### QUICK HITTERS

- No. 23/20 WVU picked up an 83-43 win over Coppin State on Saturday for its fourth straight win.
- Four Mountaineers reached double figures, as **Briana Holmes** scored a team-leading 20 points. **Averee Fields** (15p/10r) and **Lanay Montgomery** (10p/12r) each recorded a double-double. **Teana Muldrow** tallied double-figures for the third time this year with 10 points.
- WVU and Duquesne meet for the 46th time on Wednesday with the Mountaineers holding a decisive 36-9 edge. The Dukes have won two of the last three meetings, including a 62-54 win at the Coliseum in 2012.
- WVU ranks second nationally with 7.0 bpg and is 14th in the NCAA with a 33.0 FG% defense.

## SCOUTING DUQUESNE

- Duquesne finished 20-13 last season and made a berth in the WNIT under first-year head coach Dan Burt.
- The Dukes were predicted to finish 7th this season in the A-10 preseason poll.
- Duquesne has won five consecutive games since opening the season 0-3. Its latest win includes an 87-77 victory over cross-town rival Pittsburgh on Sunday.
- Duquesne's 3-point FG% of 42.7 is third nationally, while its FG% of 47.1 is 21st in the NCAA.
- Four Dukes are boasting double figures with **April Robinson** leading the charge. She is averaging a team-best 15.9 ppg, 6.3 apg and 1.8 spg.
- Robinson is 12th nationally in assists per game.
- **Deva'Nya Workman** is the Dukes' top-rebounder with 6.4 boards per contest, while **Amadea Szamosi** is shooting a team-best 62.3 percent (33-of-53) from the field.

## LAST TIME OUT

- West Virginia collected an easy 83-43 win over Coppin State last Saturday.
- Four Mountaineers posted double figures with junior guard **Bria Holmes** leading the way with 20 points.
- **Averee Fields** notched her second double-double this season (15p/10r), while **Lanay Montgomery** posted career-highs in rebounds for her first double-double with 10 points and 12 boards.
- For the second straight game, WVU shot over 50 percent (32-of-64) from the field.

## NOTABLE NUGGETS

- **Bria Holmes** has scored double figures in 11 consecutive games dating back to last season.
- Holmes has 865 points and is 135 from reaching 1,000 career points.
- She would become the 31st 1,000-point scorer in program history.
- Holmes' 24.1 ppg leads the Big 12 and is sixth nationally as of Dec. 8.
- Senior **Linda Stepney** made her 100th career start last week and is three shy of the school's top-10 mark.
- WVU has notched double-digit steals in the last three games, grabbing 16 vs. Fairfield, 14 at FDU and 16 vs. Coppin State.

## CLIMBING THE NATIONAL RANKS

- The Mountaineers lead the Big 12 and are 14th nationally with 18.0 offensive rebounds per game.
- WVU's field goal percentage defense of 33.0% is 14th nationally, while the rebounding margin of +9.9 is 26th.

- **Bria Holmes** leads the Big 12 with 24.1 ppg and is sixth in the NCAA.
- **Linda Stepney's** assist turnover ratio of 3.3 is 13th nationally.

## JOIN THE BLOCK PARTY

- West Virginia's 7.0 blocks per game is tied for second in the NCAA with K-State.
- **Lanay Montgomery's** 3.14 blocks per game is 16th in the NCAA and second in the league.
- Montgomery became only the second WVU sophomore to record 5 blocks or more in back-to-back games (at FDU, vs. CSU) - joining WVU Hall of Famer Georgeann Wells, who achieved that feat against James Madison and Pitt in 1984.
- WVU has recorded six or more blocks in six of the first seven games.

## HOLMES LEADS THE WAY

- Junior Guard **Bria Holmes** was named the Big 12 Preseason Player of the Year as voted on by the league's head coaches.
- Additionally, Holmes was tabbed to the Preseason All-Big 12 Team.
- Holmes was a First Team Preseason All-American by Lindy's Magazine.
- ESPN listed Holmes as the nation's 16th best player for the 2014-15 season.
- The guard notched her second 30-point game with 36 vs. Seton Hall (Nov. 17).
- Holmes added her third 30-point game by tallying 32 in the 83-39 win over Evansville (Nov. 26). She set a career-high 12 field goal makes in the win over the Purple Aces (Nov. 26).
- Holmes has made 10 or more field goals in three games this season (SHU, Evansville and FDU).

- Junior G **Bria Holmes** was named to the John R. Wood Award Top 30 List and to the WBCA's Wade Watch List. Both awards honor the nation's top women's basketball player.

## FIELDS RECOGNIZED FOR SERVICE

- Senior **Averee Fields** was one of 93 women's student-athletes to be nominated for the Allstate Good Works team.
- The award honors those student-athletes who have made a valuable impact within their community.
- Fields, a social work major, has volunteered countless hours of service including working with Stepping Stones – an organization dedicated to helping those individuals with special needs.

## DEFENSIVE MAGIC

- Outside of the offensive thriller against Seton Hall, the Mountaineers have kept their opponents in check defensively.
- Only Seton Hall has tallied a FG percent over 40%, while only Seton Hall and Mississippi State have eclipsed the 60-point plateau.
- The Mountaineers held Eastern Kentucky (27.5%), Evansville (20.7%) and Coppin State (26.2%) below 30 percent shooting.

## STEPNEY CLIMBING RECORD BOOK

- Senior **Linda Stepney** has dished out 322 career assists, which is 16th all-time at WVU. She is just nine away from reaching **Brooke Hampton's** 331 set last year.

## WVU EXTENDS HOME WIN STREAK

- With a win over Coppin State on Dec. 6, West Virginia has won 13 consecutive games at the WVU Coliseum dating back 2013-14.
- The Mountaineers' 12-game home win streak is fourth all-time at WVU and is tied for eighth among the nation's active home winning streaks.

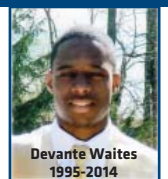

### CREDENTIALS

Photographers and media members who wish to cover a game at the WVU Coliseum should contact women's basketball contact/associate director of athletic communications Russell Luna at least 24 hours in advance. Credential pickup is located at the Red Gate and opens one hour prior to each game.

### GAMEDAY

Parking is free and open to the public in the Coliseum parking lot. Parking passes will be provided for only games that coincide with WVU men's basketball games.

The working press area is located on the east side of the main floor at concourse level (22 rows from the playing floor). Press should enter through the Blue Gate with their credentials. Forty-eight seats are available for working media; four television slings are also available. West Virginia grants broadcast rights to the official radio outlet of the visiting team on reciprocal basis.

Accredited photographers may work along the playing floor at both baselines behind the restriction line established by the NCAA. Cutline writers or equipment carriers are not permitted on the playing floor.

The WVU Coliseum also supports wireless internet access. Please see women's basketball contact Russell Luna for login and password information.

Complete statistics are provided to all working media at halftime and postgame. Requested team members and coach Carey will be available for interviews following a 15-minute grace period.

### DURING THE WEEK

Any member of the media wishing to interview a player or member of the coaching staff during the week should contact West Virginia women's basketball contact/associate director of athletic communications Russell Luna at least 24 hours in advance.

Cell phone numbers will not be made available and all WVU student-athletes have been instructed to not conduct interviews without prior approval of the sports communications staff.

## NON-CONFERENCE HOME SUCCESS

- WVU has put together an impressive 29-4 record at home over the past five years.
- The Mountaineers have only lost twice at home against non-conference foes once during that stretch (2011-12).
- WVU went a perfect 8-0 in the Coliseum during the 2010-11 campaign.
- WVU is 82-6 (.932) at home against nonconference teams since 2002.

## CAREY NEARING ALL-TIME WINS

- G **Bria Holmes** set a WVU Preseason WNIT record with 36 points and 10 made field goals against Seton Hall.
- F **Averee Fields** set a WVU WNIT record with 15 rebounds against the Pirates.

## Recap

Junior Bria Holmes' game-leading 23 points carried the No. 17-ranked West Virginia women's basketball team past Eastern Kentucky, 67-42, on Saturday evening in the opening round of the Preseason WNIT at the WVU Coliseum.

West Virginia (1-0) used a 12-point run to close out the first half and took a commanding 30-19 halftime lead. WVU added four more points to the run in the second half before EKKU came firing back.

The Colonels (0-1) cut the deficit to 11 midway through the second half, but were unable to overcome the stingy play from WVU. West Virginia is now 13-1 in season openers under head coach Mike Carey.

Holmes tied a career-high with nine field goal makes. Her 24 attempts tied five others for 10th most field goals shot by a Mountaineer junior. The Big 12 Preseason Player of the Year notched three steals, two assists and a block in 37 minutes of play.

Veteran leaders Linda Stepney and Avere'e Fields each reached double-digits with 13 and 12 points, respectively. The duo combined for 10-of-14 from the field. Stepney handed out three assists and committed just one turnover in 36 minutes.

Crystal Leary, a native of Norfolk, Virginia, grabbed 11 rebounds and swatted away a career-high four blocks in the win. Freshman Teana Muldrov tallied eight points and pulled in five boards during the win.

EKU's Michaela Hunter, Mariah Messengill and Shameeka Murray each had a team-leading eight points for the Colonels. Hunter corralled seven rebounds, including six off the defensive glass.

The Mountaineers made 24-of-56 from the field for 42.9 percent, holding EKU to 14-of-51 for 27.5 percent. WVU hit six treys compared to the Colonels' five. The Mountaineers held a slight rebounding edge 44-38, scoring 26 points in the paint. The Colonels won the points off turnover battle, 17-12.

Early in the contest, Eastern Kentucky capitalized on WVU's shooting woes as the Colonels took a 6-2 edge through the first five minutes. Holmes hit back-to-back triples cutting the Mountaineers deficit to 9-8 with 14-plus minutes remaining.

WVU found its first lead with a Holmes layup to take a 13-12 edge. EKKU quickly responded with its second triple to regain the edge. Both teams swapped leads until Stepney hit a game-tying free throw at 19-19. The Mountaineers closed out the first half on a 12-0 run in the final five minutes to take a commanding 30-19 halftime advantage.

Holmes led all scorers at the half with 17 points, while Leary pulled in seven rebounds. EKKU's Murray led the Colonels with six first-half points. WVU shot 35.5 percent (11-of-31) from the field, while EKKU was limited to 7-of-28 for 25 percent.

The Mountaineers' momentum continued into the second half as WVU stretched its lead to 15. Eastern Kentucky snapped its seven-minute drought with a trey from Alexus Cooper.

WVU shot over 50 percent for the majority of the second half to take a commanding lead over the Colonels and collect their first victory of the season.

## Recap

The No. 17 West Virginia women's basketball team outlasted Seton Hall in an offensive showcase, 89-87, on Monday evening at the WVU Coliseum to advance to the Preseason WNIT semifinals.

The Mountaineers (2-0) trailed by four with nine minutes remaining. Avere'e Fields' layup at 7:09 gave WVU a brief 72-70 lead that it would never relinquish down the stretch.

WVU stretched its advantage to nine under four minutes to play, but Seton Hall (1-1) continued to battle back. A pair of free throws from Pirates star Ka-Deirdre Simmons cut WVU's edge to one in the final 13 seconds. Redshirt freshman Teana Muldrov hit a free throw to give WVU an 89-87 lead with six seconds. A last layup attempt from Simmons fell short, as West Virginia secured the win.

Holmes, the Big 12 Preseason Player of the Year, put together one of the most memorable performances in WVU Coliseum history with a career-best 36 points in the win. The New Haven, Connecticut native's performance tied Kate Bulger (2003) for the second-most points in a single game at the Coliseum. Her effort also tied Bulger for third-most by a WVU junior.

Fields earned her first career double-double scoring performance with 21 points, 15 rebounds and dishing out five assists. Muldrov finished out double-figure scoring for WVU with 19 points and nine boards. The freshman's six triples tied three others for third most by a Mountaineer freshman with the most recent effort from Taylor Palmer in 2010 versus High Point.

Seton Hall had four players reach double-figures as Tabatha Richardson-Smith paced the Pirates with 32 points. Simmons finished as the second leading scorer with 20.

West Virginia connected on 27-of-64 from the field for 42.2 percent, while Seton Hall hit 29-of-67 for 43.3 percent. Both teams knocked down a combined 23 triples. Seton Hall hit 12-of-25 (48.0%) compared to WVU's 11-of-24 (45.8%). The Mountaineers won the rebound edge 45-43 and slightly captured the assists battle 20-18.

Seton Hall opened the game to a 4-0 lead. West Virginia used a seven-point run midway through the period to take a 24-18 lead at 10:15. Later in the half, Seton Hall's Simmons knocked down a wide-open trey to tie the contest 29-29.

WVU stretched its lead back to four before the Pirates' Richardson-Smith connected on a triple and layup, tying the game 38-38 with 3:25 on the clock. The Mountaineers once again went up by four. However, Daisha Simmons hit a layup to cut WVU's lead to 46-45 at the break.

The junior Holmes led all scorers with 16 points. Fields already had a double-double in the first half with 11 points and 11 boards. Richardson-Smith and Johnson each had double-figures with 12 and 10 points, respectively.

## Recap

A strong first half performance propelled the No. 22/21-ranked West Virginia University women's basketball team to a 67-53 victory over Fairfield on Saturday afternoon at the WVU Coliseum.

The staunch Mountaineer defense held the Stags to just 11 first half points. West Virginia (4-1) stretched its advantage to 26 in the second half before Fairfield (1-5) closed the game on a 25-to-13 run. Saturday's victory extended West Virginia's home court winning streak to 12, which is the longest longest in program history.

Three Mountaineers reached double figures with senior Avere Fields tallying a game-high 18 points. The forward notched a career-high nine field goals, grabbed five rebounds and dished out four assists in 34 minutes.

Bria Holmes, the Big 12 Preseason Player of the Year, added 15 points and a team-best seven rebounds in the win. Freshman Teana Muldrow knocked down three triples for 10 points and pulled in four boards for her second double-digit game this year.

For the contest, the Mountaineers shot 40.9 percent (27-of-66) from the field. WVU was 6-of-15 (40.0%) from 3-point range. Fairfield went 20-of-51 for 39.2 percent, recording seven triples. West Virginia outmanned the Stags 42-31 in the rebounds column and controlled the offensive game 23-15.

West Virginia's stingy defensive play in the first half disrupted the Stags early on. Three consecutive jumpers by Fields propelled the Mountaineers to a 12-2 lead with 14:40 left in the opening frame.

The perimeter started heating up for West Virginia, as the team knocked down four of its first five from three-point range. Offensively, WVU cooled off to end the half, but closed the first period with a 32-11 edge. The Mountaineers went 12-of-26 for 46.2 percent from the field, holding Fairfield to 4-of-24 for 16.7 percent. Fairfield committed 16 turnovers resulting in 19 WVU points.

Holmes led all halftime scorers with 10 points, while McDonald had a game-best six boards. Kristin Schatzlein led the Stags with six points.

Fairfield started off the second half on a better foot. Despite a stronger start, free throws from forward Crystal Leary at 8:41 would give WVU a 26-point advantage with 8:41 remaining. Leary would finish with seven points and tied for a team-best seven boards.

Fairfield began its late push thanks to the veteran Schatzlein's driving to the lane bucket, making it a 54-32 contest. She would finish the game with a team-best 17 points.

The Stags continued their hot offensive work, knocking down 9-of-10 field goals to cut WVU's edge to 17. Fairfield scored five out of the last seven points to finish the contest 67-53.

Bre McDonald in her second game as a Mountaineer added eight points, six rebounds, four steals and two assists in just 18 minutes of play. Meanwhile, senior Linda Stepney matched a career-high with 10 assists.

## Recap

Four Mountaineers reached double figures, as the No. 24/21-ranked West Virginia women's basketball team cruised to an 83-43 victory over Coppin State on Saturday afternoon inside the WVU Coliseum.

West Virginia (6-1) used a series of runs to take commanding lead and clinch its second 40-point win of the season. Saturday's win gave the Mountaineers their 13th straight win inside the Coliseum, which remains the fourth longest in program history.

Junior Bria Holmes led all scorers with 20 points, pulling in seven rebounds, collecting five steals and handing out four assists.

Forwards Averee Fields and Lanay Montgomery both recorded double-doubles, becoming the first duo since Christal Caldwell and Ayana Dunning to achieve that feat in 2011. Fields poured in 15 points and 10 rebounds for her second double-double of the year. Montgomery netted her first career double-double with 12 rebounds and 10 points, while tying a career-best with five blocks.

Freshman Teana Muldrow rounded out the WVU double-digit scorers with 10 points. Making her 100th career start on Saturday, senior Linda Stepney scored eight points, dished out seven assists and grabbed six rebounds in the win.

For the second straight game, WVU shot 50 percent or higher from the field, going an even 32-of-64 (50%). Coppin State (1-6) was held to 26.2 percent shooting (16-of-61), while committing 19 turnovers that resulted in 22 Mountaineer points. The inside game was dominated by West Virginia outrebounding CSU, 58-to-38. WVU notched a season-high 54 points in the paint.

The Mountaineers pounced on the Eagles early with an 18-6 run in the first nine minutes of action. West Virginia's tough defense kept the Eagles struggling offense, as Coppin State went 2-of-11 during one stretch.

WVU held a 41-16 lead at the break - their largest halftime lead of the year. Fields and Holmes both eclipsed double figures in the first half scoring 12 and 10, respectively. CSU was led by Bria Harris with six points. In the first half, West Virginia shot 41 percent (16-of-39) from the field, while limiting Coppin State to 25 percent (7-of-28).

The second half again started strong for West Virginia the Mountaineers opened on a 12-5 run to take a 53-21 lead. At one point, WVU went 9-of-9 from the field to take command of the game.

Later in the contest, Montgomery reeled in her 10th rebound to record her first career double-double. West Virginia had a 21-3 run for an eight minute stretch as the team cruised to a fourth consecutive win. Coppin State's Harris Tanaysa Henderson (13) and Harris (10) finished as the team's scoring leaders.
