No. 17 West Virginia Tries For Season Sweep over Texas Tech

- This weekend is the annual WVU basketball reunion. It is the 50th anniversary of WVU's first integrated basketball team. Ed Harvard, Norman Holmes, Jim Lewis and David Reaser are scheduled to attend.
- The Mountaineer Sports Network from IMG broadcast will be on Sirius channel 108 and XM channel 199.
- West Virginia's 10 wins away from home are the most road/neutral wins in Division I this season.
- With 757 career wins, Bob Huggins is in 13th place on the NCAA Division I all-time winningest coaches list. Huggins' record now stands at 757-305 in his 33rd season as a head coach. He needs two wins to tie Ed Diddle for 12th place.
- Bob Huggins is the third-winningest active Division I coach behind Mike Krzyzewski and Jim Boeheim.
- West Virginia is 85-27 in the WVU Coliseum under Bob Huggins, including a 43-23 mark in league games at home.
- WVU is 494-147 (.772) all-time at the WVU Coliseum and 126-33 at the WVU Coliseum in the last 11 seasons.
- Under Bob Huggins in the WVU Coliseum, WVU is averaging 76.3 ppg, while holding its opponents to 63.5 ppg.
- The Mountaineers have won 57 of their last 83 conference games at the WVU Coliseum.
- WVU has won 111 of its last 139 games against unranked teams, including 55 of its last 63 at the WVU Coliseum.
- Bob Huggins is 30-29 in Big 12 Conference games. He is 20-23 at WVU, and was 10-6 at Kansas State in 2006-07.
- West Virginia is 74-59 under Bob Huggins in conference regular season games.
- Juwan Staten became WVU's 49th 1,000-point scorer vs. NC State. He now shows 1,117 career points (35th all-time).
- Staten was named to the John Wooden Midseason Top 25 list and Lute Olson Midseason Top 25 list in January.
- The Mountaineers have been ranked 37 weeks under Bob Huggins, including 18 weeks in the AP Top 10.
- WVU leads the nation in steals (25.1), steals per game (12.6), turnover margin (9.7) and offensive rebounds (17.7).
- WVU has eight players with 20 or more steals and has five players ranked in the Top 15 in the Big 12 in steals.
- WVU has outrebounded its opponents on the offensive glass 353 to 193 this season.
- The Mountaineers have taken 344 more shots (17.2 per game) than their opponents this season (1,289 to 945).
- WVU has 251 steals this season and has forced its opponents to turn the ball over 442 times. The Mountaineers are averaging 22.8 points per game off turnovers this season.
- WVU tied a school record with 26 steals vs. VMI. The Keydets set a school record by an opponent with 36 turnovers.
- WVU held Wofford to 11 field goals made on Dec. 22, the fewest made by an opponent since 1949.
- WVU has had eight or more steals in every game, and WVU opponents have had 20 or more turnovers 14 times.
- West Virginia has made at least one 3-point field goal in 508 consecutive games. The last time WVU did not make a 3-point field goal was against Robert Morris on Nov. 27, 1999.
- Juwan Staten was named the Big 12 Conference Preseason Player of the Year and to numerous All-America teams.
- Staten was named the Big 12 Player of the Week on Dec. 22 and Dec. 29. He has won the weekly award three times in his career. This season, he has been named the Puerto Rico Tip-Off MVP and Gotham Classic MVP.
- Staten has scored 14 points or more in 36 of his last 44 games. He has reached double figures in all but two games.
- Staten is the eighth player in school history to have 1,000 points, 300 rebounds, 350 assists and 100 steals in a career.
- Staten had 18 points and 12 assists against TCU. He is the seventh WVU player to have 12 or more assists in a game.
- Devin Williams opened the season with three double-doubles and now shows 14 for his career. He also has 16 career double-figure rebounding performances. Williams is tied for second in the Big 12 in double-doubles this season.
- Gary Browne has 102 points in the last 11 outings after scoring a total of 31 points in the first nine games.
- Jonathan Holton was named to the Big 12 Newcomer of the Week on Nov. 24 and then again on Dec. 1.
- Jevon Carter's 28 points against VMI were three points shy of tying the WVU school record for points by a freshman.
- Carter has 23 steals in the last eight games and leads the team with 42. He needs 21 to tie the WVU freshman record.
- West Virginia has allowed its opponent to shoot 50 percent or better only 39 times under Bob Huggins (261 games).
- West Virginia has won 81 of its last 91 games when holding its opponents to 69 points or less.
- West Virginia is 47-3 under Bob Huggins when shooting 50 percent or better from the field.
- West Virginia is 126-24 under Bob Huggins when leading at halftime.
- West Virginia is 131-14 under Bob Huggins when leading by 10 or more points in a game.
- West Virginia is 117-9 under Bob Huggins when posting a higher shooting percentage than its opponent.
- The Mountaineers are 118-22 under Bob Huggins when scoring 70 or more points in a game.
- West Virginia is 122-27 under Bob Huggins when outrebounding its opponent.
- West Virginia is 16-15 all-time on Jan. 31. The Mountaineers are 491-316 all-time in January.

Bob Huggins

- Huggins is WVU's 21st head basketball coach.
- Huggins is a Morgantown native and a 1977 graduate of West Virginia University.
- Huggins has won 757 games in 33 seasons as head coach.
- Huggins ranks third in total victories among active Division I head coaches.
- Huggins ranks 19th in winning percentage (.710) among active Division I head coaches.
- Huggins' teams have participated in postseason play in 28 of his 32 seasons, including 20 NCAA tournaments.
- His squads have won 20 or more games in all but seven of his 32 campaigns, including 30 or more twice.
- Huggins averages 23.3 victories a season.
- Huggins has made two NCAA Final Fours and four NCAA Elite Eight appearances.
- Huggins has been named national coach of the year five times.
- Huggins' teams have finished in the Top 10 final rankings eight times.
- Huggins has coached 11 All-Americans and 60 all-conference selections.
- Huggins has coached 18 NBA draft picks, including six first round selections and four lottery picks.
- Huggins has won 13 conference regular season titles.
- Huggins has won 10 conference tournament titles.
- Huggins ranks 13th among the NCAA's all-time winningest coaches.

Scouting Texas Tech

- Texas Tech is 11-10 overall and 1-7 in the Big 12 following an 81-36 loss at Oklahoma on Wednesday.
- The Red Raiders picked up their first Big 12 win of the season on Jan. 24, a 78-73 win over Iowa State.
- Texas Tech has lost nine of its last 11 games. The Red Raiders are 0-5 on the road, including a 0-4 mark in Big 12 play.
- Tubby Smith is 25-28 in his second season at Tech. He is 536-254 in his 24th season overall.

Series Record Against Texas Tech

- This will be the eighth meeting between West Virginia and Texas Tech with WVU leading 6-1.
- On Jan. 5 of this season, West Virginia won in Lubbock, 78-67.
- WVU won both meetings last season, 89-86 in overtime in Lubbock and 87-81 in Morgantown.
- The first meeting took place in the NCAA Sweet 16 on March 24, 2005, in Albuquerque, N.M. The Mountaineers defeated the Red Raiders, 65-60. WVU then narrowly lost in overtime to Louisville two days later for a spot in the Final Four.
- Two years ago, WVU won at Texas Tech, 77-61, on Feb. 2, and in Morgantown, 66-64, on Feb. 16. In the opening round of the Phillips 66 Big 12 Championship in Kansas City, the Red Raiders defeated WVU, 71-69.
- Bob Huggins is 6-2 against Texas Tech. When Huggins was at Kansas State, Texas Tech won in Manhattan, 62-52, during the regular season. In the Big 12 Championship, the Wildcats defeated the Red Raiders, 66-45.

WVU Basketball Tradition

- This is the 106th season and 112th year overall for West Virginia basketball, which began in 1903.
- The Mountaineers own a 1,668-1,043 all-time record in intercollegiate basketball competition, ranking the Mountaineers 25th among all Division I schools.
- WVU has earned 25 NCAA berths and 16 NIT trips since 1941, and has finished in the Top 25 17 times, including an amazing nine straight years from 1955-63.
- In the past 10 years, the Mountaineers reached the NIT First Round in 2014, NCAA Second Round in 2012, NCAA Third Round in 2011, the NCAA Final Four in 2010, made the NCAA Tournament in 2009, reached the NCAA Sweet 16 in 2008, won the NIT in 2007, reached the NCAA Sweet 16 in 2006 and made it to the NCAA Elite Eight in 2005.
- In 1958, the Mountaineers finished the regular season ranked No. 1 in both polls and in 1959, West Virginia, led by All-America guard Jerry West, lost in the NCAA finals to California.
- West Virginia has had 10 first team All-Americans, headlined by West, who went on to become one of basketball's all-time greats with the NBA's Los Angeles Lakers.

Recap

Terry Henderson scored a career-high 28 points and West Virginia overcame some late-game miscues to hang on for an 87-81 victory over Texas Tech.

Henderson outdueled Tech's dusty Hannahs, who scored 25 and made all seven of his three-point field goal tries, by scoring 20 of his 28 points in the second half.

And the Mountaineers needed all of them, especially when freshman Devin Williams drew his fourth foul with 14:39 left in the game and did not return.

Eight straight points by Henderson during a two-minute stretch gave the Mountaineers a seven-point lead, 69-62, and then Juwan Staten and Eron Harris added clutch baskets to make it an eight-point advantage with seven minutes to go.

The Mountaineers had a 13-point lead with 5:13 remaining when they began leaking oil once again. Three free throws by Robert Turner made it a seven-point game, and then Hannahs' seventh 3 with 44 seconds turned it into a two-possession game.

Another foul by Harris gave Turner three more free throws with 30 seconds left; Turner got all three to go down to make it a four-point game, 85-81.

Twice, West Virginia nearly lost the ball attempting to get it up the court before Henderson was eventually fouled with 22 seconds left. He made both free throws to provide the final margin.

WVU (11-8, 3-3) jumped out to an early 10-point lead and then saw Texas Tech go on a 16-0 run to flip the game around. West Virginia eventually ended the drought when Gary Browne hit a pair of free throws with 7:55 remaining, and the Mountaineers eventually retook the lead with four straight points from Staten and Nathan Adrian with 2:10 left in the half.

It looked like West Virginia was going to go into the locker room with a four-point lead at halftime, but Adrian's length-of-the-floor inbound pass was not touched by anyone with 1:19 seconds left, giving Tech the ball underneath its basket.

Juwan Staten scored 25 points and Terry Henderson hit a big 3 with 18 seconds left to send it into overtime as West Virginia outlasted Texas Tech, 89-86, at United Spirit Arena in Lubbock, Texas.

Henderson's huge 3 came after West Virginia watched an 11-point second half lead evaporate.

In overtime, West Virginia (10-5, 2-0) built a three-point lead on baskets by Nathan Adrian and Staten, and then led by four, 87-83, with 36 seconds left following a pair of Staten free throws.

After Toddrick Gotcher's 3 reduced WVU's lead to two, 88-86, Gary Browne was fouled with four seconds left. Before the foul, it took the Mountaineers three attempts to get the ball inbounds underneath Tech's basket. Browne made one of two, giving Texas Tech coach Tubby Smith an opportunity to draw up a play to tie the game and send it to a second overtime with a 3-point shot.

A pass the length of the floor with 3.8 seconds was knocked off the leg of Devin Williams underneath Tech's basket. No time ran off the clock, and after the officials went to the monitor to look at the replay, it was determined that the play took 0.4 to happen, giving the Red Raiders 3.4 seconds to get off a game-tying shot underneath its own basket.

Dusty Hannahs got the ball to Jaye Crockett in the corner and his 3 to tie it from almost behind the backboard hit the front of the rim and Browne grabbed the rebound as time expired.

West Virginia shot 55.7 percent from the floor (34 of 61) - almost as well as it did from the free throw line (13 of 22 for 59.1 percent). But the real problem for the Mountaineers was on the glass where they got beat badly by nine. WVU also allowed the Red Raiders to shoot 46.7 percent, including 8 of 21 from 3.

Jordan Tolbert scored 18 points before fouling out; Toddrick added 17 and Crockett scored 15 for the Red Raiders, now 8-7, 0-2.

- West Virginia has been ranked 57 weeks since Jan. 3, 2005, and 170 weeks total in school history.
- WVU cracked the rankings on Nov. 24, with a No. 21 ranking in the AP poll and a No. 24 ranking in the USA Today poll.
- WVU was as high as No. 14 in both polls on Jan. 5, 2015.
- WVU was No. 6 in the final AP poll in 2010, its highest final ranking since a No. 5 ranking in 1959-60, and finished No. 22 in 2011.
- In 2010, WVU was ranked in the Top 10 for nine straight weeks - the most consecutive weeks in the Top 10 since 1960.

Puerto Rico Tip-Off Recap

- WVU captured the Puerto Rico Tip-Off with wins over George Mason, Boston College and UConn.
- Juwan Staten was named the tournament MVP while Devin Williams was named to the All-Tournament Team.
- WVU improved to 8-1 all-time in Puerto Rico while Bob Huggins has won three crowns there and is now 11-1.



Academic Success

- Twenty-nine of the last 30 seniors on the WVU men's basketball team have graduated on time or early since 2004.
- In 2014, Kevin Noreen was named to the Academic All-Big 12 Men's Basketball first team for the second year in a row while Gary Browne was named to the second team. Juwan Staten was named to the second team in 2013.
- Noreen was a finalist for the 2013-14 Allstate NABC Good Works Team and was a candidate for Academic All-America honors after he was named to the Capital One Academic All-America District 2 team by CoSIDA.
- Three members of the 2010-11 team earned their bachelor and master's degrees while playing at WVU under Huggins: Joe Mazzulla, Cam Thoroughman and Jonnie West.
- Last year, WVU had 13 players on the Garrett Ford Academic Honor Roll with a 3.0 GPA or better.
- In 2010, WVU received the Team Excellence award from the Big East for the highest cumulative grade point average among Big East men's basketball teams.
- In 2010 and 2011, WVU men's basketball was also recognized nationally for ranking in the top 10 percent nationally among men's basketball programs for the Academic Progress Rate (APR).

- Eighty-two of Bob Huggins' 167 West Virginia victories have been away from the WVU Coliseum.
- Bob Huggins has posted 31 conference road victories in eight seasons at WVU.
- Bob Huggins has wins over 25 ranked teams at WVU, including wins over No. 17 UConn and No. 18 Oklahoma this year.
- West Virginia is 79-23 in non-conference regular season games under Bob Huggins, including a 42-4 mark at home.
- West Virginia is 76-6 at home against non-conference teams in the last 12 years, including 57 of its last 61.
- West Virginia is 110-29 against non-conference teams in regular season games in the last 11 seasons.
- WVU has won 91 of its last 114 non-conference games and 96 of its last 120 non-league contests (includes postseason).
- Bob Huggins has made 20 Division I NCAA appearances. Only four active coaches have made more appearances.
- Bob Huggins coached in his 1,000th game at TCU on Feb. 9, 2013, a 63-50 Mountaineer victory.

- West Virginia is 19-9 in postseason games (7 NCAA and 3 NIT appearances) in its last 10 appearances.

Big 12 Preseason Player of the Year

- Senior point guard Juwan Staten was named the Big 12 Conference Preseason Player of the Year, in a vote by the league's head coaches. He was also one of two players who were a unanimous selection to the All-Big 12 Conference Preseason First Team.
- So far this season, Staten has been named to numerous preseason All-America teams: Lute Olson All-America Team, CBSSports.com Second Team, SB Nation Second Team, Sporting News Third Team, Athlon Sports Third Team, Blue Ribbon Magazine Third Team and an Associated Press Honorable Mention selection.
- He was named to the John Wooden and Lute Olson Top 25 lists, the Oscar Robertson and Naismith Trophy Watch Lists.
- Staten was tabbed as the ninth-best player in college basketball this season by ESPN.
- The Dayton, Ohio, native has been named to the Bob Cousy Award Watch List. Last year, he was one of 23 finalists for the award. Staten has been named a finalist for the 2015 Allstate NABC Good Works Team and Senior CLASS Award.
- He has been named the Puerto Rico Tip-Off MVP, Gotham Classic MVP and Big 12 Player of the Week (Dec. 22/Dec. 29).
- Last season, Staten was named to the All-Big 12 First Team and to the All-Defensive team, in a vote by the league's head coaches.
- As a junior, Staten averaged 18.1 points per game, averaging 37.3 minutes per contest.
- Staten had five assists or more in 23 of 33 outings, with one turnover or less on 16 occasions.
- Staten has had 14 points or more in 36 of his last 44 games.
- Staten was at or near the top in just about every statistical category in the Big 12 last year, including scoring (first), field goal percentage (third), assists (second), assist-to-turnover ratio (second), steals (eighth) and minutes played (first).
- Staten had three double-doubles last season (points and rebounds). He had six games with nine or more assists.
- Staten (598 points, 186 rebounds and 193 assists) became the first player in school history to score 500 points, grab 150 rebounds and dish out 150 assists in a season.
- Staten's 598 points scored were the 17th most all-time in a season by a WVU player. His 193 assists tied for the second-most assists by a WVU player in a season.
- Staten has had one or fewer turnovers in 30 of his last 57 games.
- His 193 assists last season were the second-most assists in a season in WVU school history.
- Staten was 18-of-21 from the free throw line against the Wildcats, tying the school record for free throws made in a game. He tied Rod Thorn, who made 18 in a 1963 game at George Washington. His 21 attempts rank 11th in school history, but are the most since Thorn attempted 23 in that game against George Washington.
- For his performances against Kansas State and Baylor, Staten was named Big 12 Player of the Week (Feb. 3). He became the first WVU player to earn Big 12 Player of the Week honors.
- For conference games only, he led the Big 12 in scoring (19.9 ppg) and was third in field goal percentage (48.8).
- In Big 12 games last season, he posted 35 points against Kansas State, 25 points at Texas Tech, 24 points vs. Kansas, 24 points at Oklahoma, 23 points against Texas, 22 points at Kansas, 20 points against Oklahoma and 20 points against Oklahoma State.
- He has had four double-figures rebounding performances last season: 10 vs. Loyola, 10 vs. William & Mary, 11 at Kansas State and 10 vs. Oklahoma. He has three double-doubles: William & Mary, at Kansas State and Oklahoma.
- Staten had 19 games of six assists or more last season, including six games with nine assists (Duquesne, Old Dominion, Georgia Southern, Baylor, Iowa State and Kansas).
- Counting his 298 points as a freshman at Dayton, Staten now shows 1,415 points for his career.

Williams Building Off Last Season

- Sophomore Devin Williams has started this season right where he left off last season.
- In the opener vs. Monmouth, Williams had 15 points and a career-high 15 rebounds (12 on the offensive glass).
- He followed the Monmouth game with 15 points and 11 rebounds against Lafayette. He had 11 boards vs. Virginia Tech.
- Williams became the first WVU player in 41 years to open the season with three consecutive double-doubles when he had 16 points and 10 rebounds against George Mason. Warren Baker was the last to do so in 1973.
- Williams was named to the Puerto Rico Tip-Off All-Tournament Team.
- The Cincinnati, Ohio, native matched his career high with 15 rebounds against Iowa State on Jan. 10, 2015.
- Williams has 14 double-doubles and 16 double-figure rebounding performances during his career.
- Williams' eight double-doubles last season were the third most all-time by a WVU freshman.
- Williams' eight double-doubles tied for the fifth most by a Big 12 player last season. He also tied for the most double-doubles by a Big 12 Conference freshman with Kansas' Joel Embiid.
- Williams had 238 rebounds last season, the fourth most all-time by a WVU freshman.
- He finished third in the Big 12 Conference in rebounds per contest (7.7).

Huggins Announces Recruiting Class

- Esa Ahmad and James "Beetle" Bolden signed national letters of intent during the early signing period.
- Ahmad, a 6-foot-8, 220-pound forward from Shaker Heights, Ohio, is in his senior year at Shaker Heights High.
- As a junior last season, he led Shaker Heights in points (26.5), rebounds (11.5), assists (3.5), blocks (2.0) and steals (2.0).
- Ahmad was named Player of the Year for the Northeast Lakes District and by the Associated Press for Division I in Ohio.
- He is ranked No. 43 in the Class of 2015 by ESPN.com.
- Bolden, a 6-foot, 170-pound guard from Covington, Kentucky, is in his senior year at Holmes High.
- As a junior last season, he averaged 20.8 points, 3.9 rebounds, 3.4 assists and 1.8 steals per game.
- Bolden was one of three juniors to make the Louisville Courier-Journal's All-State First Team and made the Lexington Herald-Leader's Boys All-State Basketball First Team as a junior and sophomore.
- He was named Player of the Year by the Northern Kentucky Boys' Basketball Coaches Association and by the Cincinnati Enquirer.



Press Virginia

- West Virginia's 40-minute full court pressure has the Mountaineers currently leading the NCAA in four categories: steals, steals per game, turnover margin and offensive rebounds.
- The Mountaineers have never led any category in the final NCAA statistics in school history.
- WVU has eight players with 20 or more steals and has five players ranked in the Top 15 in the Big 12 in steals.
- WVU has outrebounded its opponents on the offensive glass 353 to 193 this season.
- The Mountaineers have taken 344 more shots (17.2 per game) than their opponents this season (1,289 to 945).
- WVU has 251 steals this season and has forced its opponents to turn the ball over 442 times. The Mountaineers are averaging 22.8 points per game off turnovers this season.
- WVU tied a school record with 26 steals vs. VMI. The Keydets set a school record by an opponent with 36 turnovers.
- WVU held Wofford to 11 field goals made on Dec. 22, the fewest made by an opponent since 1949.
- WVU has had eight or more steals in every game, and WVU opponents have had 20 or more turnovers 14 times.
- Jevon Carter has 23 steals in the last eight games and leads the team with 42. He needs 21 to tie the WVU freshman record.
- Every WVU opponent this season has had their season high in turnovers against the Mountaineers.
- WVU is averaging 28.4 points per game from its bench this season. The Mountaineers outscored Oklahoma's bench, 55-8, earlier this season. WVU had 52 bench points against VMI in November.
- Last season WVU forced 421 turnovers in 33 games. WVU has forced 442 turnovers in 20 games this season. The school record is 648 opponent turnovers, set in 1997-98.

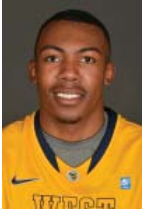

Recap

West Virginia shot just 16.7 percent in the first half, finished the game shooting 26.1 percent overall and needed all 40 minutes to hold off Monmouth, 64-54, during the season opener at the WVU Coliseum.

An announced crowd of 6,792 watched in disbelief as Monmouth built a 37-23 lead with 16:39 remaining and the Hawks had a 13-point advantage with 13:30 left when the Mountaineers finally started making some shots and began chipping away at Monmouth's lead.

A Jaysean Paige 3 got things going. Gary Browne added a big steal and layup, an Elijah Macon tip-in got the deficit down to six and eventually, two Juwan Staten free throws with 4:47 left gave the Mountaineers back the lead, 49-48.

Two more Staten free throws made it 51-48 and then a Staten jumper got the lead to five with 3:18 left. The margin swelled to seven on a Devin Williams basket and another Williams bucket and free throw with 39 seconds left got the lead to eight.

Staten led everyone with 20 points - 13 of those coming in the second half - and Williams finished with 15 points and 15 rebounds despite missing his first 11 shots and finishing the game 3 of 14 from the floor.

WVU's other starting big, Jonathan Holton, also struggled through a 1-of-9 shooting performance and finished the game with just two points.

Holton and Williams weren't the only ones struggling to find their shooting stroke: freshman Dexter Miles Jr. was 1 of 7 from the floor, junior Jevon Carter was 0 for 5 and Browne finished 2 of 7.

Deon Jones led Monmouth with 14 points while Andrew Nicholas came off the bench to score 10. The Hawks turned the ball over 24 times and finished the game shooting 44.7 percent.

The Mountaineers (1-0) were playing the game without Brandon Watkins, who sat on the bench with an illness and BillyDee Williams, who is sidelined indefinitely now after suffering a fracture to the orbital bone of the right eye during practice on Nov. 13.

Recap

West Virginia got 15 points off the bench from freshman guard Jevon Carter and some solid second-half shooting to knock off Boston College 70-66 in the semifinals of the Puerto Rico Tip-off played at Coliseo Roberto Clemente in San Juan, Puerto Rico.

"We got ourselves in a heck of a hole by 11 to that team and they're good," said West Virginia coach Bob Huggins. "When you play a team like theirs with good guards who control the game and you're screwing around not taking care of the ball and not finishing, you're going to get in trouble and that's exactly what we did. We missed a lot of opportunities, especially in that first half."

West Virginia (4-0) trailed the Eagles by 11 at halftime before catching fire behind the 3-point shooting of Carter and freshman guard Daxter Miles Jr., the two combining to hit four of seven from behind the arc.

WVU shot a season-high 54.5 percent in the second half (18 of 33) and was also able to hang on despite Staten fouling out with 3:49 left in the game and the Mountaineers leading by just three, 60-57.

From there, West Virginia scored five in a row on a free throw from forward Devin Williams and driving layups by Carter and Miles Jr.

BC eventually reduced West Virginia's lead to one, 65-64, on Olivier Hanlon's driving layup. Williams fouled Hanlon on the play, but the BC guard was unable to knock down the free throw to tie it.

Williams answered with a short jumper with 20 seconds left to put West Virginia ahead by three, 67-64, and free throws by Carter and Gary Browne put the game on ice.

Williams and Staten contributed 15 points each while Miles Jr. finished with 10.

Hanlon led the Eagles with a game-high 23 points.

The Mountaineers forced the Eagles into committing 21 turnovers for the game and also had a four-rebound edge (34-30) on the glass.

West Virginia attempted 13 more shots than Boston College, which was also a contributing factor in the victory.

Recap

Juwan Staten finished with a game-high 21 points to lead West Virginia to a 78-68 victory over the defending national champion Connecticut to claim the 2014 Puerto Rico Tip-Off in San Juan, Puerto Rico.

Staten was named MVP of the Puerto Rico Tip-Off and joining him on the all-tournament team was forward Devin Williams, whose play the prior two nights against George Mason and Boston College helped get West Virginia to the championship game.

In this matchup of top point guards, Staten and Ryan Boatright each made 6 of 14 field goals, but Staten was nine of 12 from the free throw line and handed out three assists.

WVU (5-0) never trailed and continued to use suffocating full-court pressure to increase their lead to 10, 32-22, with 6:20 left in the first half, and then to as many as 15 by the end of the first half.

The Huskies scored the first five points of the second half and eventually reduced West Virginia's lead to six, 50-44, on a Daniel Hamilton basket, but Gary Browne's driving layup ended West Virginia's scoring drought and WVU was able to keep its lead in the 8-to-10-point range for most of the second half - with several of West Virginia's points down the stretch coming from Staten either on short jumpers or at the free throw line.

Late in the game, with West Virginia running clock and enjoying an 11-point lead, Huggins had the floor spread with Staten isolated one-on-one against Boatright. With the shot dock winding down, Staten took off right past Boatright toward the basket, pulled up in the lane and lofted a soft jumper over the rim and into the basket to give the Mountaineers a 13-point lead.

Holton contributed 12 points and five rebounds, and freshman guard Daxter Miles Jr. contributed 10 points on 4 of 6 shooting. Browne, playing in front of the hometown crowd, scored nine points off the bench and made a couple of big free throws late in the game.

Boatright led the Huskies (3-1) with 17 points. Hamilton added 15 and Kentan Facey scored 10.

- The win over the 17th-ranked Huskies was West Virginia's first win over a ranked non-conference opponent since beating eighth-ranked Purdue at the WVU Coliseum back on Jan. 16, 2011.

Josh Gray's driving layup with 7.4 seconds left gave LSU a 74-73 come-from-behind victory over 16th-ranked West Virginia the SEC/Big 12 Challenge played at the WVU Coliseum on ESPN2.

West Virginia enjoyed a 14-point lead early in the second half but scored only four points during a nine-minute stretch midway through the second half to enable LSU to get back into the game.

The Tigers (6-2) tied it with 9:03 remaining on a Keith Hornsby 3 before Juwan Staten ended West Virginia's dry spell with a short jumper.

Then on the ensuing inbound play, Holton got his hand on the basketball and the deflection went to Miles who was fouled by Gray while going to the basket. Miles was able to hit one of two from the line to give West Virginia a four-point lead, 71-67.

Jarell Martin answered for LSU with a driving layup with 1:07 left. On the other end of the floor, with the Mountaineers running down the shot clock, Staten got off a wild off-balance shot that caromed off the glass and into the arms of Gray, who pushed the ball up the floor to Hornsby in the corner for an open 3 that gave LSU a 71-70 lead. Martin was called for his fifth foul trying to steal the ball away from Holton in the backcourt to put the West Virginia forward on the line for a one-and-one with 26.4 seconds left.

Holton's free throw was short, but Miles Jr. was able to sneak into the lane and tip in the miss to give West Virginia a 73-72 lead. After an LSU timeout and then a foul by Phillip, Gray was able to shake free to score the go-ahead basket.

The Mountaineers had a chance to win it at the end but Staten's jumper was off line as time expired.

The Tigers got a game-high 21 points off the bench from Tim Quarterman and an 18-point, 14-rebound double-double from Martin.

Juwan Staten scored 15 points and handed out three assists in leading 22nd-ranked West Virginia to a 69-66 victory over Marshall in the 2014 Chesapeake Energy Capital Classic in Charleston.

Jonathan Holton and Jevon Carter contributed 14 points each, while Gary Browne came off the bench to score 10.

This Capital Classic was similar to last year's game when Marshall led late in the second half only to run out of gas at the end. This time it happened a little earlier with 11 minutes remaining and the Herd leading by eight, 49-41.

Browne added a big 3 at the top of the key with 5:24 left to answer Cheikh Sane's two free throws for Marshall.

West Virginia's biggest lead of the second half was five, 65-60, when Nathan Adrian converted the second of two free throws with 1:22 remaining, but three Marshall free throws wrapped around a Staten missed layup attempt made it a two-point game with 25 seconds left.

Holton's two free throws two seconds later gave the Mountaineers a two-possession lead, 67-63, but Marshall answered with a big Justin Edmonds 3 from the wing after DeVince Boykins was able to penetrate into the lane and pitch it back to a wide-open Edmonds.

On the other end, Staten was able to hit both free throws with seven seconds before JP Kambola's 3-point try to send the game into overtime grazed the rim as time expired.

West Virginia missed 12 free throws but the Mountaineers did make them when it counted, going 7 of 8 inside of three minutes left with Holton knocking down four. Four of Marshall's six misses at the line inside came inside of three minutes to go.

Marshall shot 50 percent from the floor and hit 9 of 24 from behind the arc. West Virginia shot only 38.6 percent from the floor, with 14 of its 35 misses coming from behind the 3-point arc.

The Mountaineers made up for it by forcing 24 Marshall turnovers and grabbing 21 offensive rebounds.

Recap

Juwan Staten played like the best point guard in the country and his coach collected win No. 750 as 20th-ranked West Virginia knocked off NC State 83-69 in the Gotham Classic at Madison Square Garden in New York City.

Staten scored 24 points, including his 1,000th career point as a Mountaineer player, and handed out six assists. West Virginia's 10-1 record to begin the year is the Mountaineers' best start since reaching the Final Four in 2010.

West Virginia had its best shooting performance of the season, knocking down 31 of 58 overall, including a season-high seven 3-pointers.

Jonathan Holton, who came into the game shooting just 12 percent from 3, nailed two big triples late in the second half, his first coming with 3:49 left from the corner to expand West Virginia's lead to nine.

His second 3 with 1:16 left gave the Mountaineers a 14-point cushion.

Following a Huggins' technical, the Mountaineers went on a 19-6 run to take control of the basketball game. Staten got things going with a short jumper, Holton followed with a dunk. Staten got free for another jumper, Devin Williams converted one dose, then came two Staten free throws and another basket from Williams to give WVU a 10-point lead.

Jaysean Paige contributed back-to-back baskets when he tipped in Brandon Watkins' miss and then nailed a 3 off an assist from Staten, and the Mountaineers finished the first half with a Jevon Carter 3 from the corner that banked in.

NC State (9-3) scored 11 of the first 14 points of the second half to reduce its deficit to one, 44-43, on a Trevor Lacey 3, but Staten eventually answered with a pull-up jumper.

The last 10 minutes of the game were perhaps West Virginia's most effective stretch of offense of the season season, particularly inside of four minutes when WVU had the lead and was able to keep the ball in Staten's hands with the floor spread. Staten had a hand in 10 of West

WVU kept its foot on the gas pedal and ran out-manned Virginia Tech right out of the gym, 82-51, in front of a sold-out crowd of 13,300 at the WVU Coliseum.

West Virginia's smothering full-court pressure defense produced 16 steals and forced 25 Hokie turnovers that resulted in 37 points.

"Our whole thing is attitude and effort," said West Virginia coach Bob Huggins. "Our guys have had a terrific attitude and they've given terrific effort. If we don't have that attitude and effort then we're not very good because we're not a highly skilled team."

Tech, which trailed by just three at halftime, scored 21 points and shot just 39.1 percent in the second half.

Juwan Staten led everyone with 18 points, including three of four from 3. Gary Browne added 12 on four of six shooting.

"I thought we took them very lightly [in the first half]," said Huggins. "We weren't sharp. We didn't get to the ball the way we have been getting to the ball and just missed a ton of shots that are very makeable shots."

Devin Williams grabbed a game-best 11 rebounds - the fourth time this year he's pulled down more than 10 rebounds in a game.

Twelve different players scored, seven different players made 3s and 14 different guys got into the game for the Mountaineers.

"You can't really help so much off of a particular guy," said Huggins of his team's offensive balance. "[Defenses] have a tendency of really trying to gap everything on Wanny to keep him from getting the ball to the goal and when we have different guys make shots and we have different guys that are capable of making shots then that kind of opens things up for his penetration a little more."

Adam Smith and Stachel Pierce led Virginia Tech (8-5) with 10 points each.

West Virginia coach Bob Huggins didn't like his team's mojo in the first half so he decided to switch from the suit jacket to the pullover. It worked.

The 17th-ranked Mountaineers played like a completely different team after Huggins' switcheroo, West Virginia turning TCU's first half double-digit lead into a runaway 78-67 victory in front of 4,918 at Wilkerson-Greines Athletic Center in Fort Worth, Texas.

Gary Browne had a pretty big hand in the win by scoring all of his season-high 16 points in the second half running the team in place of pre-season Big 12 Player of the Year Juwan Staten, who did not play because of illness.

Browne spent most of the first half and the early portion of the second half on the bench with three fouls, but when he got back on the floor that's when West Virginia got going. All 16 of Browne's second-half points were scored inside of 11 minutes to go when the Mountaineers were leading by three.

Browne's best stretch came with four minutes to go and West Virginia leading by seven. He scored on back-to-back possessions by running down the shot clock at midcourt before driving to the basket. Nader's 19 and a combined 10 points from Jameel McKay and Matt Thomas gave Iowa State a 10-point advantage from its bench.

Iowa State (12-2, 2-0) nearly led throughout, and the Cyclones had a couple of opportunities in the second half to blow it open, but the Mountaineers continued to hang around.

Trailing by eight with 10:35 to go, West Virginia scored seven in a row to pull within one, 53-52, with 8:25 remaining following a pair of Juwan Staten free throws.

The Mountaineers tied it at 55 with 7:37 left, tied it again at 57 with 6:17 remaining, and took a one-point lead 14 seconds later when Gary Browne made one of two from the line. But McKay answered with a dose one and two Nader free throws pushed the Iowa State lead back to three, 61-58. Following a Staten layup, Nader nailed a big 3 at the other end to put the Cyclones up four, and then hit two more free throws to give Iowa State a six-point lead with 3:28 remaining.

Chase Connor came off the bench to bang in a 3 to reduce the deficit to three, 66-63, and the Mountaineers whittled Iowa State's lead down to one after Staten's three-point play made it 69-68 with 55 seconds left.

Browne came up with a steal on the inbound pass to give the Mountaineers the ball and Bob Huggins called timeout to draw up a play, but Staten stumbled while attempting to go to the rim, lost the ball near the baseline where Jonathan Holton picked it up, but was unable to convert a dose one.

Naz Long did make his dose one at the other end to put Iowa State ahead by three with 29 seconds remaining. Two Holton free throws made it a one-point game before free throws by Nader and Long iced it for the Cyclones.

Recap

No. 16 West Virginia got a strong performance from its bench to knock off 18th-ranked Oklahoma 86-65 at the WVU Coliseum.

Freshman guard Jevon Carter came off the bench to score 18 points, grab seven rebounds and make three steals, and Nathan Adrian snapped out of his shooting funk with 11 points, including scoring seven during a key early stretch early in the first half that helped the Mountaineers build a double-digit lead.

"I was very, very pleased with our effort," said West Virginia coach Bob Huggins.

West Virginia (15-2, 3-1) used a 10-0 run at the end of the half to take a 13-point lead into the locker room. The Mountaineers enjoyed a double-digit advantage for the remainder of the game, the lead swelling to as many as 24 with 1:29 remaining.

In fact, West Virginia's bench performed so well that the Mountaineers didn't need preseason Big 12 Player of the Year Juwan Staten's scoring, the senior scoring his first points at the free throw line with 6:37 remaining and finishing tonight's game with just 4 points, 12 below his season average coming in. Staten did hand out eight assists.

WVU's bench outscored Oklahoma, 55-8. Sophomore Devin Williams, coming off a 14-point, 15-rebound, double-double in the loss to Iowa State, had 14 points and 11 boards against the Sooners.

West Virginia had a 42-35 advantage on the glass and forced the Sooners into committing 22 turnovers - 16 of those coming on Mountaineer steals.

WVU took 18 more shots than Oklahoma - a recurring theme for the Mountaineers.

Eleven different players scored for the Mountaineers. At one point in the second half West Virginia's bench had as many points as Oklahoma had as a team.

Oklahoma's Buddy Hield led everyone with 21 points, nine of those coming from 3. Isaiah Cousins added 14.

Recap

Jevon Carter's two free throws with 0.9 seconds left gave West Virginia an 86-85 overtime victory over TCU at the WVU Coliseum.

Carter's game-winning points were the result of a foul called on TCU's Kyan Anderson after Carter caught a full-court inbound pass from Dexter Miles Jr. and sailed toward the basket.

The Horned Frogs took an 85-84 lead with 1.8 seconds left on Trey Zeigler's short jumper, this coming after Miles grabbed a 3 with seven seconds left to give the Mountaineers a one-point lead, 84-83.

On two occasions it looked like TCU was going to win the game, once with two minutes left in regulation when Charles Hill got a 3 from the wing to give TCU a four-point lead, and then with 1:20 left in overtime when the Horned Frogs took a five-point advantage on an Anderson jumper.

In regulation, it was Carter and Miles who made up the deficit, Carter answering Hill's 3 with another 3 to make it a one-point game. After Juwan Staten's free throw with 38 seconds left tied it at 70, Zeigler hit a jumper with 7.3 seconds remaining to give the Horned Frogs a 72-70 lead.

Miles tied the game with 1.1 seconds to go when he got a difficult basket in traffic to go down.

On the inbound pass, Zeigler threw the ball past Anderson at midcourt and the ball rolled out of bounds, giving West Virginia an inbound play underneath TCU's basket with the dock holding at 1.1 seconds.

Following a timeout, the Mountaineers got the ball to Devin Williams dose to the basket where he drew contact but was unable to get the shot to go down.

Then in overtime, with the Horned Frogs leading by five, Williams made two free throws, another free throw by Staten reduced the deficit to two, Miles cut it to one with a 3 and then Miles' 3 with seven seconds left gave WVU a one-point lead.

Three of West Virginia's six 3 point field goals happened in the final six minutes of the game.
