### WVU HOSTS NO. 6 AKRON WEDNESDAY AT 7 P.M.

After a three match roadtrip, the West Virginia University men's soccer team returns home to host No. 6 Akron on Wednesday, Oct. 28, at 7 p.m., at Dick Dlesk Soccer Stadium.

The Mountaineers own an 11-8 record against ranked opponents since 2006, including a 4-1 mark against teams ranked in the top six. Since head coach Marlon LeBlanc's arrival in Morgantown in 2006, WVU knocked off No. 1 UConn in 2007 and 2011, as well as wins over No. 3 South Florida in 2009 and No. 6 Notre Dame in 2006.

"Our guys are looking forward to getting back home and being in front of our fans," LeBlanc said. "For a big game with Akron coming in, you couldn't ask to be at a better place than Dick Dlesk Soccer Stadium. We've won a lot of big, big games at home, playing in front of our fans. We have a heck of a home field advantage when our fans turn out. Akron is going to be a formidable challenge for us, but when we're playing at home, we're very difficult to beat."

Tickets can be purchased at the DDSS ticket office or in advance at WVUGAME.com. Admission is free for WVU students with a valid ID. Wednesday is "BOGO Coke & Popcorn" night at DDSS, and fans who purchase one popcorn or Coke product will receive a second for free.

Fans unable to cheer on the Mountaineers in person can watch a live stream on WVUSports.com, presented by CityNet. DJ Jamiel and Caroline Szwed will be on the call. Live stats can be found at WVULiveStats.com, and updates will also be available on social media by following and connecting with @WVUMensSoccer on Twitter, Facebook and Instagram.

The Mountaineers (6-9, 1-2 Mid-American Conference) own a 5-2 mark at home this season and a 57-24-9 in LeBlanc's 10 seasons. In the past six years, WVU owns an impressive 41-12-3 record at the friendly confines of Dick Dlesk Stadium. Sixth-ranked Akron (11-2-2, 2-0-1 MAC) is 6-1-1 away from home in 2015.

WVU is among the conference and national leaders in several statistical categories. The Mountaineers are No. 7 in the nation and first in the conference with 2.20 assists per game, and eighth nationally with 33 total assists. West Virginia's 5.53 points per game is second in the MAC and No. 23 in the NCAA, while WVU is No. 25 in the country with 83 total points. Additionally, with 4.33 saves per game, WVU is first in the MAC.

Individually, Sophomore Joey Piatczyc continues to lead the nation in assists. He is averaging 0.80 assist per game and is also first with 12 total assists. Senior Zak Leedom is third in the MAC and No. 29 in the country with six total assists, and senior Jamie Merriam's three game-winning goals is the best in the league. In goal, freshman Alec Boerner's 41 total saves and 3.73 saves per game is second in the MAC.

## SCOUTING AKRON

No. 6 Akron is 11-2-2 on the season and 2-0-1 in Mid-American Conference play. The Zips have posted a 6-1-1 record away from home after a 1-1 draw at Western Michigan on Oct. 24. UA is on an eight match unbeaten streak, a stretch that began with a 2-0 victory at No. 25 UC Santa Barbara, the Zips' sixth match against a ranked opponent. Akron also owns wins at No. 4 Georgetown, at No. 6 Maryland and vs. No. 14 Saint Louis.

Jared Embick is in his third season as head coach of the Zips after spending six seasons as an associate head coach. Akron is 41-12-5 under Embick, with a pair of MAC championships and NCAA Tournament berths.

### SERIES HISTORY VS. THE ZIPS

West Virginia is 2-12-1 all-time vs. Akron, but just four of those matches have occurred in Morgantown. Before Akron came to Dick Dlesk Stadium in 2013, the last time WVU hosted UA was in 1972, a 4-3 win for the Mountaineers. Since West Virginia joined the Mid-American Conference in 2012, three of the four matches have been one-goal contests. Last year, Akron posted a 3-2 win at home. Andy Bevin scored both goals for WVU, while Jamie Merriam and Ryan Cain netted assists.

## UP NEXT: VS. PENN

West Virginia plays its final nonconference match of the regular season when it hosts Penn on Tuesday, Nov. 3, at 7 p.m., at Dick Dlesk Soccer Stadium. West Virginia is coming off a 2-0 loss at Bowling Green on Saturday afternoon at Cochrane Stadium. The Mountaineers allowed two goals in the final 20 minutes, as the Falcons scored in the 71st and 77th minutes. BGSU's second goal came on a penalty kick.

WVU recorded 12 shots in the match, four on goal. BGSU had 16 shots, with seven on net. Sophomore Jad Arslan had two of WVU's shots on goal, while sophomore Joey Piatczyk and senior Haydon Bennett each had one.

## SENIOR CLASS AWARD FINALIST

Senior Jamie Merriam has been named a finalists for the Senior CLASS Award. He is one of 10 men's soccer student-athletes to be honored for excelling both on and off the field. Student-athletes are recognized for their achievements in four areas: community, classroom, character and competition.

Nationwide fan voting begins immediately to help select the winners. Fans are encouraged to vote on the Senior CLASS Award website (SeniorClassAward.com) through Nov. 23. Fan votes will be combined with media and Division I head coaches' votes to determine the winner. Fans can vote once a day on each device.

An All-MAC First Team honoree last season, Merriam has been a key component of WVU's success. He is tied for the team lead with six goals and 14 points. He leads the team with 38 shots and 17 shots on-goal. Merriam's three game-winning goals leads the team and also is No. 1 in the Mid-American Conference and No. 29 in the nation. He is fifth in the league with six goals and 0.40 goals per game, sixth in both shots (2.53) and shots on goal (1.13) per game and eighth with 9.93 points per game and 14 total points.

A biometric systems major, Merriam was named to the NSCAA Scholar All-East Region Second Team, the Academic All-MAC Team and the Academic All-Big 12 At-Large First Team as a junior in 2014. He also earned All-Mid-American Conference First Team accolades to cap an impressive junior season.

Merriam has been an active member of the community throughout his collegiate career. He has participated in numerous community service projects and spread a positive message to many people in the community.

An acronym for Celebrating Loyalty and Achievement for Staying in School®, the Senior CLASS Award focuses on the total student-athlete and encourages students to use their platform in athletics to make a positive impact as leaders in their communities.

## LEBLANC IS MR. 100

With WVU's 3-0 win over Penn State on Oct. 13, head coach Marlon LeBlanc won his 100th career match. LeBlanc's milestone win came against his alma mater and where he earned his first victories. A 2000 PSU graduate, LeBlanc was an assistant coach at Penn State from 2001-05 and earned four wins as interim head coach in 2002. LeBlanc owns a 96-68-27 record in 10 seasons at West Virginia, four shy of hitting 100 wins with the Blue and Gold.

## A SEASON OF ASSISTS

Sophomore Joey Piatczyk has notched 12 assists in 2015, tied for the most in a single season in program history. He continues to lead the country in both total assists and assists per game. Piatczyk has assisted on 12 of WVU's 25 goals.

In WVU's 6-0 win over San Francisco on Aug. 30, Piatczyk posted a program-record four assists. In WVU history, 14 players had tallied three assists in a game, but Piatczyk became the first to record four helpers in a contest.

After the sophomore's record match, he was rewarded with several local and national honors. Piatczyk was named to the Top Drawer Soccer Team of the Week on Sept. 1, in addition to earning Student-Athlete of the Week accolades by WVU Athletics. He was also nominated for the Hero Sports Division I Men's Soccer Stud of the Week.

## MAC REWARDS STEPHENSON

After his first career goal, the game-winner in WVU's 1-0 win over UNCG, freshman Tucker Stephenson was named the Mid-American Conference Player of the Week on September 28. Stephenson connected on a header at 83:40 for the only shot on goal of the match for the Mountaineers. He also had a team-high tying three shots in the contest.

Stephenson earned WVU's first MAC Player of the Week accolade of the season, and the fifth since the Mountaineers joined the league in 2012. Andy Bevin was named Player of the Week once in 2013 and 2014, while Ryan Cain and Jad Arslan also received the weekly award last season.

## WVU HONORED FOR ACADEMICS

For the eighth consecutive year, WVU earned an NSCAA Team Academic Award for its team grade point average, the National Soccer Coaches Association of America announced on Wednesday. The Mountaineers were recognized as one of 306 men's teams to earn a 3.0 GPA or higher during the 2014-15 academic year. A total of 859 teams (306 men, 553 women) were honored by the NSCAA with a team GPA of 3.0 or higher. WVU is one of 211 schools to have both its men's and women's programs honored.

In the past six seasons, the WVU men's soccer team holds a 41-12-3 record at home, including 13-straight victories from 2010-11.

## FACING THE MINIMUM

The West Virginia defense has provided plenty of help to the WVU goalkeepers in Marlon LeBlanc's 10 seasons.

Opponents have averaged fewer than 12 shots per game every year since 2007, and in seven seasons the opposition has averaged fewer than five shots on goal in a game.

In WVU's win over San Francisco on Aug. 30, the Mountaineer defense held the opposition to just three shots, none on goal. It marked the sixth time in program history West Virginia allowed no shots on goal and the 19th time an opposing team had three or fewer shots.

Since Marlon LeBlanc's arrival in 2006, the Mountaineers are 64-7-4 when they have scored at least two goals in a game. This year, they are 4-1-0, thanks to a pair of six-goal outings.

The first loss came to Akron in the second round of the 2011 NCAA tournament, while WVU also fell to Elon in 2013. While West Virginia suffered four defeats in 2014 when it scored at least two goals, the first came to No. 9 UC Irvine, 3-2, two came in overtime periods and three occurred away from home.

Making a difference down the stretch is important in every soccer match, and West Virginia continues to be one of the top nationally by holding on to early leads. Since Marlon LeBlanc took the coaching reins in 2006, WVU is 47-4-4 all-time when leading at halftime. In 2014, the Mountaineers were 5-0-1 when they led at the half. West Virginia is dangerous when the score is tied as well, holding a 44-35-19 advantage, including 6-3-0 in 2014.

## PACKING THE STANDS

With the help of the WVU Sports Marketing Department, the Mountaineers broke the single game attendance record in WVU men's soccer history on Sept. 4, 2009, against No. 16 UC Santa Barbara.

West Virginia had 1,786 come through the turnstiles against Hartford in the 2012 season opener, the fifth-highest ever to witness a men's game at Dick Dlesk Soccer Stadium.
