached the NCAA Sweet 16 in 2008, won the NIT in 2007, reached the NCAA Sweet 16 in 2006 and made it to the NCAA Elite Eight in 2005.
- In 1958, the Mountaineers finished the regular season ranked No. 1 in both polls and in 1959, West Virginia, led by All-America guard Jerry West, lost in the NCAA finals to California.
- West Virginia has had 11 first team All-Americans, headlined by West, who went on to become one of basketball's all-time greats with the NBA's Los Angeles Lakers.
- Most recently, Juwan Staten was named to the Lute Olson All-America team in 2015. Da'Sean Butler earned All-America first team honors in 2010 by John Wooden and *Basketball Times* and Kevin Jones earned All-America first team honors in 2012 by John Wooden.
- Besides West, some of basketball's biggest names have been affiliated with the Old Gold & Blue, including former Lakers coach and general manager Fred Schaus, former NBA President of Basketball Operations Rod Thorn and former Utah Jazz broadcaster and NBA Hall of Famer "Hot Rod" Hundley.

- WVU's championship was its first in Las Vegas. Last year, the Mountaineers won the Puerto Rico Tip-Off.

Winning Non-Conference Mark

- West Virginia is assured of a winning non-conference mark for the 24th consecutive season.
- West Virginia is 120-30 against non-conference teams in regular season games in the last 12 seasons.
- The last time WVU did not post a winning non-league record was 1990-91, when WVU went 4-4 outside of conference play.
- WVU is 89-24 in non-conference games under Bob Huggins.
- WVU has finished with one loss during non-conference play in seven different seasons. They were: 1981-82 when West Virginia went 11-1 out of the Atlantic 10, 1957-58 when WVU lost only to Duke in going 11-1, 1996-97 when the Mountaineers were 7-1, losing the season opener at Minnesota, 2004-05 when WVU went 10-1 outside the Big East, 2006-07 when the Mountaineers went 12-1 with their only loss to Arkansas, 2009-10 when WVU was 11-1 with its only loss at Purdue and 2014-15 when the Mountaineers had a one point home loss to LSU, finishing 12-1.
- WVU has had one perfect non-conference regular season, 10-0, in 1997-98.

- West Virginia is ranked No. 19 in the Associated Press poll and is No. 18 USA Today Coaches Poll, released on Dec. 21.
- The Mountaineers were as high as No. 14 in both polls on Dec. 7.
- The Mountaineers have been ranked 48 weeks in the AP poll under Bob Huggins, including 18 weeks in the AP Top 10.
- West Virginia has been ranked 68 weeks since Jan. 3, 2005 in the AP poll, and 181 weeks total in school history.
- WVU has been ranked in every USA Today poll this season and cracked the AP rankings on Nov. 30 at No. 20.
- Last year, WVU was as high as No. 14 in the AP poll on Jan. 5, 2015 and No. 12 in the USA Today poll on Feb. 2.
- Last year, WVU was ranked for 17 consecutive weeks. WVU finished No. 20 in the final AP poll and No. 21 in the final USA Today Coaches Poll.
- WVU was No. 6 in the final AP poll in 2010, its highest final ranking since a No. 5 ranking in 1959-60, and finished No. 22 in 2011.
- In 2010, WVU was ranked in the Top 10 for nine straight weeks - the most consecutive weeks in the Top 10 since 1960.

Against Ranked Teams

- The Virginia game marked the 276th time in school history WVU played a team ranked in the AP Top 25.
- Bob Huggins has 28 wins over ranked teams at WVU: No. 8 Kansas, No. 12 Maryland, No. 17 UConn, No. 18 Oklahoma and No. 22 Oklahoma State (2014-15), No. 8 Kansas, No. 21 Oklahoma and No. 11 Iowa State (2013-14), No. 9 Georgetown (2011-12), No. 8 Notre Dame, No. 8 Purdue, No. 11 Louisville, No. 13 Georgetown and No. 16 UConn (2010-11), No. 2 Kentucky, No. 9 Villanova, No. 15 Ole Miss, No. 19 Georgetown, No. 21 Ohio St., No. 22 Georgetown and No. 22 Pitt (2009-10), No. 2 Pitt, No. 12 Georgetown, No. 13 Villanova and No. 15 Ohio St. (2008-09) and No. 9 Duke, No. 10 Marquette and No. 15 UConn (2007-08).
- WVU owns 84 wins over AP-ranked teams.
- Since 1995, the Mountaineers have played 167 nationally ranked teams. The school has played 276 total games against nationally-ranked competition. That means more than 61 percent of the games against the best teams in the country have come during the last 22 seasons.
- WVU has played 117 ranked teams since the start of the 2004-05 season, winning 43 of those games.
- Bob Huggins has faced 73 ranked teams during the regular season in nine years, the most in school history. Gale Catlett faced 66 ranked teams during the regular season in 24 years, while John Beilein faced 34 ranked teams during regular season play in five years.



Preseason Bits

- West Virginia was predicted to finish sixth in the Big 12 Conference preseason coaches' poll.
- In 10 of the last 13 seasons, the Mountaineers have finished higher or equal than their preseason prediction.
- Junior forward Devin Williams was named to the Preseason All-Big 12 Honorable Mention Team.

Academic Success

- Thirty of the last 31 seniors on the WVU men's basketball team have graduated on time or early since 2004.
- This year, Devin Williams is a nominee for the Allstate NABC Good Works Team.
- In 2015, Kevin Noreen was named to the Academic All-Big 12 Men's Basketball first team for the third year in a row. Gary Browne and Juwan Staten were named to the second team for the second time. Nathan Adrian was named to the first team, while teammates Elijah Macon and Brandon Watkins were second-team honorees.
- Noreen was a finalist for the 2013-14 Allstate NABC Good Works Team and was a candidate for Academic All-America honors after he was named to the Capital One Academic All-America District 2 team by CoSIDA.
- Three members of the 2010-11 team earned their bachelor and master's degrees while playing at WVU under Huggins: Joe Mazzulla, Cam Thoroughman and Jonnie West.
- Last year, WVU had 13 players on the Garrett Ford Academic Honor Roll with a 3.0 GPA or better.
- In 2010 and 2011, WVU men's basketball was also recognized nationally for ranking in the top 10 percent nationally among men's basketball programs for the Academic Progress Rate (APR).

- West Virginia is 82-6 at home against non-conference teams in the last 13 years, including 63 of its last 67.
- West Virginia has won 57 of its last 61 games at home in the month of December.
- West Virginia is 96-28 in the WVU Coliseum under Bob Huggins, including a 48-24 mark in league games.
- WVU is 505-148 (.772) all-time at the WVU Coliseum and 137-34 at the WVU Coliseum in the last 12 seasons.
- Under Bob Huggins in the WVU Coliseum, WVU is averaging 77.9 ppg while holding its opponents to 62.7 ppg.
- The Mountaineers have won 62 of their last 89 conference games at the WVU Coliseum.

- West Virginia is 80-64 under Bob Huggins in conference regular season games.
- Bob Huggins is 36-34 in Big 12 Conference games. He is 26-28 at WVU, and was 10-6 at Kansas State in 2006-07.
- Last year was WVU's sixth NCAA appearance in the last eight years and eighth appearance in the last 11 seasons.
- West Virginia made its 26th appearance in the NCAA Championship in 2014-15, reaching the NCAA Sweet 16.

Williams Named All-Big 12 Honorable Mention

- Junior Devin Williams was named to the All-Big 12 Honorable Mention team last season.
- He was named to the Preseason All-Big 12 Honorable Mention Team this season.
- Williams was named to the Kareem Abdul-Jabbar Preseason Watch List in November.
- The Cincinnati, Ohio, native is a nominee for the NABC Good Works Team.
- Last year in the opener vs. Monmouth, Williams had 15 points and a career-high 15 rebounds (12 on the offensive glass).
- He followed the Monmouth game with 15 points and 11 rebounds against Lafayette. He had 11 boards vs. Virginia Tech.
- Williams became the first WVU player in 41 years to open the season with three consecutive double-doubles when he had 16 points and 10 rebounds against George Mason. Warren Baker was the last to do so in 1973.
- This season in the opener against Northern Kentucky, Williams had 18 points and matched his career best with 15 rebounds. He followed that up with 19 points and 10 rebounds against James Madison and 23 points to go with 10 rebounds against Stetson. Williams posted his fourth double-double in a row against Bethune-Cookman, becoming the first Mountaineer to open the season with five double-doubles since Rod Thorn in 1960.
- For his performance in Las Vegas, he was named MVP of the Continental Tire Las Vegas Invitational.
- Against Kennesaw State on Dec. 5, he posted a career-high 26 points.
- Williams has 23 double-doubles and 26 double-figure rebounding performances during his career.
- Williams' eight double-doubles in 2013-14 were the third most all-time by a WVU freshman.
- Williams' nine double-doubles were the second most by a Big 12 player last season.

Press Virginia

- West Virginia's 40-minute full court pressure had the Mountaineers leading the final 2014-15 NCAA statistics in four categories: steals, steals per game, forced turnovers and offensive rebounds.
- The Mountaineers had never led any category in the final NCAA statistics in school history until last season.
- WVU has nine players with 25 or more steals and has three players ranked in the Top 15 in the Big 12 in steals.
- WVU outrebounded its opponents on the offensive glass 575 to 312 last season.

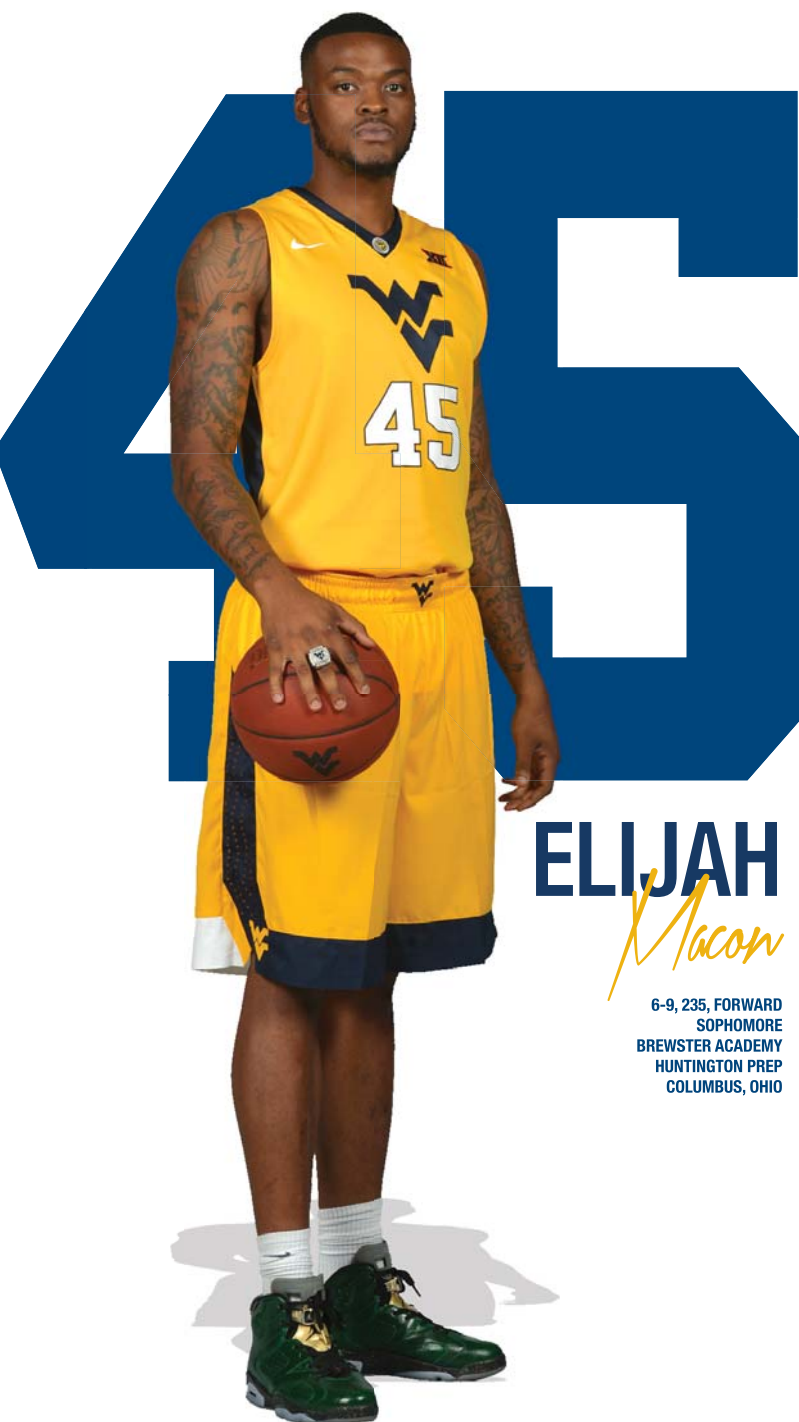

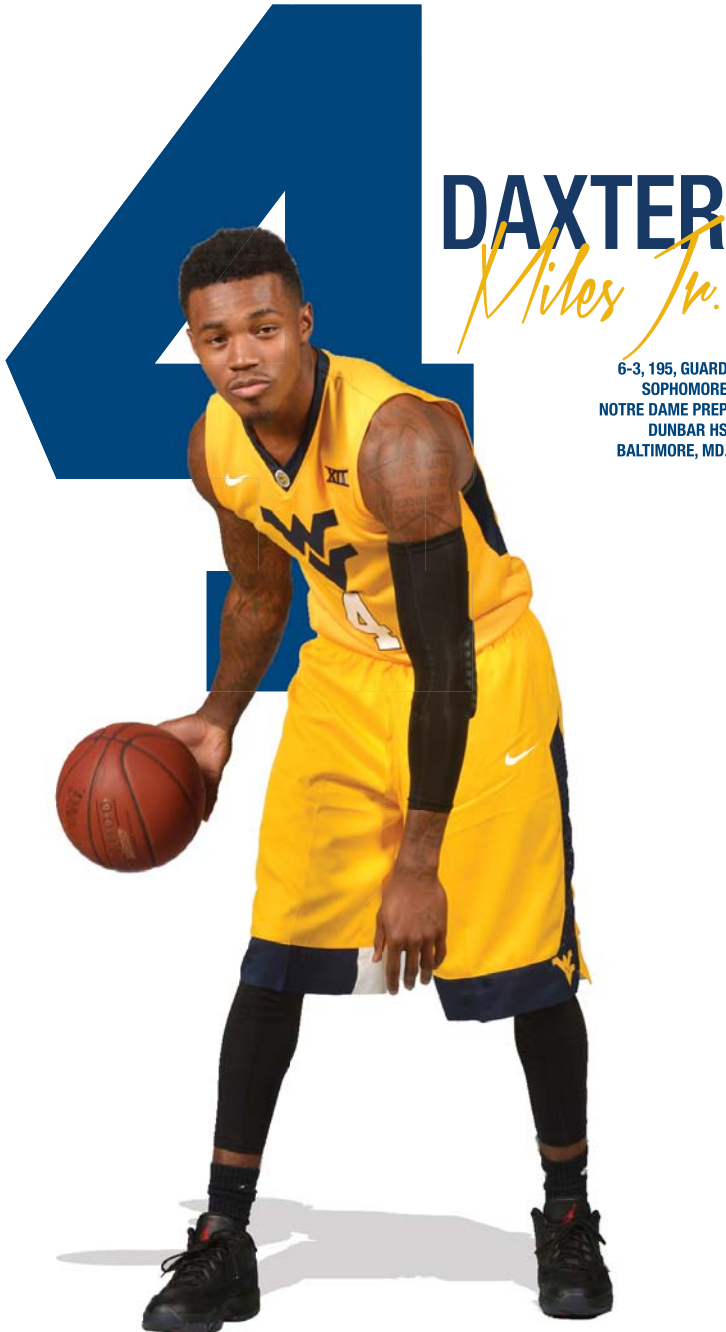

Recap

Jevon Carter scored 24 points and West Virginia's full-court pressure defense forced 20 Northern Kentucky turnovers on the way to a 107-61 victory in the 2015-16 season opener at the WVU Coliseum.

It was the 500th all-time victory for the Mountaineers at the 45-year-old facility.

West Virginia jumped out to an early double-digit lead and the margin swelled to 50, 62-32, at halftime. Northern Kentucky, still transitioning to Division I basketball, had trouble handling the Mountaineer press and West Virginia's balls on the glass.

Junior forward Devin Williams pulled down 15 rebounds to go with 18 points, while senior forward Jonathan Holton contributed 14 points and 12 boards. West Virginia had a 47-26 rebounding advantage and outscored the Norse 52-28 in the paint.

Sophomore guard Daxter Miles Jr. contributed 19 points on eight-of-13 shooting; Carter was also efficient shooting the ball, hitting seven of his 11 field goal attempts and all seven of his free throw tries.

"I thought we played really well in the first half," said West Virginia coach Bob Huggins. "Then we came out in the second half very complacent. I think at one time we forced five turnovers and we had five turnovers and at one time they were leading in the second half by three or five. That's not what we want. We've got to do a better job of getting them ready to come out in the second half."

All 10 West Virginia players who got into the game scored. An announced crowd of 10,120 for the game was pleasing to Huggins.

"We need the support," he said. "If we're going to be a consistent big-time program let's be a consistent big-time program. I know it's hard to get from a lot of places but when you can come, come, and when you can't come give your tickets to somebody else."

Tyler White led Northern Kentucky with 17 points. Lavone Holland II added 11.

- The Mountaineers now own a 92-15 all-time record in season openers, including a 98-9 record in home openers.
- The crowd of 10,120 was the fourth time in Coliseum history that WVU had a crowd of 10,000 or more in the month of November.

Recap

Jevon Carter and Devin Williams scored 19 points each to power 22nd-ranked West Virginia to an 86-73 victory over James Madison at the Charleston Civic Center.

The Mountaineers (2-0) led throughout, but could never completely distance themselves from the feisty Dukes.

"It was a good game, they're a good team, they're well coached and if they shoot it like that they're not going to lose very many," said West Virginia coach Bob Huggins. "They made some hard shots tonight."

West Virginia began the game with Carter's alley oop dunk, and then the Mountaineers used their size in the paint to build an early seven-point lead on consecutive baskets by Jonathan Holton and Williams.

An Esa Ahmad 3 from the wing and an Elijah Macon tip-in got it to nine, 15-6, and then a pretty Macon pass to a cutting Holton gave West Virginia its first double-digit advantage at 27-17.

Shakir Brown kept James Madison around in the first half, dropping in a pair of 3s and hitting all six of his free throw attempts. The Dukes were 12 of 12 from the line until Tom Vodanovich missed the second of two with 2:27 left.

West Virginia's biggest lead of the first half was 14, 41-27, following a pair of Williams free throws with 5:18 remaining.

Williams scored on the opening possession of the second half, and the Mountaineers used constant pressure to build the lead back to 14, 60-46, on baskets by Nathan Adrian and Elijah Macon following consecutive JMU turnovers.

The Dukes (1-1) answered with five straight from Vodanovich and Joey McLean, and then two Brown charity throws reduced West Virginia's lead to seven, 60-53.

Leading by nine, 70-61, with six minutes left, West Virginia used a 6-0 spurt, two of those coming on an Ahmad no-look pass to Daxter Miles Jr. on an inbounds play and two more coming on a Williams dunk off of a Dukes turnover to make it 76-61.

The Mountaineers' biggest lead of the game was 19 after Holton's follow-up basket.

Holton contributed 12 points and 12 rebounds while Miles Jr. finished with 11 for the Mountaineers.

West Virginia shot 43.9 percent overall, 37.5 percent from 3, and 73.3 percent from the free throw line. WVU also made nine steals and forced 19 turnovers.

Three West Virginia players had double-double games as the 22nd-ranked Mountaineers rolled to a 97-44 victory over Bethune-Cookman at the WVU Coliseum.

Devin Williams scored 12 points and grabbed 10 rebounds, Jonathan Holton contributed 11 points and 11 rebounds and Elijah Macon came off the bench to produce 13 points and 10 boards for the 4-0 Mountaineers.

It was the first time that has happened for a WVU team since February 8, 1994 when Marsalis Baisey, Ricky Robinson and Zain Shaw accomplished the feat in West Virginia's 78-71 victory over eighth-ranked Temple at the Coliseum.

Jaysean Paige and Daxter Miles Jr. scored 14 points, while Jevon Carter had 11 and junior college transfer Teyvon Myers finished with 10 in the win.

"We did some nice things and we did some things that weren't very good," said West Virginia coach Bob Huggins. "We turned it over 16 times against a 2-3 zone and that's way too many. We've got to get to a point where those are in single digits."

For Williams, it was his fourth consecutive double-double game to start the season, the first time that has happened since 1967 when forward Carey Bailey did it.

An announced crowd of 6,196, minus WVU students on Thanksgiving break, got to see the entire roster of available players for a good portion of the second half after the Mountaineers built a 45-22 halftime lead.

West Virginia shot 52.2 percent from the floor, had a 50-32 advantage on the glass and made 15 steals that contributed to 30 Wildcat turnovers.

"I thought Devin was really solid for us," said Huggins. "He was working. When you get a 6-9, 260-pound guy out there moving his feet the way he was trying to move his feet that's pretty good effort. He's really working and he's in the gym all of the time and that's kind of been the formula for success."

Josue Salaam was the only Bethune-Cookman player to reach double figures with 12 points.

This was the second game of the Continental Tire Las Vegas Invitational following the game against Stetson three days earlier.

Recap

Devin Williams scored 23 points and grabbed 12 rebounds to lead 22nd-ranked West Virginia to a 67-59 victory over Richmond at the Orleans Arena in Las Vegas, Nevada.

Williams made nine of 11 field goal attempts and pulled down a game-best five offensive rebounds for his fifth double-double of the season.

He becomes the first player since All-American Rod Thorn in 1960-61 to start the season with five straight double-doubles. Thorn had six straight double-doubles to begin that season.

"Devin was absolutely terrific," said West Virginia coach Bob Huggins. "I thought Devin was a man and I thought Esa (Ahmad) made some good plays for us when we were struggling."

West Virginia (5-0) led by 12 at one point in the first half before taking a 35-31 lead into the locker room at halftime.

The Mountaineers led by eight midway through the second half but couldn't shake off the pesky Spiders.

Richmond was averaging 90.8 points and shooting better than 50 percent from the floor, but could manage just 59 points on 39.1 percent shooting. The Spiders hit only two of their 15 3-point tries, including missing all seven in the second half.

"For the most part we got pretty good pressure on them," said Huggins. "All we talked about was chase them off the (3-point line). We could stand in there and let them shoot it because they shoot it really well."

Forward Terry Allen led Richmond with 20 points, the senior getting half of those from the free throw line. There were a combined 52 fouls called in the game with two disqualifications, T.J. Cline for Richmond and Nathan Adrian for West Virginia.

Jevon Carter was the only other WVU player to reach double figures with 13 points.

West Virginia also struggled to make shots, hitting just 43.8 percent of its field goal tries, including 15.4 percent from 3.

Recap

West Virginia used a career-high 26 points from junior forward Devin Williams to dispose of Kennesaw State, 87-54, at the WVU Coliseum.

Williams made 11 of his 15 field goal attempts and added nine rebounds for the 20th-ranked Mountaineers, now 7-0 to begin the year for the second straight season.

Sophomore guard Dexter Miles Jr. contributed 18 points and senior forward Jonathan Holton nearly missed a double-double with 17 points and nine rebounds.

"We just didn't have a lot of interest in the game today. I don't think," said West Virginia coach Bob Huggins, continuing his climb up the NCAA all-time wins chart with career victory No. 772, although it's a safe bet he will struggle to remember the game when his career is finished.

West Virginia shot 52.3 percent from the floor, or 0.6 percent better than it did from the free throw line (15 of 29).

"When you come in and you shoot 50 percent from the free throw line you're not ready to play, and we were not ready to play," said Huggins. "When you miss layups ... we missed four or five, you're not ready to play. When you have unforced turnovers that's just a lack of concentration."

Fortunately for West Virginia, the outmanned Owls were outmanned, turning the ball over 31 times leading to 31 Mountaineer points.

The game did represent the season debut for junior forward Brandon Watkins, who missed the first six games of the year while recovering from off-season knee surgery. Watkins played 17 minutes and scored six points, grabbed six rebounds, blocked a shot and handed out an assist to draw praise from his coach.

"He gives us a presence around the rim, and I liked the way he played today," said Huggins of Watkins' initial performance of the season.

Kennesaw State, which has lost games this year at Alabama and LSU, drops to 2-8. Kendrick Ray led the Owls with 23 points.

A Family Day crowd of 8,731 watched the game.

Recap

No. 10 Virginia used a suffocating second-half defensive performance to defeat 14th-ranked West Virginia, 70-54, in the first game of the Jimmy V Classic at Madison Square Garden.

The second half was a complete reversal for the 8-1 Cavaliers, who turned the ball over a season-high 19 times and trailed by as many as 12 points through the first 16 minutes of play.

But the Cavs were able to cut their deficit in half by halftime, 36-30, and then totally took West Virginia out of anything it tried to do offensively in the second half.

The Mountaineers (7-1) made just six second-half baskets, WVU's bigs consistently had trouble handling double teams along the baseline, the guards couldn't knock down shots when they did get open and the Cavaliers finally capitalized offensively on their end of the floor.

The result was a 28-point swing and a valuable learning experience for the young Mountaineers.

Virginia shot a sizzling 74 percent in the second half (14 of 19).

"We didn't guard and when you get spread the way they are going to spread you, you've got to guard the ball," West Virginia coach Bob Huggins said. "We did just a horrific job of guarding the ball."

Forward Anthony Gill led Virginia with 20 points on 9 of 11 shooting - many of those coming around the basket on stick-backs and dunks. Malcolm Brogdon contributed 14 and London Perrante returned to the court after missing the last two games while recovering from an appendectomy to add 13.

The critical moment in the game happened with 13:11 left and West Virginia leading by one, 40-39. Guard Jevon Carter made a steal and had a direct path to the basket for a layup, but he chose instead to make a risky behind-the-back pass that Perrante ended up with and turned into a 3-point basket at the other end.

It was a five-point swing that Virginia turned into a seven-point swing and a four-point lead when Gill followed up Perrante's triple with a dunk.

From there, Virginia's half-court defense took over.

All nine points West Virginia managed to score for the rest of the game came from Jaysean Paige, who finished with a team-high 16 points coming off the bench.

West Virginia shot 40 percent from the floor (20 of 50), 14.3 percent from 3 (2 of 14) and just 57.1 percent (12 of 21) from the free throw line.

Recap

West Virginia's full-court pressure eventually got to Marshall. The 20th-ranked Mountaineers produced 19 turnovers and held the Herd scoreless from behind the arc in the second half to pull away with an 86-68 victory in Charleston.

The 18-point victory was the biggest margin for the Mountaineers since an 18-point win over Marshall in Morgantown on December 5, 1989. West Virginia's largest margin of victory over Marshall in the Capital City was 16 points achieved three years ago on January 18, 2012.

Marshall (3-7) hung around in the first half and actually led by six at one point by hitting its 3s - three of those coming from Austin Loop - but West Virginia was able to clamp down on Loop and eventually took control of the game.

WVU used an 18-3 run midway through the second half as its lead eventually swelled to as many as 23 points with 1:38 remaining.

Devin Williams, who sat all but five minutes of the first half with two early fouls, keyed West Virginia's run with back-to-back baskets and then a Daxter Miles Jr. conventional three-point play advanced the lead to 10, 49-39. Consecutive buckets by Jonathan Holton and Nathan Adrian pushed the margin to 14.

"We started throwing the ball inside in the second half and that was kind of the turning point when we started throwing it dose and stopped shooting jump shots," said West Virginia coach Bob Huggins.

Jevon Carter led four double-digit scorers with 15 points on five-of-10 shooting; Miles Jr. contributed 14, Elijah Macon came off the bench to score 12 points playing in place of Williams and Tarik Phillip added 11.

The Mountaineers shot 46.2 percent from the floor, or nearly equal to what they shot at the free throw line (54.5 percent) on their 33 attempts. West Virginia also turned the ball over 17 times, many of those unforced or the result of soft passes in the open court.

Marshall missed all 13 of its second-half 3s and finished the night hitting just 23.1 percent from behind the arc. Overall, the Herd shot just 34.5 percent for the game.

An announced crowd of 11,748 watched the Capital Classic.

Notebook

- Forward Ryan Taylor led Marshall with 15 points and six rebounds and he joined Carter as the Eddie Barrett game MVPs, voted on by the media.
- West Virginia has now won five straight and nine of its last 10 games against Marshall.

Recap

After a slow start, the 19th-ranked Mountaineers used 17 first-half points off the bench from guard Jaysean Paige to bury Eastern Kentucky 84-59 in Morgantown on ESPNU.

Paige finished with 17, while junior forward Devin Williams contributed 15 points and eight rebounds, Daxter Miles Jr. scored 12 and Jevon Carter added 11.

"We make the run and then it was a very ladduster effort by us in the second half," said West Virginia coach Bob Huggins, who earned his 775th career win.

The Mountaineers used a 20-5 run during a seven-minute stretch to turn a four-point deficit into an 11-point lead with Carter and forward Jonathan Holton keying the run. Holton got a stick-back basket and a layup and Carter nailed a couple of 3s to give WVU a 20-14 lead.

After Eastern Kentucky's Greg King made one of two from the free throw line with 6:58 left to reduce West Virginia's lead to 25-19, the Mountaineers scored the next 21 points to turn the game into another Coliseum rout.

West Virginia shot 49.2 percent from the floor, including 10 of 24 from 3, outrebounded the Colonels, 37-27 and made 11 steals that contributed to 18 Eastern Kentucky turnovers.

"You've got to keep playing," said Huggins. "We can't keep relying on making jump shots and we've got to make things happen."

An announced crowd of 8,121 attended the game.

Eastern Kentucky, playing without its top scorer Jarelle Reischel who was a late scratch because of back spasms, got 16 points from Jevontae Hawkins.

Heading into the game, West Virginia continued to lead the country in steals, 3-point field goal percentage defense (that may fall following EKVU's 41.7 percentage from behind the arc), forced turnovers and offensive rebounds per game.

The Mountaineers ran their record to 10-1 for the second consecutive year
